We would like to inform you of a project on marine mineral resources which has just been started in the Department of Liberal Studies in Science at Manchester University. The project is funded by the Science Research Council, Marine Technology Panel, and is one of the projects in the North West Consortium.

The aim of this project is to develop a range of policy options for the exploitation of the resources of the sea-bed. The study is structured on a global basis and integrates scientific, technical, economic and political data to form the basis of a policy analysis. The first stage will concentrate on evaluating existing resources estimates for sea-bed mineral resources. The resultant data base will be used to test the reaction of the minerals' market to new raw materials inputs and to estimate the effects of such reactions on patterns of technological innovation in British industry.

We should appreciate, therefore, any information (pamphlets, references, papers, statistics etc) that you could give us and, if applicable an outline of your organisation's policy in this area.



The International Ocean Institute is a non-governmental, interdisciplinary Institute at the Royal University of Malta. It was established with the cooperation of the Maltese Government and UNDP. Pacem in Maribus is our annual conference. We have had six thus far. I am enclosing the list of our Trustees and our Planning Council, as well as the statutes of the Institute., and a very brief description of what we have been doing, xeroxed out of the program notes for Pacem in Maribus VI. Dear Mrs. Borgese:

As a U.C. San Diego student of an "International Organization" Political Science class, I opted to produce a paper on international organization within the emergingly important context of international law of the oceans. Due to personal interest as well as time limitations, I have decided to focus my paper upon the linkages between the non-governmental organizations and the United Nations Law of the Seas Conferences, and particularly the influences of the non-governmental ~~ORGANIZATIONS~~ upon the Conferences. After coming ~~g~~ upon a reference to the "International Ocean Institute" in the Yearbook of International Organizations (1974) today, I began excitedly to pour through all libraries on campus and those within the surrounding area, searching for more information on "Pacem in Maribus". Unfortunately, as I'm sure you are aware, there is very little to be found on Pacem in Maribus. I am most willing and able to travel to Santa Barbara if my personal presence would be of any benefit.

I am terribly excited over the prospect of such a project, and am open to any suggestions you may have. What I have allowed myself to hope for is ultimately the chance for personal contact with you, perhaps a most informal "interview". I cannot stress enough my appreciation for any assistance, regardless of form or depth. Please contact me at your earliest convenience if you feel this scheme has any merit. I shall eagerly await your reply with an intensive study of your books.
