We are currently preparing for publication a textbook for Canadian literature courses at the college level entitled THE EVOLUTION OF CANADIAN LITERATURE 1914-1945 edited by Paul Denham and George Parker. This is one volume of a three volume series whose General Editor is Mary Jane Edwards. The book will contain approximately 90 poetry and prose selections written from 1914-1945. Our expected date of publication is early September, 1972. The size of the first printing of this 350 page softbound book is 5,000 copies, selling for a proposed price of \$5.50 each.

We wish your permission to include the enclosed copy of "Winter Tale" by Thomas H. Raddall from The Pied Piper of Dipper Creek and Other Tales by Thomas H. Raddall, 1943. In order to include this material in our book we require one-edition world distribution rights in the English language. We have already obtained Canadian and United States rights from McClelland and Stewart Limited in Toronto. They indicated that we would have to obtain British Commonwealth rights from you. We are also seeking in advance permission to assign braille, large-print and sound-recording rights to our book. This is done on a strictly non-profit basis to help the visually handicapped and only if we are requested to do so by The Canadian National Institute for the Blind.

If you are willing to grant us the necessary permission, please state any costs involved and the exact credit line you desire.

Thank you for your time and attention to this request. It is appreciated. We look forward to hearing from you.

For the past few years some of the intermediate history teachers in this county have been using the -

Raddall, Thomas, H. At the Tides Turn and Other Stories, Toronto, McClelland and Stewart, 1959 (1971, New Canadian Library).

In particular they have used "Pax Britannica" pg. 1-17 as a source for a decision making component of the course. Until now there has not been a resource document to accompany the Intermediate History Curriculum. After field testing and acceptance "Pax Britannica" serves best for this decision making module. Although teachers are not compelled to use the resources suggested in the resource document, we would like permission to reprint "Pax Britannica", 75 copies, for inclusion in the resource document and permission for a teacher who may choose to use "Pax Britannica" to reprint a class set should she/he wish the class to read it individually. Some schools have class sets of At the Tide's Turn... now and would not require reproduction permission.

If permission were to be granted, it would be with the obligatory permission statement but also with the caution that this only apply to this Board of Education should another Board happen to obtain the curriculum while developing their own curriculum.

We would be happy to oblige re any specifics you set and, of course, answer any specifics you may need for further clarification.
