Note

Margaret Ethel Mathers was born Maud Ethel Bligh in Halifax in 1876 to Howard and Maria Mathers. In 1899 she married Frederick Francis Mavers, who served as the 18th Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia from 1940-1942. She was involved with numerous benevolent organizations, especially those aimed at improving the lives of girls and women.
