ACADEMIC HONOURS

Faculty of Management

Distinction is bestowed upon students who excel academically in the regular four-year programme. A minimum average of A- is required to graduate with distinction.

Honours is bestowed upon students in the four-year honours programme who obtain a minimum of B- average in all classes beyond first year and obtain B- or better in the designated honours seminar. **First Class Honours** is bestowed on those who obtain a minimum overall average of A- as well as an A- average in the core areas of Commerce, Economics, and Mathematics.

Faculty of Health Professions

Distinction is bestowed upon students graduating with a grade point average of 3.70 or better.

Kinesiology

Honours is bestowed on students who obtain a minimum grade point average of 3.00 on classes taken in the final three years.

School of Occupational Therapy

Honours is bestowed on those who obtain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00 and have no grade in an advanced class less than B-

First Class Honours is bestowed on those who obtain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.70 and have no grade in an advanced class less than B. In addition, in both Honours and First Class Honours, a grade of A is required in Occupational Therapy 4421, Independent Study and Advanced Clinical Practice.

Thelma McCormack

Dr. Thelma Doris McCormack was born in Rochester, New York. She describes her upbringing as very middle class. Her mother, Libby, described golf as her religion; her father, Jules, ran the family's men's clothing store and had a passion for politics.

Dr. McCormack earned her bachelor of arts degree at the University of Wisconsin in 1942, and went on to do graduate studies in sociology at Columbia University. She came to Canada as a result of her marriage to Canadian, Robert McCormack. The couple became a family with the arrival of twin daughters, Judith, now a labor lawyer, and Naomi, now a filmmaker.

Dr. McCormack has contributed to the disciplines of sociology and women's studies as a scholar, an innovator of curricula and as a mentor of students and colleagues. For more than 40 years her contributions to sociology in the areas of popular culture, censorship and reproductive technologies have broken new ground.

Her work in women's studies is equally distinguished. She was instrumental in developing the Women's Studies Department and Institute at York University, including the first PhD program in women's studies in North America. Directly or indirectly, she has influenced virtually all female scholars in sociology and women's studies in their academic development.

Dr. McCormack participated directly in the development of women's studies in the Maritimes. In 1985-86, she held the Nancy Rowell Jackman Chair in Womens' Studies at Mount St. Vincent University. This was a critical time for Women's Studies at Dalhousie, which was launching its bachelor's program. With Dr. McCormack's encouragement, Dalhousie, in collaboration with St. Mary's University and the Mount, began planning an inter-university MA in Women's Studies. The program's first graduate was granted her MA last fall.

Dr. McCormack has also made a substantial contribution to the women's community outside academia. She has a unique ability to translate theory into practice, and is an engaging and entertaining speaker.

In 1989 she received an honorary degree from Mount Saint Vincent University, and in 1992 the Canadian Sociology and Anthropology Association formally recognized her contributions to the discipline with its Distinguished Contribution Award. In 1993, she was awarded the YWCA's Women of Distinction Award for her work in the women's community in Toronto.

Dr. McCormack remains active as a research associate with York University's Institute for Social Research and as professor emerita with York's Department of Sociology.

For her career which exemplifies the ideal of the scholarly academic who has made outstanding contributions not only to her profession and to the university community, but also to the sphere of public debate on issues of great social importance, I ask you, Mr. Chancellor, in the name of Senate, to bestow upon Thelma Doris McCormack the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

Arthur Maxwell House

Arthur Maxwell House was born in Glovertown, Newfoundland, to parents who believed that self-education should never cease. He studied at Memorial University College in St. John's, and then came to Dalhousie University in 1948 to study medicine. After graduation he started a general practice in Baie Verte. This experience in an isolated area influenced the rest of his career. He trained at the Montreal Neurological Institute, receiving his certification in Neurology in 1959. He then returned to private practice in Newfoundland and was active in the development of neurological services in the province.

Dr. House played a significant role in the development of the Faculty of Medicine at Memorial University and held several appointments, including Director of Continuing Medical Education, from 1968 to 1987, after which, as Associate Dean, he was responsible for the programme until 1995. He was appointed Clinical Professor of Medicine (Neurology) in 1968 and Professor in 1973 holding that position until 1995. Some of the success of St. John's Health Sciences Centre, which opened in 1973, was due to Dr. House's liaison between the Memorial Medical School, the affiliated hospitals, and the Newfoundland Medical Association. He served as Interim President of Seabright, Memorial's technologytransfer company. As an advisor to the President of Memorial University, he established autonomous corporations for the Botanical Gardens and the Art Gallery.

In the late 1960's, Dr. House searched for ways to do remote medical consultations, transmit diagnostic information, and deliver education courses using new technologies. This led to his greatest achievements in medicine and communication. Over a period of three decades, Dr. House developed the Telemedicine Program at Memorial University which is recognised around the world. This network is also used for the delivery of advanced high school and university courses in the province. He shares his expertise with many international projects particularly in Africa, the Caribbean, and through the provision of telemedicine services for offshore oil exploration platforms. Dr. House has been invited to present papers on his work in more than 35 countries. His influence extends to the final frontier, as witnessed by his participation in four United Nations' space meetings and his visiting appointment at the International Space University of Barcelona in 1994. Dr. House's work has been recognised with the Award for Communications at Expo '86, Atlantic Innovator of the Year in 1990, the Canadian Medical Association Medal of Service in 1997, and this year the James H. Graham Award of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. He became a Member of the Order of Canada in 1989.

In 1997, Dr. House was appointed Lieutenant Governor of Newfoundland and Labrador and continues his interest in information technology, literacy, child poverty and the development of the province's wonderfully vibrant culture. He serves with diligence and concern for the people of his province.

For his leadership in Telemedicine, for his commitment to life-long education, and for his service to his province, I ask you, Mr. Chancellor, in the name of Senate, to bestow upon Arthur Maxwell House the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY COAT OF ARMS

The Dalhousie University Coat of Arms, which you see hanging at the back of the stage, is based on the arms of the ninth Earl of Dalhousie. The Rt. Hon. George Ramsay, Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia, founded the University in 1818. The arms consists of five separate and distinct parts: the shield, the coronet, the crest, the supporters, and the motto. The "Coat of Arms" is the shield; the "Heraldic Achievement" is the overall combination of the shield, supporters and motto.

Dalhousie's Achievement is described as follows:

On a gold shield, a black eagle with wings and legs outstretched; beak and claws red.
Above the shield is an earl's coronet.
On top of the coronet is a blue unicorn's head, cut off at the neck, with its mane and horn gold.
Supporters - Two dragons.
Motto - Pray and work.

The achievement used by the University is different from the Earl's in three ways. First, through marriage one of the supporters on the Earl's achievement has been changed to a greyhound. Secondly, due to a misunderstanding of heraldic terms the supporters were mistakenly changed from the original griffins to dragons. The third change occurred in 1950 when the Board of Governors changed the colour of the shield from white (silver) to gold to reflect the University's colours of black and gold.

DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY MACE

The Dalhousie University Mace will be carried into the auditorium by the Beadle, Eric McKee, Vice-President, Student Services, who leads the academic procession. The Mace was first carried in academic procession in May 1950.

The Mace was designed by R.L. deC. H. Saunders, a Professor of Anatomy, and carved by A.H. MacMillan of Halifax. It is made of oak, enriched with silver and enamel, and measures 1.4 metres in length.

The lower end of the mace is adorned with silver fish in recognition of one of our most important natural resources. Above this is a circular scene of a sea nymph calling across the waves towards the setting sun in representation of the impulse that led navigators to our shores. The roots put down by early settlers and the tall trees that first met their gaze are reflected in a pattern extending the entire length of the shaft.

The head of the mace bears a maple leaf. Set above the leaf is a carved circle of mayflowers, which symbolizes both the province and the flowering of a new civilization in the province which led to the establishment of the University. Four robed medieval scholars facing the main compass points represent the university faculties of 1950: Arts and Science, Dentistry, Law and Medicine. Each figure bears a silver enamelled shield with either the arms of the University or the Province of Nova Scotia. Alternating with these figures are the rose, thistle, fleur-de-lys and shamrock, depicting the home countries of the first European immigrants to the province.

The top of the mace head bears a five-rayed Scottish earl's coronet in recognition of the University's founder, the ninth Earl of Dalhousie. This part of the mace incorporates oak that came from the Earl's estate and was presented to Dalhousie University. Gracing the cap of the coronet, set above all, is a silver Celtic cross surrounded by the University motto "Ora et Labora" (pray and work). This cross was chosen as befitting a non-denominational institution with Scottish heritage.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

Graduates of the University are entitled to wear gowns and hoods of black material. The distinctive part of the costume is the lining of the hood, which for the various degrees is as follows:
