

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

The 1982-1983 session has not been an easy one, for either the pharmacy faculty or the pharmacy students. The school year started shortly after the provincial government's announcement that some of the promised funding to Dalhousie would not be forthcoming, causing the University to cut its budget in the middle of the fiscal year. In mid October, President MacKay declared a situation of financial constraint and froze all faculty replacements and reappointments. In December the question of whether or not the Dalhousie Faculty Association was going to strike confronted the students with the real possibility that their studies might be interrupted. Then two faculty members left the College in the middle of the academic term, creating a total of three vacant faculty positions on our teaching staff. The lack of announcement from the government as late as March regarding the level of fundings to universities created uncertainty and uneasiness among faculty and students. This is a very gloomy picture. However, we must not allow these events to destroy our picture. However, we must not allow these events to destroy our picture. We cannot afford to give up hope!


