They Decided to Steal Books

THE Grant Memorial Christian Bookshop was opened last year in the Union Theological Seminary, Indore, India. It is the first venture of its kind in the area. Sales of books and other Christian literature so far have been good.

The power of the printed word is illustrated in a story told by a young medical missionary. Five years ago an ardent Moslem priest stepped into a Christian bookstore in Allahabad with some other Moslems to get out of the heat. They soon realized that people were being converted to Christianity through the witness of this shop. They decided to steal books from it gradually, hoping in the end to force it close. The young priest stole a large Bible Commentary. That night he started to read it and couldn't put it down. This was the beginning of events that led to his conversion. His wife's family took away his wife and child, but two years later, with his wife's consent, he kidnapped them and brought them home again. Later his wife also became a Christian. To-day the young man is studying for the Christian ministry.
