Subject: World Commission on the Oceans

My dear Ronald,

As I mentioned on the phone, I would be most grateful if you could help us in our effort to have Canada play a major role in the Independent World Commission for the Oceans. With the Oceans Act on the table of Parliament, and following up on Minister Tobin's Halifax speech, this would be most timely.

Let me bring you first up to date with regard to the present status of this project:

I am about to leave for Lisbon for a meeting with the Vice Chairmen and President Soares on June 29-30. This meeting should be followed by a press conference with the official announcement of the establishment of the Commission.

We have, at present, 5 Vice Chairmen:

Africa: Layashi Yaker Asia: Yoshio Suzuki (Nomura Research Institute) Europe: Guido de Marco Latin America: Minister Castro (Science and Technology) North America: Myself

The Commission will have 30 members, a number of "Honourary Members" including Heads of State and "Eminent Persons," associated from time to time. The list will be more or less finalised in Lisbon this week. I am attaching a first preliminary list

The terms of reference of the Commission are in the brief founding document which you already have, but which I am attaching for your convenience.

We have raised already over one million dollars, which should take us well into the second year of our operations. In the meantime, of course, we shall raise more.

Global hearings (the first ever, on the oceans) are scheduled over the next six months. The Government of China (SOA) already held its hearings, quite successfully, last months. I am responsible for the hearings here in Canada. CIDA (Policy Branch, Lenn Hinds, has promised \$30,000 for this purpose, but yet to be confirmed). I am planning to cooperate with the IDRC oceans network in organising these hearings. I think the Government of Canada will greatly benefit from these hearings which will help to "flesh out" the Oceans Act.

The first Plenary Session of the Commission will take place in Tokyo, at the UNU, on September 5-9.

We have, thus far, three invitations for the Plenary Sessions. The first, in Tokyo; the second, in Rotterdam, the third, in Monaco.

I would like to insert Canada between Rotterdam and Monaco. This would mean, Summer or Autumn (probably Summer) 1996.

All the host countries bear the full cost of the Session which, in Canada, roughly figures, would be in the order of \$200,000.

We would like to associate the Prime Minister with the Commission as Honourary. Member, if you think this appropriate. The Minister of Foreign Affairs, or Minister Tobin could be in charge of the Canada (Ottawa? Halifax? Vancouver?) session as Eminent Person.

Whatever you can do to advance this scenario will be most fervently appreciated!

It has taken longer than anticipated, but, at last, we are there.

We had a good meeting with President Soares of Portugal, on June 29- July 1, and our World Commission is on course. He has finally and officially accepted to be the Chairman of the Commission. We have five Vice Chairmen:

Africa: Layashi Yaker, Algeria Asia: Yoshio Suzuki, Japan Europe: Guido de Marco, Malta Latin America: Jose Vargas, Brazil North America: myself, Canada.

The Chairman and the Vice Chairmen form the Executive Committee.

We will also discuss a list of background papers to be commissioned as well as plans for global and regional hearings. You will receive draft documents in the near future. It will be a very busy session.

You will receive an official invitation from President Soares in the near future. We would be grateful if you could make your own travel arrangements. Your air fare (business class) will be refunded in Tokyo.

Fund raising is well in hand. We have already raised well over a million dollars

It is a great relief that everything is on course now. This Commission is a great challenge and offers a formidable opportunity for a unique kind of contribution to the making of a genuinely new order for the next century.

You should have received these days an official invitation from President Mario Soares of Portugal, the Chairman of our newly established Independent World Commission on the Oceans, inviting you to join the Commission and to participate in our first Plenary Session, on September 6, 7, and 8, at the United Nations University in Tokyo.

I am attaching today (a) a provisional agenda; and (b) some information on logistics which has been issued by the local organiser, INTERCOM. I hope that everything is clear.

You will note that you kindly should make your own travel arrangements, and that the air fare (business class) will be refunded in cash in Tokyo. You will also note that your expenses at the Westin Hotel in Tokyo are fully covered. However, if you prefer another hotel, you would be responsible for the difference in price between the Westin (23,000 Yen) and the Hotel of your choice. This first session of the Commission is of fundamental importance for the orientation and organisation of our work, and I am convinced that this Commission has a unique opportunity to offer a "vision" and make a long-term contribution to the making of a somewhat better world. But what we do today is decisive for the chances of realising the long-term vision. Ocean policy is being made this year and next year, and we are in an exceptionally good position to influence it.
