

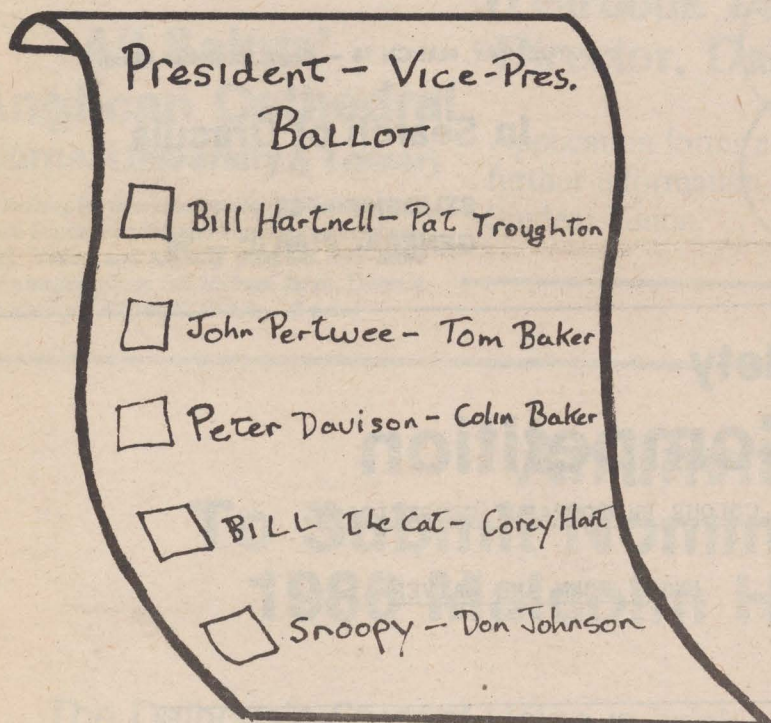

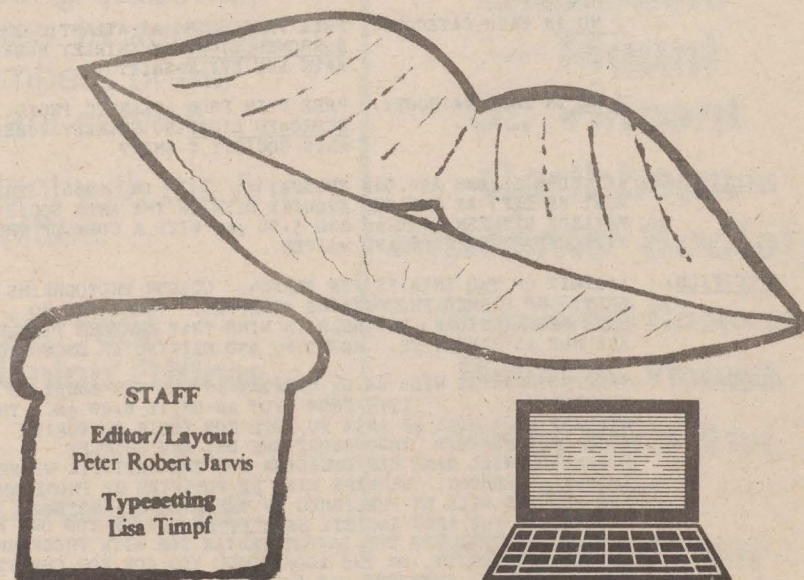

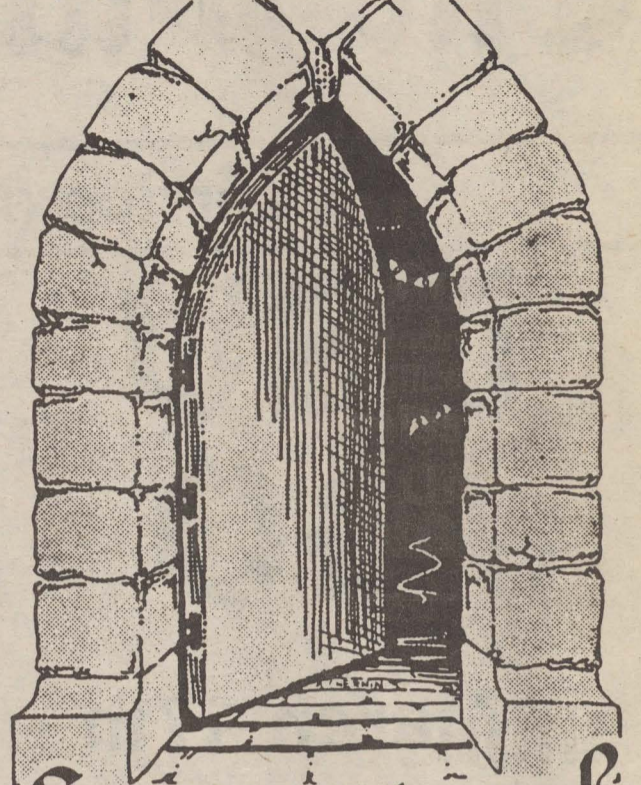

### Hagood Hardy — More Than a Homecoming

On Saturday, April 5 at 8:00 p.m. Hagood Hardy makes a return visit to The COHN. Joining him will be his quintet — five of the strongest musicians in the country.

For those familiar with Hagood Hardy, it will be no surprise to hear a repertoire that includes a lot more than his blockbuster hit 'The Homecoming'. It will be an evening with a mix of old standards, jazz, mood music, a touch of the avant-garde and of course a sampling of some of this newest compositions.

Hagood Hardy is a composer, musical jingle writer, and concert performer of top international status. He has a most impressive list of credits. That list includes ten albums, three gold, one platinum, one double platinum. Then there is the Billboard Magazine Award for Instrumentalist of the Year, three Juno awards, and the William Harold Moon Award for greatest contribution to the International recognition of Canadian music. But it doesn't stop there. He has scored more than 50 feature and television films including, most recently, the very successful "Anne of Green Gables".

From his early years as a percussionist and vibraphonist to his current standing as a writer, arranger and performer, Hagood Hardy has been surrounded by a large and loyal audience. He has a gift for creating rich melodies and emotionally charged arrangements that people love to hear. However, it's Hagood Hardy's personal warmth and his ability to reach out to every member of his audience that has brought him continued popularity.

### Mary Travers

Mary Travers will be bringing folk music to The COHN when she appears on stage on Wednesday, March 26th at 8:00 p.m.

Mary Travers was a member of Peter, Paul and Mary, the top folk act of the early 60's. Mary's name is synonymous with the early stirrings of the protest movement and on her own she reinforces the feel that we remember from the trio.

Since the breakup of that popular folk institution of the 60's, Mary has remained an eternal optimist. In the last few years there is a new maturity especially since her involvement with Vini Poncia (who made Melissa Manchester, Leo Sayer and Ringo Starr) who broke Mary from earlier folk roots. Through her music she shares her world view, her growth and most importantly her hopes for the future.

Her musical repertoire includes songs by contemporary song writers as a significant feature of her solo concert. Throughout her musical career Mary Travers has carried a deep commitment to social issues. Mary Travers continues to perform in concert halls, clubs, and with symphonies. She has five solo albums to her credit. She writes and stars in a BBC series and hosts a weekly radio interview show.

Those who remember Mary Travers as the lithe, willowy, blond and silent member of Peter, Paul and Mary will be pleasantly surprised by her power as a solo performer.
