Mentre sono in corso le pratiche per il riconoscimento della personalità giuridica alla nostra Associazione, altri contatti sono mantenuti con la Regione Campania e in particolare con il Prof. Roberto Virtuoso che, della nostra Associazione, è stato fervente animatore, per rendere operativo, secondo le intese di massima già raggiunte, un primo programma di studi e interventi per il comprensorio del Cilento, che costituisce una interessante unità marina, costiera, montana la quale richiede un adeguato assetto e

misure di protezione e d'altra parte offre notevoli possibilità di sviluppo, sempre che si proceda con programmi coordinati e organici.

Dear Jan,

The RIO Project Follow-up and The Club of Rome

With the Algiers meeting, the study and launching phases of the RIO Project (Project) are over, and the RIO Report (RIO) is now in orbit. The responsibility of keeping it there and making the entire undertaking a convincing and successful one rests mainly with the RIO Foundation (Foundation), created expressly for this purpose. Let me say first of all that I think I know how difficult this task will be and that, for this reason too, if The Club of Rome (CoR)'s experience acquired with the previous projects can be of any use, we will be glad to put it at the Foundation's disposal.

In this letter, however, I wish to indicate what, in my view, should be done operatively to make the Foundation-CoR cooperation more effective, taking into consideration the peculiar character of CoR.

In your letter of 6 July, the Foundation asked for the support of a number of NGOs, sending them a questionnaire (about organization, legal status, objectives, activities, etc.), and included in the group also CoR. I have already had the opportunity of telling you that I consider this a very good initiative, and potentially also a fruitful one despite the enormity of the task facing the Foundation. As to CoR, let me say that it has not been conceived or structured to carry out the kind of activity the NGOs are generally able or called upon to develop. To start with, CoR is not an NGO for the simple reason that it is not an organization at all, nay, it is a non-organization, and it has no budget and no Secretary, its only office being my (overburdened) office. Being simply a group of individuals united by some core ideas and ideals, all of them busy with other activities and moreover physically scattered around the world, CoR is not in a condition to do the things that an organization, even a small one, is supposed to do. Its capacity and power, if any, are those that these individuals, singularly or collectively, may

have, and its function, we say, can only be, in a broad sense, cathalytical. So, it would be improper and imprudent of it to become involved in doing things which, constitutionally, it is unable to do. Nonetheless, Alex King and a couple of other colleagues of mine participated in the NGO's meetings you called in Algiers on 27 October evening. We all wanted them to contribute as much as possible to the exchange of views and definition of purposes and action for the Project's next phase.

Needless to say, CoR wants to be, and will be, active in its own way in fostering the perception by public opinion and people having to do with decisions that a new international order along the lines indicated by RIO is indispensable. On other, past occasions, the action carried out by its own members in their personal capacity as CoR members, or by the various CoR Associations (which again are groups of individuals supporting the CoR purpose in different countries), has been quite effective, more than one could expect of conventional or formal ways only. Everybody in CoR is absolutely at liberty to express his opinions and convictions, even contrary to those of other members; we have found that this candor and freedom are ultimately a great source of strength, because they show that CoR has no axe to grind besides what the people in it believe to be in the general interest of mankind.

Now, since the Foundation has gallantly and rightly assumed the leading role in expounding RIO, I make the following suggestions, and to save your time and mine, send a copy of this letter to (a) your colleagues on the Foundation Board, (b) the CoR members who participated in the RIO Working Groups, (c) CoR ExCom, and (d) some relevant CoR Associations, plus, for information, Jan Tinbergen.

1. Foundation-CoR Relations

(a) RIO (for the moment, the book in English)

I propose the Foundation provides the book for all CoR members who have not received it. Apart from the fact that it is 'A Report to CoR', this is a minimal initial step to mobilize whatever potential, large or small, CoR has. Supposing that the CoR members who were to attend the Algiers meeting would receive the abridged document you had prepared as background information for Participants, in my telex of 8 October I asked you to send it also to the more than 50 non-attending members (then giving you the list thereof); but you answered in your telex of 15 October that you were not in a position to comply, due to lack of available copies. Then the book was brought out, but at the time of the Algiers meeting you had only a limited number of copies available. I do not know how many you could actually distribute in Algiers to Participants or who among the CoR members there have received one (probably only very few of them). The fact is therefore that most of

CoR members have so far received nothing about RIO. In practical terms, my proposal is that you send the RIO book directly to the 50-plus CoR members mentioned in point 2 of my above telex of 8 October and that you let me have some forty more copies that I will send both to those who did not receive it in Algiers and to some CoR Associations. On my part, I will write to all CoR members and ask for their utmost support for RIO.

Altogether, this operation involves a little more than one hundred copies of the book given free, but they will be 'seed' copies which will produce not only a widespread knowledge of RIO itself but certainly also the sale of many more copies of the book. What I can add at this stage is that my colleagues will, on the whole, do a good job with RIO.

As to myself, I have sent six copies with a dedication by Jan Tinbergen and me to some personalities (Bundespräsident Scheel, Président Giscard d'Estaing, Premier Ministre Barre, Chancellor Kreisky, President Boumediene, and UN Secretary General Waldheim) and then received five more copies, which literally volatilized. I have already had a score of interviews, TV appearances and contacts with people important for the dissemination of the RIO spirit. Some of my contacts can buy the book themselves (but even American bookstores in Rome and other cities know little about it, and cannot say when they will get it, so that people may lose interest in it all) but many others cannot. I think that we should not lose momentum and that I should have a certain number of books (judiciously) to distribute. I will let you judge how many.

(It may be interesting for you to know what happened with the two previous reports. In the case of 'The Limits to Growth', I sent the book immediately to all CoR members, plus 3,500 more copies to addresses partly agreed with them, and in very many cases with a personal letter of mine. The cost of the operation was covered by funds I found the way of advancing, and which were then reimbursed by the royalties of the book itself, which the generosity of the authors reserved to CoR. In the case of RIO, what we need is just to have an adequate number of books free. Potomac Associates, which undertook the launching in the United States, distributed themselves some 3,000 more copies).

(In the case of 'Mankind at the Turning Point', all CoR members received a copy of the book immediately, and upwards of 1,500 copies were distributed either by us or the authors themselves in a way similar to the preceding one).

(b) Keeping Abreast

I propose moreover that the Foundation send to all CoR members all pertinent information that it will be circulating to the NGOs and other friends or entities as its action for the new international order debate unfolds. It has rightly been said that the discussion and implementation of a new order is a process. To follow and aid the process this kind of linkage is necessary over a certain period of time.

On my part, I will let the Foundation know of any relevant development from CoR's side.


2. CoR's Own Activity

By this Foundation-CoR cooperation, RIO contents and spirit can receive good leverage in many quarters of many countries. However, independently from this, CoR will consider the issue of the new international order as an integral part of its general activity. In other words, while appreciating very much any guidance, information or suggestions coming from the Foundation, the CoR as a whole will not rely on them alone to do whatever is within its power. I for one, having been convinced for quite a long time of the necessity for profound changes in human society (this being by the way the reason that made me ask Jan Tinbergen in 1974 to lead the project), will go on doing my best in this direction independently of whatever success the Foundation has. I know that many of my colleagues will do the same, even those who have less time available than I do.

For the sake of efficiency and clarity, however, I propose that from time to time we meet to compare notes and review what needs to be done as situations change. Furthermore, when the occasion presents itself, we will be glad to invite people from the Foundation and/or supporting NGOs to some of our meetings (as we already did for the Philadelphia meeting of last April, and to a lesser degree the preceding one in West Berlin and the subsequent one in Madrid).

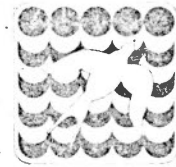

Dear Aurelio,

I hope we answered all your questions by cable. Now, here I have a question for you:

Some people want a lot of complicated extra-routing on their tickets, sometimes involving extra expenses. (Actually, that will include myself: I have to be in Holland before Algiers, and in Angola, Yugoslavia, Malta, and Switzerland after Algiers). In such cases: could you simply transfer ~~xxxxx~~ credit for the basic fare (in my case, Santa Barbara-Algiers and back) to the Airline through which Air Algeria works (for instance, PAA) and then I get my own ticket, paying the difference?

The same applies, in particular, to Professor Charlier, who has to leave here on October 17. Could you let me know right away whether such an arrangement is practical, or whether you have to have the whole, complicated routing -- and what do you then do with it?

Dear Elisabeth,

I was in Algiers again on Thursday 13th to further the arrangements of the Special Club of Rome meeting of 25-28 October with M. Idriss Jazairy and his colleagues. We went over such matters as programme, participants, logistics, documentation, budget, etc. And of course, we also examined in broad outline the PiM VII 22-25 October meeting and its tie-up with the CoR one. I will now give you some indications about the PiM meeting, and would ask you at your earliest convenience to convey to M. Jazairy (copy to me) the information he needs to make decisions and start the organization.

We have considered that the following 24 Participants in the CoR Special Meeting participate also in PiM VII (names taken from your lists):

- = IOI Board of Trustees (7): Amerasinghe, Mann Borgese, Peccei, Pronk, Santa Cruz, Strong, Vratuša.
- = Planning Council (1): Brucan
- = CoR Members (8): King, Buzzati-Traverso, Jaguaribe, Mates, Okita, Pell, Kassas, Urquidi.
- = Ocean Conference delegates: none
- = Scientists (8): Cleveland, Galtung, Ul Haq, Thorsson, Ramphal (in lieu of Papadopoulos), Tinbergen, Pérez Guerrero, Somavia.

These 24 persons (their number may slightly increase when the list of CoR meeting participants is finalized) are already included--concerning travelling expenses, which represent the major cost--in the budget now being considered by our Algerian friends.

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Now, M. Jazairy would like you kindly to submit to him three proposals for the remaining Participants in PiM VII, as follows:

- = First proposal: including all the people listed in the documents you presented in Algiers on 4 May. Perhaps this list may be pruned here and there if you consider that there are names which are now redundant.
- = Second or median proposal: including, say, two-thirds of the names in the first proposal.
- = Third or minimal proposal: including, say, one-third of the names in the first proposal, namely the people you consider as strictly necessary in order to have a meaningful and effective PiM VII Conference in Algiers.

Moreover, for budgetary purposes, you should divide the Participants of each of the three proposals into categories, as follows:

- (a) For travel cost estimate:
 - 1. Those who do not need air ticket refund
 - 2. Those coming from Arab countries
 - 3. Those coming from Africa
 - 4. Those coming from Europe
 - 5. Those coming from Japan
 - 6. Those coming from (rest of) Asia
 - 7. Those coming from Latin America
 - 8. Those coming from North America.
- (b) For logistic arrangements:
 - 1. Those who would stay on for the Special CoR Meeting
 - 2. Those who are expected to leave at the end of the PiM VII Meeting.

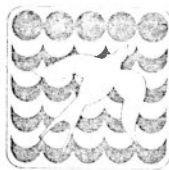

Dear Aurelio,

On the kind invitation of the Algerian authorities, the International Ocean Institute is organizing *Pacem in Maribus VII* in Algeria from October 25 to 28, 1976 on "The new international economic order and the law of the sea." The meeting will be held partly concurrently, partly jointly, with a Special Meeting of the Club of Rome on the New International Order. The main background paper for the joint conference will be the RIO (reshaping the international order) Report, drafted under the chairmanship of Professor Jan Tinbergen. The main background paper for *Pacem in Maribus* will be a study, *The new international economic order and the law of the sea*, revised edition, by Arvid Pardo and Elisabeth Mann Borgese.

The reasons for holding *Pacem in Maribus VII* in conjunction with the Special Meeting of the Club of Rome and the RIO project are twofold. On the one hand, the study on the new international economic order and the law of the sea developed out of the RIO project and is an integral part of it, applying many of the RIO proposals in the specific area of ocean management. On the other hand, the results of the last session of the U.N. Law of the Sea Conference must now be further developed and inserted in the general attempt to build a new international economic order. The Algerian conference on the RIO project offers a first, and exemplary, opportunity to demonstrate this juncture.

The meetings will consist of eight sessions. The first three will be held jointly with the Club of Rome. They will be devoted to the general topic: "Concepts and finalities of the new international order." On the afternoon of October 26th, *Pacem in Maribus* will go into special sessions. One further joint working session with the Club of Rome will take place on the afternoon of the 27th, when an attempt will be made to consider the problems of ocean management in the broader context. On the morning of October 28th, *Pacem in Maribus* will divide into working groups, responsible for drafting reports. The afternoon of the 28th will be dedicated to the closing of

discussions and a press conference. A detailed agenda and flow chart are enclosed.

The meeting will convene in the beautiful Club des Pins, about twenty kilometers from Algiers, which offers an ideal setting for such an event. Participants will be lodged in the nearby hotel which can accommodate all of them. Buses will shuttle participants to and from the meeting place.

Whatever their official positions, all participants will attend the meeting in a personal capacity. The meeting will be informal, both in spirit and organization and with respect to attire. It is aimed at fostering personal acquaintance, constructive exchanges of views, mutual understanding, as well as at indicating some feasible steps along a possible road to a more satisfactory world order, including the oceans.

Round-trip, economy-class air tickets for participants who cannot charge them to another organization and hospitality in Algeria will be provided by the Algerian sponsors of the meeting. You should inform yourself at the nearest Algerian Consulate whether or not you need a visa to come to Algeria. Visas to participants of the Algiers conference will be issued without delay. Should there be no Algerian Consulate in your vicinity, or should you be unable to obtain a visa in advance, please advise me or my assistant, Mrs. Jean Muller. We shall then arrange to have your visa issued at the Algiers airport.

A logistic nucleus is being created in Algiers to take care of all questions related to travel arrangements, hospitality and other needs or wishes participants may have in Algeria -- contacts with Algerian institutions or personalities, visits to other parts of the country, etc. Questions regarding such arrangements should be addressed to the office of M. Idriss Jazairy, Pr sidence de la R publique, Alger, Algeria. For any other information, kindly address yourself to my office. Throughout the meeting (except the working group sessions on the morning of the 28th), simultaneous translation will be available from English, French, Spanish and Arabic into French and English.

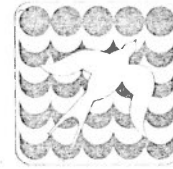

On the kind invitation of the Algerian authorities, the International Ocean Institute is organizing *Pacem in Maribus VII* in Algeria from October 25 to 28, 1976 on "The new international economic order and the law of the sea." The meeting will be held partly concurrently, partly jointly, with a Special Meeting of the Club of Rome on the New International Order. The main background paper for the joint conference will be the RIO (reshaping the international order) Report, drafted under the chairmanship of Professor Jan Tinbergen. The main background paper for *Pacem in Maribus* will be a study, *The new international economic order and the law of the sea*, revised edition, by Arvid Pardo and Elisabeth Mann Borgese.

The reasons for holding *Pacem in Maribus VII* in conjunction with the Special Meeting of the Club of Rome and the RIO project are twofold. On the one hand, the study on the new international economic order and the law of the sea developed out of the RIO project and is an integral part of it, applying many of the RIO proposals in the specific area of ocean management. Cher Ami,

A la suite de notre entretien du 21, le 27 juillet j'ai expédié les lettres d'invitation (en anglais, français ou espagnol, selon les destinataires qui, vous le savez, sont presque au nombre de 300), pour la Réunion d' Alger du 25-28 octobre conformément aux listes agréées. Je joins (Annexe 1) une copie de la liste de leurs noms et adresses. Pour le moment, il s'agit d'une Liste de Travail. Elle n'est plus subdivisée par aires géographiques (cette phase préparatoire étant maintenant dépassée) mais par lettre alphabétique, ce qui facilite la consultation.

Dès que nous aurons un nombre consistant de confirmations (p. e. vers le 10 ou le 15 septembre), sur la base de cette première liste nous préparerons une Liste Provisoire des Participants par ordre alphabétique que l'on pourra envoyer à tous les intéressés, y compris les Participants eux-mêmes. Une Liste (presque) Définitive pourra être établie avant la mi-octobre.

A propos de la Liste de Travail actuelle, je vous prie de noter que :

- (a) Pour les participants d'origine PiM, j'ai inclut également Dupuy, Kesteven, Keckes, Odell (voir mon telex du 22 courant).

Etant donné qu' Elisabeth pense qu'il y aura une non-acceptation de 20 à 30% des invités, dans ce cas les lettres d'invitation à ces huit personnes pourront être envoyées probablement au commencement de septembre.
- (c) Toujours comme PiM, Elisabeth prie d'ajouter Mrs. Jean Muller, son assistante à Santa Barbara, et Miss Vanderbilt qui recouvre la même charge à Malte. Je vous prierais de m'indiquer si vous êtes d'accord.
- (d) Pour l'invitation à Rodriguez-Pinos Santos (Cuba), j'ai écrit (selon

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- nos accords) à M. Rodriguez et à mon collègue Victor Urquidi (copies ci-jointes).
- (e) Comme d'accord, pour l'invitation à M. Mamadou Dia j'ai écrit au Président Senghor en vous en envoyant copie.
 - (f) Pour les invités africains, je ne suis pas sûr des décisions prises par M. Cosme (Cameroun) et Dowidar (Egypte) que, par conséquent, j'ai tenus en suspens, et pour lesquels je vous prierais de me donner vos indications.
 - (g) Pour les deux candidats homonymes (Sayegh) du Liban, j'attends également que vous me fassiez savoir quelque chose.
 - (h) Sur conseil de M. Hernan Santa Cruz, je vous ai telexé l'opportunité d'inviter le Ministre des Finances de Sri Lanka, M. Felix Dias Bandaranaike qui, paraît-il, est chargé d'organiser la Réunion des pays non-alignés du mois prochain à Colombo.
 - (i) Pour la personnalité allemande (nous avons pensé au Ministre Egon Bahr ou à l'ex-Ministre Erhardt Eppler), j'ai fait parvenir un mot au Président Walter Scheel avant de faire l'invitation. Il donne toujours de bons conseils.
 - (j) Pour la personnalité française (nous avons pensé à M. Gorse) je pourrai prendre des contacts fin août ou début septembre.
 - (k) De même pour la personnalité américaine, quoique je tâcherais de voir le Président du DAC à l'OCED, M. Maurice J. Williams, à Paris un de ces jours.
 - (l) Dans la liste ne figure pas encore le nom de M. Giovanni Agnelli car je n'ai pas encore pu le voir (ce sera probablement fin août-début septembre) pour lui en parler. Il en est de même pour l'autre industriel, si possible suédois ou allemand, que je désire suggérer (au lieu de M. Gyllenhammar de Volvo).
 - (m) Les membres du Club de Rome sont indiqués dans la liste par le signe ●.
Quelques-uns parmi ceux qui sont indiqués pourront payer leur voyage et d'autres pourront être remplacés par d'autres membres (je suis encore en correspondance avec nos cent membres).

- (n) L'invitation à M. Monnier du Département de Politique Fédérale de Berne pourra être décidée quand nous saurons si M. Piccard, déjà invité par Elisabeth (et très important lui-même), viendra ou pas.

- (p) Je n'ai pas encore reçu d'indications de la part de M. Ul Haq au sujet des invités de la Banque Mondiale et du Fonds Monétaire. Je lui ai fait un cable pour avoir ses suggestions au plus tôt.
- (q) Je serai probablement le 3 septembre à New York et je pense qu'il serait bon que j'informe le Secrétaire Général des Nations Unies, M. Waldheim, de la Réunion d' Alger en lui demandant aussi de bien vouloir envoyer son représentant ou de déléguer un des participants de la famille des Nations Unies à le représenter. Je voudrais avoir votre avis à ce propos.
- (r) Pour les journalistes Participants de la presse occidentale (Malley, Montaron, Lewis, Chauvel, Drouin et Todisco), j'ai écrit aux trois premiers et je contacterai personnellement ou ferai contacter les trois autres.
- (s) J'attends vos indications pour les journalistes Participants du Tiers Monde.
- (t) Quelques petites corrections seront probablement nécessaires ultérieurement, soit pour parer à l'absence de quelques pays (p. e. , il n'y a personne de l' Arabie Séoudite), soit pour d'autres raisons d'opportunité.
- (u) Pour les Observateurs qui viendront à Alger à leurs frais (d'après leur nombre total et leurs qualités individuelles, vous pourrez décider si vous jugez opportun d'offrir à quelques-uns d'entre eux l'hospitalité à Alger), je vous indique pour l'instant trois noms dans l' Annexe 2.
- (v) Dans la liste ci-jointe le signe ✕ indique que l'invité a déjà communiqué son adhésion.

Je me permets de suggérer qu'aux personnes **X** qui ont déjà communiqué leur adhésion vos services pourraient déjà faire parvenir le Questionnaire correspondant dont je joins ici un projet (Annexe 3) que vous pourrez modifier ou éventuellement compléter si vos services désirent avoir d'autres éléments. Dès que d'autres confirmations arriveront, les noms respectifs vous seront signalés par groupes, de façon que les questionnaires puissent être envoyés aux autres intéressés également.

On the invitation of the Algerian authorities, The Club of Rome is organizing a Special Meeting in Algiers on 25-28 October 1976, the subject being The New International Order. The Information Note herewith contains a few indications on this important event. Speaking for The Club of Rome and myself personally, I take pleasure in inviting you to participate in it.

After the official opening (Monday 25th morning), there will be eight working sessions which will end on Thursday 28th afternoon. The first two (Monday afternoon and Tuesday morning) will be plenary meetings to consider the new international order in broad terms; the invited speakers will be dealing essentially with its concepts and finalities. Sessions Three to Six (Tuesday afternoon, Wednesday and the morning of Thursday) will be devoted to the discussion of the different chapters of the project on 'Reshaping the International Order (RIO)' which is being completed under the leadership of Professor Jan Tinbergen. The Seventh Session (first part of Thursday afternoon) will examine the follow-up to this project. The Eighth and final Session (second part of Thursday afternoon) will again be a plenary one, devoted to concluding remarks and the closing of the meeting.

As you will see from the enclosed Note, in parallel with Sessions Three to Seven of this meeting, a convocation of 'Pacem in Maribus VII (PiM VII)' will be held in separate rooms on the theme 'The New International Economic Order and the Law of the Sea'. The Participants in it will be receiving a specific invitation to this effect from the International Ocean Institute. However, this letter is addressed also to them, since they too are invited to the plenary Sessions of The Club of Rome meeting (Sessions One, Two and Eight).

The people responsible for the RIO project and my colleagues of The Club of Rome hope that you can accept this invitation, which has been made possible by the initiative and generosity of our Algerian friends.

The day before yesterday I was again in Algiers, because the total number of participants which resulted putting together CoR, PiM, RIO, and the suggestions from other parts was well above the total permissible by the budgetary allocation at the disposal of Idriss Jazairy. Quite a few cuts had to be made, although not as many as I feared.

The result, as far as the PiM Group is concerned, is as follows:

- A. Of all the PiM candidates indicated in Annex II--1 to 8--to my letter of 5 July to Idriss Jazairy (copy to you) the following eight names of list C (invitations suspended) have been left out, in the sense that I am not writing them the general invitation letter (as per facsimile herewith). If you have invited them in the meantime, a problem arises and a decision will have to be made on what to do. Please let me and Jazairy know what you suggest:

De Soto - Ballah - Torras de Luz - Cisse - Johnson - Brown^F -
Van der Essen - Craven. # Brown^{no}

- B. Initially, on the suggestion of some of Jazairy's advisors, also Dupuy - Kesteven - Keckes - Odell

were left out. But, seeing from your letter that they are either chairmen or rapporteurs or presentators in various sessions of your programme, I suggested Jazairy that they should be reinstated, and I am sure that he will accept.

- C. The suggestion was also made to substitute Mr Monnier (first name not known to me yet), of the Federal Political Department in Bern, for Jacques Piccard, but this substitution was left in suspense because probably you have in the meantime invited Piccard, as he was

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included in list B (invitations under way) of my 5 July letter. Please let us know both the situation and what are your reactions to this.

- D. According to another suggestion received by M. Jazairy, also Mr David Hall, Executive Secretary of the Law of the Sea Conference, was included. I expect you will be in accord.

I have sent you yesterday a cable with the essence of the above, and hope that you will let us have your answers as soon as possible, so that we can be attuned to each other.

THE NEW INTERNATIONAL ORDER

Algiers, Algeria, 25-28 October 1976

- On the invitation of the Algerian authorities, The Club of Rome is organizing a Special Meeting in Algiers on 25-28 October 1976 on 'The New International Order! Herebelow a few indications are given about this important meeting. More complete and detailed information will be supplied as soon as the full programme of the event, the list of the Participants (who will be in the order of 250) and other features are defined.
- The Meeting will be opened with an address by an Algerian personality on the morning of Monday 25 October, and there will be eight Working Sessions.
- The first two Sessions (Monday 25 afternoon and Tuesday 26 morning) will be chaired by members of The Club of Rome and will consider the new international order in broad terms. Intellectual, scientific, economic and political leaders of different cultures and postures will be asked to express their views on the 'Concepts and Finalities' that should inspire a new world order in this moment which calls for good will, creative imagination and political wisdom from all if mankind is to be organized on saner and stabler bases.
- Sessions Three to Seven (Tuesday 26 afternoon to the first part of Thursday 28 afternoon) will be organized and chaired by Nobel laureate Jan Tinbergen and Mr Hernán Santa Cruz, President of Centre International pour le Développement (Neuilly-sur-Seine). During these Sessions, the discussion will be centred on various conclusions of 'Reshaping the International Order (RIO)', the project led by Jan Tinbergen himself (and succinctly illustrated in the enclosed RIO Note), as well as on some 'packages of proposals for comprehensive negotiations' suggested therein, and the possible follow-up to this project.
- The Eighth and final Session (second part of Thursday 28 afternoon) will be for concluding remarks and the closing of the meeting.
- In parallel with Sessions Three to Seven, a separate meeting has been convened by the International Ocean Institute. It is called 'Pacem in Maribus VII (PiM VII)' and will be held in adjacent rooms on the theme 'The New International Economic Order and the Law of the Sea'.

Participants in PiM VII will participate also in Sessions One, Two and Eight of The Club of Rome Meeting.

- The place of convocation is the beautiful 'Club des Pins' some 20 km from Algiers, which offers an ideal setting for such an event. The Participants will be lodged in nearby hotels, and buses will shuttle them to and from the meeting place. Besides the members of the RIO Working Groups and some sixty people from The Club of Rome, the other Participants will include humanists, economists, scientists, intellectual and political figures from all continents and a great variety of countries. Whatever their official positions, all will attend in a personal capacity. The Meeting will be totally informal both in its spirit and organization and as to attire. It is aimed at fostering personal acquaintances, constructive exchanges of views and mutual understanding, and at indicating some feasible steps along a possible road to a more satisfactory world order. Simultaneous translation will be made from English, French, Spanish and Arabic into French and English, and from the latter two languages into Arabic.
- By the time of the Meeting the text of the RIO Report will have been published in English and possibly some other languages. The project Director, Mr Jan van Ettinger, will see to it that all Participants receive it--in English or, as the case may be, other languages--before the Meeting, along with any other up-to-date documentation which may be necessary. The address in Rotterdam to which any question concerning these matters should be mailed is indicated in the RIO Note herewith.
- In view of the character of the Meeting and its large attendance, Participants who are in a position to charge their airfare to the organization to which they belong are kindly asked to do so. For the others, return air tickets, economy class, as well as, for all Participants, hospitality in Algiers, will be graciously provided by the Algerian sponsors of the Meeting. Spouses of the Participants are welcome; hospitality will be extended to them; their air fare should however be provided in any case directly by Participants. Cultural and tourism programmes will be arranged in due time.
- A logistic nucleus will be created in Algiers to take care of all these matters and other needs or wishes Participants may have in Algeria (contacts with Algerian institutions or personalities, visits to other parts of the country, etc.). Pending the creation of this nucleus, any questions should be addressed to the office of M. Idriss Jazairy, Conseiller à la Présidence, El Mouradia, Alger, Algérie. For any other necessities, The Club of Rome Secretariat will be glad to be of help in any way possible.

Cher Monsieur Jazairy,

Je profite d'une autre personne qui se rend demain à Alger pour lui confier la présente, de façon que, dans les prochains jours, vous puissiez en considérer le contenu qui concerne les invitations pour la Réunion du 25-28 octobre, invitations que je devrais expédier sûrement au plus tard le 20 ou le 25 de ce mois-ci. J'envoie copie de cette lettre aussi à Hernan Santa Cruz, Jan Van Ettinger et Elisabeth Mann Borgese pour leurs commentaires, que je les prie de me faire avoir par telex, cable ou téléphone bien avant ces dates.

Pour ce qui concerne les noms des invités, je me réfère à ceux que nous avons passés en revue le 21 juin à Rotterdam sur la base de la liste que vous aviez apportée vous-même d'Alger et des autres documents et suggestions que nous avons considérés ensemble. D'autre part, j'ai tenu compte de votre indication que, pour des raisons budgétaires, il faudrait limiter à environ 260 le nombre des invités qui doivent venir de l'étranger. Le raisonnement est que probablement 10% des invités ne pourra accepter, ce qui réduira leur nombre de 260 à approximativement 230. En y ajoutant une vingtaine de personnalités algériennes (le nombre et la qualité de celles-ci étant d'ailleurs, bien entendu, de votre ressort), on arriverait au total de 250 participants qui est celui que vous avez pris comme base pour l'organisation logistique de la Réunion.

Or, étant donné qu'au mois de mai sont déjà parties les invitations pour 115 personnes (voir ma lettre du 21 mai), qui forment la Liste A, il y aurait la possibilité de lancer encore

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145 invitations pour atteindre le total de 260. Cependant, étant donné que les noms ultérieurs examinés à Rotterdam dépassent largement le nombre de 145, je les ai subdivisés en deux catégories : Liste B, de 136 personnes, qu'à mon avis il faudrait sans faute inviter, et Liste C de 54 candidats, parmi lesquels on devrait opérer les réductions nécessaires.

Pour faciliter la tâche de nous entendre de loin, j'ai préparé deux annexes. L'Annexe I permet d'avoir d'un seul coup d'oeil la répartition géographique des 305 candidats, qui sont classés en 8 catégories : (1) Amérique Latine, (2) Afrique, (3) Asie (sans Japon), (4) Japon, (5) Europe occidentale, (6) Amérique du Nord-Australie, (7) Europe orientale, (8) famille des Nations Unies. L'Annexe II contient les noms des candidats et leur nationalité. Je vous prie de noter en outre que :

- (a) Dans l'Annexe II, à côté du nom, est indiqué le titre en vertu duquel ils sont invités, à savoir :
- = RIO : membres des Groupes de Travail du Projet, correspondants ou contributeurs extérieurs, chefs des organisations non-gouvernementales qui devront collaborer avec la Fondation RIO, etc. ;
 - = PIM, participants à la réunion PIM VII, selon les indications d' Elisabeth;
 - = COR, membres du Club de Rome invités en tant que tels;
 - = NU, personnalités de la famille des Nations Unies;
 - = PER, autres personnalités ayant intérêt ou pouvant contribuer aux discussions sur le Nouvel Ordre International.
- (b) Quelques candidats peuvent être invités à plusieurs titres. Je les ai classés selon leur titre principal pour lequel ils sont invités.
- (c) Les COR invités comme tels sont au nombre de 55 (sur un total de presque 100 membres), plus deux secrétaires, mais je prévois que seulement une cinquantaine interviendra effectivement. La réduction dans cette catégorie démontre que dans d'autres catégories aussi on pourra faire des réductions sans diminuer pour autant l'importance, l'intérêt ou l'impact de la Réunion.

- (d) La répartition des personnes encore non invitées entre la Liste B et la Liste C je l'ai faite selon le bon sens mais un peu arbitrairement. Je vous prierais (et je prie de même Hernan, Jan et Elisabeth) de me telexer, cabler ou téléphoner :
- = quels déplacements d'une liste à l'autre vous suggérez,
 - = quelles sont les personnes de la Liste C définitive pour lesquelles on devrait pour l'instant s'abstenir de faire l'invitation : il s'agit au total d'une quarantaine de personnes.
- (e) A ce sujet, je dois préciser que les noms qui apparaissent dans la Liste C au-dessous de la ligne transversale ont été choisis en accord avec Jan ou avec Hernan. Dans plusieurs cas, il s'agit de personnes qui devraient être plutôt dans la Liste B que dans la Liste C.
- (f) Il est probable que la somme des invités qui ne pourront pas accepter ou qui pourront se pourvoir directement du billet aérien (sans représenter une charge pour le budget de la Réunion) seront plus que 10%. Dans ce cas, pour une partie des candidats de la Liste C qui resteraient exclus pour l'instant, l'invitation pourrait être faite disons au mois de septembre (ou d'autres noms, non inclus dans les listes déjà préparées, pourront être pris en considération).
- (g) Pour la famille des Nations Unies, par mes lettres du 21 mai, j'avais déjà demandé à MM. Philippe De Seynes et Mahbub Ul Haq de me donner des indications sur les personnes appartenant respectivement au milieu des Nations Unies et de la Banque Mondiale-Fonds Monétaire que l'on devrait inviter. N'ayant pas encore eu de réponse, pour l'instant les noms indiqués dans l'Annexe II ne tiennent pas compte de leurs suggestions que je les prie d'accélérer en leur envoyant un cable aujourd'hui même.
- (h) Pour certains des candidats qui apparaissent dans la liste que vous avez apportée à Rotterdam, je n'ai pas l'orthographe exacte de leurs noms ou leur qualification et adresses précises. J'ai fait un signe à côté de leurs noms dans l'Annexe II, et j'attends le telex que vous m'avez promis avec ces renseignements pour procéder à l'envoi des invitations.

- (i) A part les participants dont aux Listes A, B et C mentionnées et les personnalités algériennes que vous indiquerez, vous avez manifesté le désir d'avoir comme participants une dizaine de journalistes internationaux de première ligne, ou pouvant bien interpréter et répandre l'esprit de la Réunion d'Alger, mais leurs noms n'ont pas été bien établis. Pour l'instant, j'ai noté seulement les noms de Roberto Savio de l'Interpress (suggéré par Hernan), Simon Malley d'Afrique Asie, Alfredo Todisco du Corriere della Sera (que je suggère), Enrique Ruiz Garcia de El Día, de Mexico (indiqué également par Hernan), et aussi de Anthony Lewis du New York Times, Pierre Drouin de Le Monde, Gordon Tether (?) du Financial Times^(^). Je vous prierais d'y penser encore un moment (j'adresse la même prière à Hernan, Jan et Elisabeth) pour que l'on puisse passer à la phase exécutive.
- (j) Outre ces journalistes participants, vous pensez offrir le passage et l'hospitalité à d'autres (comme Mme Jacqueline Giraud de l'Express, qui a été déjà informée par M. Maurice Guernier). Il faudra enfin penser à inviter les journalistes qui pourront couvrir la Réunion comme d'habitude, en leur indiquant les facilités qu'on leur donnera pour leurs services, mais à ce propos vous avez sûrement à Alger une très bonne expérience. Je reste quand même à votre disposition.

En attendant des informations de votre part (ainsi que d'Hernan, Jan et Elisabeth), je vous prie d'agréer, cher Monsieur Jazairy, mes salutations les meilleures.

On the invitation of the Algerian authorities, The Club of Rome is organizing a Special Meeting in Algiers on 25-28 October 1976, the subject being The New International Order. The Preliminary Note herewith contains a few indications on this important event. Speaking for The Club of Rome and myself personally, I take pleasure in inviting you to participate in it.

After the official opening (Monday 25th morning), there will be eight working sessions. The first two (Monday afternoon and Tuesday morning) will be plenary meetings to consider the new international order in broad terms; the invited speakers will be dealing essentially with its concepts and finalities. Sessions Three to Six (Tuesday afternoon, Wednesday and the morning of Thursday) will be devoted to the discussion of the different chapters of the project on 'Reshaping the International Order (RIO)' which is being completed under the leadership of Professor Jan Tinbergen. The Seventh Session (first part of Thursday afternoon) will examine the follow-up to this project. The Eighth and final Session (second part of Thursday afternoon) will again be a plenary one, devoted to concluding remarks and the closing of the meeting.

As you will see from the enclosed Note, in parallel with Sessions Three to Seven, another meeting--'Pacem in Maribus VII (PiM VII)'--will be held in separate rooms on the theme 'The New International Economic Order and the Law of the Sea'. The Participants in it will be receiving a specific invitation to this effect from the International Ocean Institute. However, this letter is addressed also to them, since they too are invited to the plenary Sessions of The Club of Rome meeting.

The people responsible for the RIO project and my colleagues of The Club of Rome hope that you can accept this invitation, which has been made possible by the initiative and generosity of our Algerian friends.


