My Dear Brother

This is Sunday and a very nice one Sun shining
everything looking in Best I just finished my Dinner had a
little Cabbage to day for a change and a small piece of bread
roasted quite a treat believe me wish that I could run in & come
to dinner I think that I could eat my share with the Rest I
tried to get a couple pieces of plain & Chocolate Candy to eat
while waiting this letter to you but failed to do so, I think that
I shall go to some Church this evening for the first time I
am here I have been to two anti door services while at Frenchman
Park and that is all so I think it about time for me to be
doing something don't you think I spent all the morning at my
Equipment getting it to clean for next week they are very particular
about keeping it clean if you just have the least spot on any part
of the fittings well that is a crime at once no excuses over here
I have escaped so far without getting a blame but we never
know just how soon something is going to turn up and put a
fellow in wrong and once you begin bad that puts a finish
to everything they get right after you it is terrible monotonous
just cleaning steady right after right just as soon as you
come of Parades start in at once just time enough to eat and that
is all I haven't been out one evening all this week that is
to go to any little town and there is plenty around here I hear that
there is a large bunch coming from Canada this week I want
try and get down to see them it is about five miles from here and
that means a couple of hours. lose there plenty of bars here

but that means money lasts about 30^c for five miles over
here they have large motor Cars something like an Etienne Car.
but not quite so large they carry about twenty Passengers.
Well I wrote to Mother last week but I expect that you will
get both letters together as our mail only goes about twice every
week. I suppose that you have the Hay all sold by this time
suppose it was gone this season as it looked goodly this Spring
when we were out Home. I wish that we could go to work at
the House this summer again and do some more churning
really that was my happiest days for the last three years
when we were Home last summer just seemed like old times
to be working together again but Lloyd & I am in hopes that
we will be working together in the very near future something seems
to tell me that every thing is looking pretty fair over here just
now in fact this last two months I think that this war is pretty
nearly at a close the French and Americans are certainly
doing great work driving them back. all the time it will be
some happy day when this thing does end I can picture my
self sailing back to dear old Canada once again do you
ever see Billie Cleveland now I suppose that he is fatter than ever
I have met several fellows over here that know him we have
an officer in my Regt that used to be quartermaster sergeant in
his Regt 64 his name is Guy. an old name sake of mine he
belongs to the Califa fine fellow about the best that we have
in ~~our~~ our lot I can tell you we have some pretty dusty bad
all old soldiers and fit for nothing else I wish that

could see them as Parads it makes me sick to watch
them flying around from one place to another like a
hen looking for a nest. We have had several long marches
since we are here and terrible warm marching with a heavy
pack about seventy pounds Rifle and every thing them steel
Helmets are something terrible to make your head sweat
& almost roasted to death the first march that we had.
but of course they are like every thing else you used to them we
marched about ten miles last time and about twenty minutes
rest now I hope I did not have you to day and I think that
I shall take a trip to the old Wash place have a good wash
and wash before supper then go to church spend an hour come
back and say Brass over for the evening have every thing in
readiness that is the only way here would like to have a
good dish of Blue Berries to day with a little good milk or
even a good piece of salt being we go to school to add
there once in every blue noon for us and write after
I hope and tell me every bit of news that you can think
of as every little thing from home is interesting give my
love to all remember me to me & Gabe will say day day
for this time I am ever loving Brother Weldon
