John Bell was an archives assistant at Dalhousie University in the 1970s with a particular interest in the acquisition of labour records. Bell served as Secretary-Treasurer of the Nova Scotia Federation of Labour. He interviewed F.C. Wightman and George Noiles about their memories of Leon Trotsky's stay at the Amherst internment camp during World War One.
