I am deeply disappointed that the dates of our Wingspread conference conflict with your schedule.


But I am determined that you and the International Ocean Institute must be represented or our conference will fail to deliver on its promises and fall short of achieving its objectives.

Ocean Trust views its role as convener and moderator of forums in which expert representation of diverse perspective can be exchanged. It is inconceivable that we could treat properly and thoroughly the subjects of the Wingspread gathering without the considerable and valuable work of the International Ocean Institute being represented. At least two of the ocean mining consortia will be represented as will the petroleum and mariculture industries. Woods Hole and Scripps, UNEP and IUCN, several universities and aquaria, the U.S. Government and its endangered Sea Grant program will be represented.

May I, then, impose on you further? Would you recommend someone whom we can invite to participate in your stead?

My own perspective on the issues of ocean policy, particularly those of Law of the Seas, have been profoundly affected by your writing. I regret the Wingspread conference won't occasion our meeting and hope there will be another opportunity soon.
