STUDENT UNION REPORT

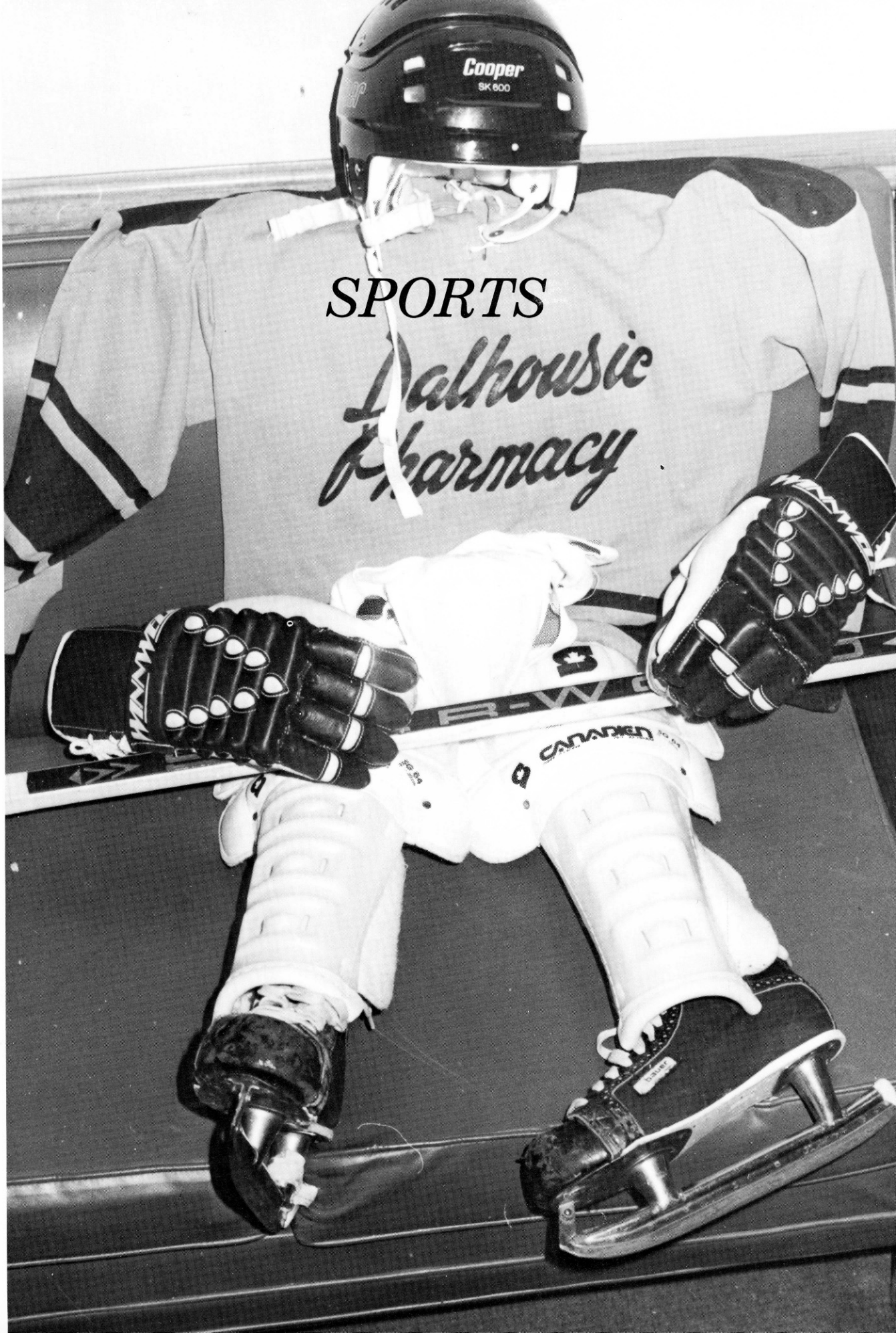
