INTERNATIONAL OCEAN INSTITUTE

Board of Trustees

Draft minutes of the third session, 29th November, 1974 at the International Ocean Institute, Royal University of Malta.

The session was brought to order at 10.30 a.m. by Mr A. Peccei who was acting as Chairman in the absence of Ambassador Amerasinghe. Members present, constituting a quorum, were: Peccei, Santa Cruz, Revelle, Thacher (deputizing for Strong), and Borgese and Borg Costanzi ex officio, and Evensen, who joined the session in the afternoon. Apologies for absence were received from the other members.

Borg Costanzi stated that the draft minutes of the second session of the Board had been circulated to members in December 1973, and that no corrections or amendments had been submitted by members.

The Board adopted the following agenda:

Item I

Borgese reported on the activities of the Planning Council.

(i) World Energy Institute

The first aspect of expansion of activities is in the form of an expected grant of about \$300,000 from the Government of Iran to the IOI, Piccard's Institute in Cully, and the Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions in Santa Barbara. This is hopefully the first part of Iranian funding and will be used for a six-month feasibility study by the three institutes. The larger part of the \$300,000 goes to CSDI which will act as the coordinator

of the project. This project is discussed thoroughly in two documents which were distributed by Borgese and are appended here (1, 2). It is envisaged that IOI will do the ocean-oriented work under this grant (i.e. studies on wave, thermal and tidal energy, coordination and encouragement of outside pilot projects relating to aspects of ocean/energy relations, etc.). Dr. Piccard's Institute will concentrate on the environmental and technological aspects of energy.

Peccei took this opportunity to clarify the reasons for IOI's involvement in this project with the understanding that the IOI will serve, in this instance, only to assist in the formation of the World Energy Institute; when the WEI is established, IOI's function will be solely as a consultant on ocean-oriented energy problems. Santa Cruz raised the question of the status of the WEI, and Borgese informed the Board that it would have the status of an INGO, dealing with energy policy, primarily directed towards the needs and interests of developing countries. Borgese also informed the Board that the first phase of the feasibility study is planned to start in January 1975 and conclude with a seminar in Teheran in September 1975.

The Board noted that the budget for the WEI was now set for only the first six months of the feasibility study. The budget for the remaining four years was approved only in principle. Santa Cruz asked which governments would be consulted on the project, and Mrs Borgese informed the Board that the Government of Venezuela had already given their approval of the project and promised to help on it. Also OPEC had been consulted and IIASA (International Institute of Applied Systems Analysis) in Vienna. The Board noted with approval the proposed project and looked forward to positive results from the first six months' work.

Regarding the activities of IOI in this context it was suggested that IOI should concentrate on looking at what types of ocean/energy work is being done at this time, what needs to be done in the future, and what is practicable to do. It was noted that Mr Mintoff is particularly interested in wave energy. The Board noted with pleasure that Mr

Nikolaus Laing of Germany would also be addressing them in this connection on his work in the field of energy saving technologies later in the day.

(ii) Italy

Borgese review past assistance from the Government of Italy: sponsoring of marine parks meeting in 1973, donation of castle in Castellabate, and now their desire for IOI or an Italian branch of Pacem in Maribus to work on Italian-oriented projects in the field of ocean use. Borgese reported that on her recent trip to Italy she was informed that the Government of Campania had Lit. 300 million to spend on work directed to a plan for the economic zone in Italy (e.g. coastal development, pollution studies, aquaculture, etc. in Italian coastal waters). (At the end of January 1975 a meeting is planned to discuss this more thoroughly.) It was stressed by Borgese that this activity is completely independent from the Institute in Malta. Dr. Dohrn is directing the work and IOI is meant only to supply advice (not funding). The Board was also informed that Professor Roberto Virtuoso has publicly announced the establishment of an Italian Association of Pacem in Maribus. This Association will be working on such problems as a survey of the economic zone uses and potential, i.e. a systematic economic study, including the effects of development on the Cilento, moving north and south from Castellabate. The Government is also interested to bring people from developing countries (in the Mediterranean) to study and work in Castellabate. Thacher informed the Board that UNEP would be interested to help in this endeavour if the geographic extent of the Government of Campania and the zone of concern extends far enough inland to fall within the range requirements of UNEP. He requested a paper from Dohrn or Borgese clarifying this.

(iii) Portugal

Borgese further reported that there were good prospects for the setting up of an institute in Portugal, funded by the Gulbinkian Foundation, similar to that envisaged for Italy but concentrating on the Atlantic.

(iv) Arctic Project

It was agreed to postpone discussion to the afternoon.

(v) Pacific Project

Borgese reported that the conference which was due to be held in Hawaii in collaboration with the University of Hawaii on the peaceful uses of ocean space in the Central Pacific had been postponed from April 1975 because of the Geneva Conference.

(vi) Meeting in Mexico

Borgese announced the invitation of the Government of Mexico for the holding of the next Planning Council meeting there, at their expense, from the 13th to 15th January, 1975. The official invitation was distributed.

Item II

In the absence of the Director, Borg Costanzi distributed the report prepared by Holt for 1973/74 and which had already been presented to the IOI Planning Council by Holt and added that Borgese had already in her report covered most of the activities of the IOI.

Item III

With regard to this item Borg Costanzi distributed a note for the Board of Trustees, written by Holt (see appendix 3). It was agreed that Borg Costanzi, as Rector of the University and Treasurer of IOI, should act as Director of IOI until a more suitable arrangement between Holt and FAO could be reached. At present FAO had agreed to Holt spending only 1/3 of his time in Malta and it was agreed that this was not sufficient. Borgese suggested that the possibility might exist for Holt to divide his time between the IOI in Malta and work for the Government of Campania (Italy). As this was still very vague it was suggested that it be further investigated and discussed with Holt.

Peccei questioned the sources of financing for 1/3 of Holt's time with IOI which costs the Institute \$17,000 in one year. Borgese replied that funds have so far been provided from private sources (McAllister, Borgese, FIOI, etc,) but it was hoped that the major part of the money for the next year would come from the Iranian grant for the first part of the ocean/energy study. Where financial assistance would come from in the future was still unsure. Peccei stated that: (a) he felt it imprudent to be thinking in terms of three years when one year was so uncertain;

- (b) he felt that Holt should do more backup work for the PC projects;
- (c) he thought \$17,000 was too much for 1/3 of one year.

The Board of Trustees then agreed to: (a) take note of the situation as described, and designate the Rector of RUM as Acting-Director of IOI until such time as other arrangements can be made; (b) recognize that in 1974/75 Miss Vanderbilt will continue to assist the (Acting) Director; (c) authorize the Treasurer of IOI to transfer funds to the University account in order that as Rector he can make contractual arrangements between RUM and FAO and to write to FAO to transfer any residual funds from previous contract to the new trust fund; (d) authorize the Chairman of the Board, in consultation with the Acting-Director, to make such further arrangements as may seem necessary and practicable before the fourth session of the Board; except that any appointment, other than the re-appointment of S. Holt as Director, would be subject to the approval of the Board which would be sought by mail.

The Board then adjourned for lunch after which Thatcher presented an outline for the forthcoming Barcelona meeting and the foreseen UNEP function in that context.

BREAK

The Board re-convened at 1500.

#### Arctic Project

Mr Jens Evensen discussed the IOI Arctic project and Norway's interest in it. This interest was due to the problems created by shelf oil, overfishing (e.g. the Barents Sea being fished at twice its sustainable yield) and pollution (from drilling platforms). He requested that the IOI issue a formal or informal request to his Ministry to hold a meeting in Norway some time in early December 1975 to deal specifically with aspects of this project. It was suggested by various Board members that other institutes that might be interested to participate would be the Polar Institute, the Pool (Nansen Foundation) Institute, the Scot Polar Institute in the U.K. and possibly some representative from Sweden. It was also agreed that the paper on the Arctic project would be revised by Evensen and Borgese.

Continuation of discussion on Mediterranean Project

Thacher stated that although Strong had had much personal correspondence with Borgese, UNEP needed now formal correspondence with IOI in order to implement assistance from that body. This involved filling out a form requesting formal assistance with the Mediterranean project. Peccei noted that it would be good to present the Castellabate project to UNEP along with the Mediterranean project and if such a proposal were prepared he would make the necessary contacts with the Italian Government in the name of IOI. It was agreed that Holt and Borgese would do this. Thacher also informed the Board that there was funding to those countries or organizations who were able to provide training facilities to North African states in order to assist them in taking part in research in the Mediterranean. Spain, France, Italy and other northern European states were already becoming active along this line. It was suggested therefore that Malta should take advantage of its location to provide help to African States to study in Malta and learn the affects of pollution as well as the basic analytical techniques of pollution control, etc.

Peccei suggested that possibly even marine parks could be used in this area, i.e. having people from the Castellabate Park go to African states to teach the people there how to set up a marine park. Borgese added that it would be possible to provide scholarships from the German Foundation for work of this kind, or combine teaching and student fellowships.

Borg Costanzi reminded the Board that at present IOI had no funds which would allow Holt to do the work of planning the projects and organizing these ideas under discussion. Santa Cruz again restated his concern for the continuity of the Director. Thacher made clear that UNEP could not provide a salary for Holt to work as Director of IOI, but possibly Holt could get on the UNEP payroll. It was agreed that Borgese would discuss this possibility with Holt and report back by 20th December. Thacher stated that it would be better to postpone these discussions until after the Barcelona meeting in January 1975 and this was agreed to.

At 1615 Mr Nikolaus Laing, a consultant on the energy project presented the Board with a brief description of energy-saving technologies.

Item IV

Borg Costanzi distributed the Financial Statement for the period ending 30.9.74 and the Draft Budget for October 1974/September 1975.

He pointed out that the University provides IOI with a secretary, office space and £2,000 annually for miscellaneous expenditures. Whilst difficulties still existed, on the positive side it was to be noted that the financial situation was at least not deteriorating. Borgese stated that the major part of the debts would be payable by the royalties of her book which would be forthcoming in September 1975. She also noted that the projected cost for PIM VI would be £100,000. She suggested that PIM VI should only be held if funding on such a scale was available. The Board agreed that future fund raising must be by specific projects, and the funds must be assured before the IOI is committed to any project. Peccei suggested that the host country of meetings should pay the expenses of that meeting and stated that many countries are very willing to do this.

Peccei stated that the memo submitted was not sufficient and asked the Board to take note of the memo and stated that the budget should show minimum expenditures plus modular additions. On his suggestion, the Trustees gave a mandate to Borgese and Borg Costanzi to assure continuity and coordination of the activities of IOI; Borgese, as Chairman of the Planning Council, taking the appropriate decisions, where necessary seeking the opinion of other members of the Board.

Regarding PIM VI, which is planned to coincide with Ocean Expo in Okinawa, Peccei informed the Board that the negotiations must be started immediately. It was agreed that this would be decided on at the next Planning Council meeting in Mexico in January 1975.

It was agreed that the next formal session of the Board be held in December 1975/January 1976 possibly in connection with PIM VI.

Thacher suggested that a further (informal) meeting of the Board should take place in Geneva during the second session of the Sea Conference there between 17th March and 10th May; this was agreed to.

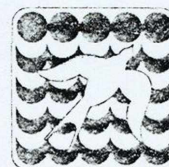

NOTE FOR BOARD OF TRUSTEES, 3rd SESSION, ON SITUATION REGARDING THE  
POST OF DIRECTOR OF IOI

1. During the summer 1974, arrangements had been agreed in principle with FAO for Dr. Holt's services as Director to be continued, on a part-time basis for another year as from 19 August 1974. In September, however, FAO went back on this agreement. Despite the efforts of the Rector of RUM and Dr. Holt himself, it has not been possible to change the FAO policies that if Dr. Holt is to continue as Director of IOI he must sever his connections with FAO; this applying whether he is working with FAO or on paid or unpaid leave of absence. Since funds are not yet available to offer Dr. Holt (or any alternative candidate) a full-time post with IOI for a year or more, Dr. Holt has regretfully had to cease serving as Director as from the date of the present Board meeting. His position can be reconsidered if and when the financial situation changes.
2. It is proposed that for the time being the Rector of R.U.M. should be designated as Acting-Director of IOI, He acted in this position also in 1972-73, while Dr. Holt was the UN Advisor in Malta. Meanwhile the Rector and the Chairman of the Planning Council are looking into other possible ways of keeping the Directorate of IOI in being.
3. Dr. Holt has persuaded FAO to agree, however, to his continuing, for the time-being on a part-time basis, as Professor of International Ocean Affairs at R.U.M. He would thus be able to assist the Rector until a more satisfactory arrangement can be worked out.
4. During the past year continuity of the work of the Directorate has been assured by full-time voluntary assistance from Miss C. Vanderbilt, and by the Director's secretary, Miss R. Zammit, on the staff of R.U.M. Miss Zammit has, however, been awarded leave of absence by the University. She will be replaced, but necessarily by someone without experience of IOI work. Miss Vanderbilt's continued assistance is, therefore, in the circumstances, doubly essential. Fortunately, it has been possible to award her a one year fellowship for study and research at RUM/IOI and she is prepared during that period to devote some time to the day-to-day work of the Institute.
5. It is, in view of the above, proposed that the Board:
  - (a) Take note of the situation described and designate the Rector of RUM as Acting-Director of IOI until such time as other arrangements can be made;
  - (b) Recognise that in 1974-75 Miss Vanderbilt will continue to assist the (Acting)-Director,
  - (c) Authorise the Chairman of the Board, in consultation with the Acting Director, to make such further arrangements as may seem necessary, and practicable before the fourth session of the Board; except that any other appointment than the re-appointment of Dr. Holt, as Director, would be subject to the approval of the Board, which would be sought by mail.
