This "retired" missionary keeps going!

Dr. Florence Murray of Pictou Landing, N.S., has been a United Church missionary in Korea for 41 years. In 1962 she retired *officially* as a medical worker but stayed on to supervise the setting up of a hospital records library in Severance Hospital. Dr. Murray has asked the Board of World Mission to find a hospital records librarian in Canada willing to serve in Korea, but people with the necessary qualifications are hard to find.

The colour photo on the cover shows Dr. Murray checking on the progress of a baby while passing through a small village north of Seoul.

United Church missionaries are associated with the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea (PROK) which represents a more liberal type of Christian thinking. It has a definite concern for social issues and ecumenical relations. There are 681 churches (organized and unorganized) with a total membership of 203,007.

Our missionaries in Korea are assigned to evangelistic, medical, agricultural and educational work. Eight missionary families and two women are engaged in evangelistic work. Others participate in well-established cooperative projects such as Yonsei Medical College, Severance Hospital, Wonju Union Christian Hospital, the Taejon Union Christian Service Centre and Iri Farm.
