

CRISIS IN MOZAMBIQUE - A ONE DAY SYMPOSIUM

Is development possible in a conflict zone? Come find the answer to this and many other questions at this one day symposium. The program will feature The Hon. Graca Machel, Mozambique's Minister of Educatioin.

The event will take place at the Union Building, Dalhousie University on

January 31, 1989.

Graca Machel began her training in Tanzania as a FRELIMO freedom fighter after graduating with a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Lisbon in 1972. She has been Minister of Education since Mozambiques independence in 1975. She is a member of the central committee of FRELIMO, a deputy of people's Assembly, President of the Mozambican children's organization, the Continuadors, as President of the National Commission of UNESCO.

In 1975 she married Samora Moises Machel, President of the People's Republic of Mozambique. Her husband died in a plane crash in October

1986.

The symposium program will include such topics as Southern Africa: Mozambique's Crisis in Context, Development in a Conflict Zone: Sectoral Perspectives and Canadian Responses. The Day's activities will run from 9:30 a.m. to the keynote address at 7:30 given by The Hon. Graca Machel.




