Dear Jack:

I apologize for the long delay in answering your letter of December 8/78. It came at a time when I was trying to set my future publishing affairs in a tidy order, when a syndicate was pressing me urgently for the movie and TV rights in "The Nymph and The Lamp"; and when I was (and still am) working hard on a research and writing job for a private concern.

As Malcolm Ross may have told you, last Fall I arranged to bequeath all rights in my works, published and unpublished, to Dalhousie for the benefit of their library. Hence, after my death, all royalties and other monies accruing from my works should be paid to Dalhousie University, and all enquiries about subsidiary and foreign publication rights in these works should be directed to the Chief Librarian, Dalhousie University. I'm still very much alive and kicking, but in the nature of things I can't live many more years, so you should put some sort of notice of this to your staff.

While your letter referred specifically to new paperback editions of "The Governor's Lady" and "Hangman's Beach", it really took in all of my Canadian publications because, as you noted, I have long wanted to see a uniform edition.

When you wished to include some of my books in the New Canadian Library you were frank in saying that these paperbacks would not make much money for me or for M&S. So I consented on the understanding that all foreign publishing rights, and movie, anthology and other subsidiary rights, would still belong to me. You agreed. Unfortunately, with the changes of your staff over the years, this gentlemen's agreement between you and me dropped out of sight, and M&S made sales or collected fees for these rights, and deducted anywhere from 10% to 50% for handling them.

The alternative to this, in the new agreement, would be to reserve all these subsidiary rights for myself and my estate. While I live, I can handle them and there is no problem. However, I have to consider what happens next. The librarians of Dalhousie won't have the experience or expertise of M&S in dealing with such rights, or collecting the money for them. So I've been on dilemma's horns.

Well, all this is a damned dull apologia and I'll cut it short.

I agree to your proposals numbered 1 to 4 inclusive, and with the matter of subsidiary rights I shall expect a scrupulous observation of the 10% commission on the part of your staff.

With regard to item 5, I don't want any money in advance. If the movie deal on "The Nymph and The Lamp" goes through, as my lawyers are sure it will, I shall have problems with income tax, even though the movie payments are to be spread over four years.

One thing more. It seems to me that sales of "In My Time" to date have not been enough to wipe out the advance payment on that book. Also I owe M&S for extra copies that I ordered at the time of publication. I'd like to have a clean slate. Please ask your accounting department to let me know how much the deficit amounts to, and I'll send a cheque to clean it up.

Dear Tom:

Your letter of February 4th arrived on the eve of my departure for a two-week business trip to Europe. All that means is that I am pressed for time and can't make the considered response that I would like to make.

Let me say two things. First, I understand your position and it is entirely agreeable and acceptable to us. All we want to do is start on the program for the moment and get these two paperbacks out in March. That we are going to do and I thank you for making that possible. On the long-term program and mutual commitments and dealing with Dalhousie, etc. I really want to have the opportunity to review all this in detail with you. I suspect we will both survive for a few more months. I will get down to visit you before the end of June of this year. I can't make my dates definite, but it is an undertaking that I will do so. Why don't we leave all that detail until we can sit down and discuss our mutual concerns and work out a program that will really satisfy all your requirements and all of ours.

The other point is that in the meantime, Ann Nelles, who looks after our contracts will send you an interim agreement for the two paperback editions and then we will move on from there. I do agree to the spirit of what you said in your letter. Let's pin down nothing except the royalty on these two editions for the moment and then work out a program that you will be satisfied with and that will meet all the requirements of the market for sometime to come.

On that date or before they must complete the purchase, in which case the option fee will apply as part of the purchase price. Tel-Pro, as you know, is a Canadian firm with a 49% interest in Canadian Famous Players.

Dear Mr Raddall:

We intend to reduce our inventory of In My Time. Because this may not have happened to one of your titles before, we want to explain what is involved. The book trade calls it "overstocking" (selling off overstock). It is not to be confused with remaindering or allowing a title to go out of print. We shall continue to backlist and sell the title. The truth is we have more copies on hand than can be sold in the foreseeable future and because of high warehousing and interest charges, we cannot afford to keep them.

Whether we printed too many copies or sold too few is always a debatable point. We have done our best, but with the expansion of the book chains; the fierce competition for space; price-cutting; and a trade in which every book is sold on a fully returnable basis, it has become almost impossible to make accurate predictions about the sale of any individual book. Hence the overstock.

We want you to have first chance to buy part or all of this stock at the low price suggested. There are only three conditions:

1. Cash must accompany your order (that is what overstocking is about) and books will be shipped on receipt of your cheque.
2. Our price is F.O.B. Toronto. Please add .08¢ per copy for delivery to other parts of Canada.
3. We must have your order by return.

The quantity available is 1,600; the price is \$2.00 per copy. It is the cloth edition. The closing date for receipt of your order is October 1, 1979. A duplicate copy of my letter is enclosed to facilitate your reply, and your shipping instructions.

I remember a discussion we had several years ago about film companies, rights, options, etc. and you made it very clear to me at that time that if you never heard from another film company, it would be too soon. Well, you are not hearing from a film company, but I want to tell you about a call that I had today.

First, I expect that I am not totally certain that the name Norman Campbell will be known to you. He is considered to be probably the top producer-director that the CBC has ever developed. All their major productions - particularly ballet and of a musical nature - tend to be Norman Campbell productions, but his range is far broader than that. He is an extremely talented man and his work is known for sensitivity and quality.

He has a particular interest in THE NYMPH AND THE LAMP. First it is one of his favorite novels. Second he recalls vividly a meeting with you in Halifax 5 or 6 years ago and that has stuck in his mind, but there is still more. He actually, during part of World War II, lived on Sable Island in what he is certain is the same shack that you lived in during World War I. I don't know whether he actually made that connection with you when you met, but he is certain from the description in the novel, that it is actually the same place that he lived in during World War II. In any case, he called to see if

there was any way that he could be involved in the making of such a film.

I told him several things, Tom. First, I said that as far as I knew, the rights were free. Second, I told him that I thought you had no interest in the discouragement of any further options and that if he wanted to do the film, he should put the package together and make a firm offer that was not of an option nature, but that actually provided for the making of the film. He is going to think about that. He says that the difficulty that he really faces is of a two-fold nature. First, he sees a technical problem with the novel for film purposes relating to the trick of showing the developing blindness on the screen (that's a brief way of describing a complex technical problem I guess), but also he points out that in order to put all the financing in place, they need a film play or script and that they have to get money up front for that and to get a first-class writer is very costly. Well, those are his problems.

We left the matter that he would think about it and I would think about it and we would see if any thought emerged. Although I haven't told him that I am writing to you, I thought I would to see if you had any thoughts on the matter. Are the rights free? Could you bear the thought of going through all this again? About the only things I can say in favour of it are first, I have infinite faith in Norman Campbell and two, I think it would make a beautiful film. No urgency about it. When you have a moment, drop me a line and let me know what you think.

I had hoped to get down your way this summer or fall. Once again I didn't manage it, but I will not put it off much longer, I promise you. I have heard reports from a number of people that you are feeling much better and much more mobile which is all very good. Do let me know that all goes well with you. My very warm regards.

I remember a conversation with Norman Campbell about the movie rights several years back. The rights were then under option to a Hollywood scoundrel, and I didn't get them out of his slimy fingers until about two years ago.

They are now under option to Michael Burns, of Bartalk Productions, and Paragon Motion Pictures, Suite 302, 557 Church Street, Toronto, who has Hollywood connections. This time I had one of the best lawyers in Canada (Frank Covert, a friend of mine and a power in the land according to Newman of Maclean's) to conduct the negotiations and set the terms. Bartalk Productions has paid me \$15,000 for a two-year option ending in December 1980. This will apply as part of the purchase price if they do take up the option.

They hope to start filming on Sable Island next summer, in which case the the whole price must be paid, half in 1981, half in 1982. Last Fall, Burns brought a Canadian actress named Helen Shaver down here to meet me. She has had plenty of experience in Canadian and U.S. films, got an Acetra (?) Award for her part in "In Praise of Older Women", etc. She talked intelligently about my novel and her proposed part as "Isabel", the chief figure in my story, although I told her frankly that she wasn't the sort of person I envisioned when I wrote the book.

Since signing the option contract with Bartalk early this year I've had various approaches from Toronto and California. The most insistent came from a man who claimed to be agent for Robert Redford, declaring that Redford wanted to buy all the rights, or failing that a substantial part of them. I told him what I tell them all, that the rights are under option until the end of 1980. If Bartalk fail to take up the option, I shall not renew on any terms, and they are out \$15,000.

I'm still going strong. Give me a shout if you're down this way.

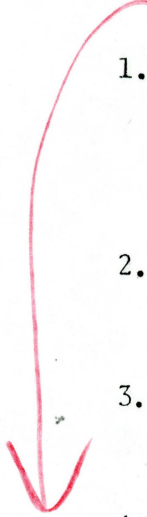

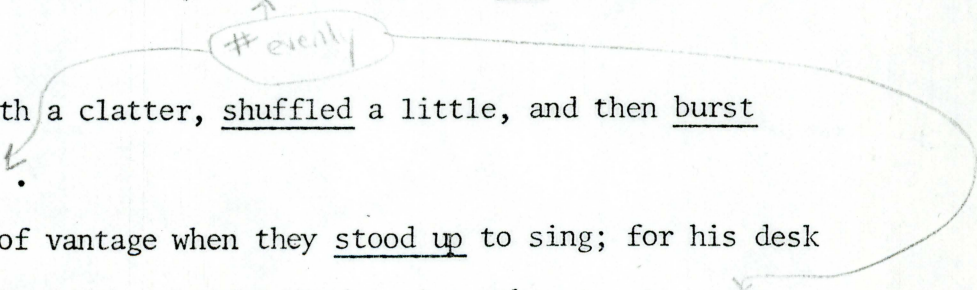
