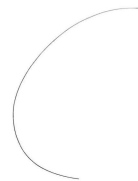

First Class Honours is bestowed upon students who obtain a minimum of A- in those classes.

UNIVERSITY GRADUATION PRIZES

The Avery Prize is awarded to the student standing highest among those graduating from the general degree programme.

The University Silver Medal is awarded to the student who is judged to be the leading First Class Honours graduate in either the arts/commerce or the sciences in whichever field the Governor-General's Silver Medal was not awarded.

The Governor-General's Silver Medal is awarded to the undergraduate student who has achieved the highest academic standing among first class honours graduates of baccalaureate programmes.

Roderick Jackson MacLennan

A loyal Nova Scotian, Roderick Jackson MacLennan proves that a university science education provides an excellent background for many different pursuits. A quiet voice of reason, whose opinions are widely sought, he has contributed significantly to Nova Scotia and his alma mater.

Roderick Jackson MacLennan came to Dalhousie University from his hometown of Truro and completed a B.Sc. in Chemistry in 1960. He played on the volleyball and curling teams, wrote a sports column for the Gazette, and served on the committee which initiated the Student Union Building. Mr. MacLennan attended the Amos Tuck School of Business Administration of Dartmouth College in New Hampshire and obtained an MBA in 1962.

He brought his new knowledge home, joined the Brookfield group of companies and eventually negotiated the merger with the Scotsburn Dairy Group. At the time of his retirement Mr. MacLennan was Senior Vice-President of this multi-plant business with 625 employees. He also served in many professional associations at provincial and national levels. In 1981, he was a member of the Green Industrial Inquiry Commission which ended a five-week strike at thirty-two hospitals in the province.

Mr. MacLennan maintains a keen interest in post-secondary education. As Chair of the Nova Scotia Royal Commission on Post-secondary Education, Roderick MacLennan had a profound effect on university education in Nova Scotia; the Commission's comprehensive report was published in 1985 and resulted in the formation of the Nova Scotia Council on Higher Education .

He has quietly and effectively supported Dalhousie University over the years. Most recently he was Chair of the 1818 Society from 1995 to 1997. Although nominally retired, he continues his public service as a member of the newly formed Canadian Blood Services organization. He serves on the boards of Braxo Limited, Crossley Carpet Mills, Stanfields Ltd., and Tribune Holdings Limited.

Mr. MacLennan shows leadership in all his activities. In the late 1970's he established the Charles and Mary MacLennan Foundation which has added to the vibrancy of the performing arts of northern Nova Scotia and Cape Breton. Very active in Scouting, he was awarded the Silver Acorn by Scouts Canada. His interest in philately has resulted in a Fellowship of the Royal Philatelic Society in London. He has received the Canada Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of Confederation, the 100+ Blood Donor Award of the Canadian Red Cross, and the Paul Harris Fellowship of Rotary International. Mr. MacLennan also has a keen interest in history and visual art.

For his generous service to Dalhousie University, his exemplary leadership in education policy, and his plentiful contributions to Nova Scotia, I ask you, Mr. Chancellor, in the name of Senate, to bestow upon Roderick Jackson MacLennan the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

CITATION

David Hunter Hubel

Born in Windsor, Ontario, of American parents, David Hunter Hubel grew up in Montreal, Québec, where, along with his scholastic work, he learned to play the piano and make explosives. He graduated from McGill University, in 1947, with a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics and Physics. More or less on a whim he applied to medical school, was accepted, and received an M.D. degree in 1951. Dr. Hubel interned at the Montreal General Hospital and then spent two years of residency in Neurology and Clinical Neurophysiology at the Montreal Neurological Institute. His last year of residency was spent at the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, making him eligible for the doctors' draft. He joined the U.S. Army and spent three years at the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research where as Captain Hubel, he began his research on central-nervous mechanisms of vision. In 1958 he began to collaborate with Torsten Wiesel, first at the John Hopkins Hospital and then at the Harvard Medical School. Dr. Hubel rose quickly through the academic ranks at Harvard University becoming a Professor in Neurophysiology in 1965. In 1971 he was made a Senior Fellow of the Harvard Society of Fellows and he has held several named professorships. Dr. Hubel is now the John Enders University Professor of Neurobiology.

His exemplary work has been done in collaboration with Torsten Wiesel, from 1958 to 1982, and, since then, with Margaret Livingstone. Their interest has been in learning how the brain handles the information it receives from the eyes, and in learning about the ways in which the circuits for vision can be modified after birth by visual experience. This work has led to a means of preventing one of the most common forms of human blindness. In 1981, Dr. Hubel shared the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine with Dr. Wiesel and Dr. Roger Sperry.

Dr. Hubel has received eight honorary degrees and dozens of prestigious awards, including the Lewis S. Rosenstiel Award from Brandeis University, the Paul Kayser International Award of Merit for Retina Research, the Outstanding Scientific Leadership Award of the National Association for Biomedical Research, the Gerard Award of the Society of Neuroscience, and the Helen Keller Prize of the Helen Keller Eye Research Foundation. He holds memberships in professional societies in North America and Europe and continues an active and productive research program at Harvard, where he staunchly defends the funding of basic research. He still plays the piano and is a licensed ham-radio operator.

For his genius, applied to the mechanisms of vision, and for his incalculable contributions to the development of vision research, I ask you, Mr. Chancellor, in the name of Senate, to bestow upon David Hunter Hubel the degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

CITATION

Janet Conners

The Honourary Doctorate is customarily awarded in recognition of a particular accomplishment or a career of distinction: scholarly achievements, service to the community or support for the aims of university education and the goals of society. Janet Conners is indeed recognized today for her accomplishments and achievements, but perhaps more essentially for those qualities that enabled her to achieve so much against daunting odds: qualities of courage, tenacity, compassion and integrity. This honorary degree is also awarded in recognition of her husband, Randy Conners, her family and all those who shared her pain and worked with her to seek justice, not only for recipients of tainted blood but for all those suffering from AIDS. In the process Janet and Randy Conners and their community of supporters have had an enduring impact on the health care and justice systems of Canada.

Janet was born in Vancouver. When she was eleven her family moved to Yellowknife in the North West Territories where she graduated from Sir John Franklin High School in 1974. She worked for Lands and Forests in Nelson, B.C. until 1980 when she moved with her son, Gus, to Nova Scotia. From 1980 to 1988 she worked as a Lab Assistant and Administrative Assistant at the Victoria General Hospital in Halifax, during which time she also graduated in Computer Programming and Systems Analysis from the Atlantic Institute.

In 1987 she married Randy Conners. Shortly thereafter they discovered that Randy, a hemophiliac, had contracted HIV through a blood transfusion, and Janet was also diagnosed with HIV in 1989. As Janet has said, they came to recognize that they had a common cause not only with others who had received tainted blood but also with all those suffering from AIDS. In 1992, they became involved with the Nova Scotia Persons with AIDS Coalition and the Nova Scotia Women and AIDS Project.

In December 1992 Janet and Randy Conners held a news conference calling for an inquiry into Canada's blood supply system and compensation for those who had contracted HIV as a result of the defects of the system. In the following year Nova Scotia became the first province to provide such compensation and the Krever Inquiry was established to investigate the blood distribution system in Canada.

Randy Conners died in 1994. Since that time Janet Conners has continued to be among the most prominent advocates of reform of the blood supply system and for the rights of all those suffering from AIDS. She is a member of the Maritime HIV Positive Women's Network, Vice Chair of the AIDS Coalition of Nova Scotia, and the Atlantic representative of the Canadian AIDS Society. In 1995 she represented HIV-infected spouses and children at the Krever Inquiry, and in 1996 she spoke at the International Conference on AIDS. In 1995 she received the Stonewall Community Award in recognition of her work on behalf of gay and lesbian rights. In 1997 she received Honorary degrees from Mount Saint Vincent University and Acadia University.

As we know from recent developments, the goals to which Janet Connors has devoted her life since 1989 are yet to be completely realized. But she has provided for all Canadians a model of bravery, resiliency and strength of character. When Randy Connors died, she said "he proved that an ordinary man can accomplish the extraordinary." The same can be said of Janet Connors.

On behalf of the Dalhousie University community, I ask you, Mr. Chancellor, in the name of Senate, to bestow upon Janet Connors the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*.

DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY COAT OF ARMS

The Dalhousie University Coat of Arms, which you see hanging at the back of the stage, is based on the arms of the ninth Earl of Dalhousie. The Rt. Hon. George Ramsay, Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia, founded the University in 1818. The arms consists of five separate and distinct parts: the shield, the coronet, the crest, the supporters, and the motto. The "Coat of Arms" is the shield; the "Heraldic Achievement" is the overall combination of the shield, supporters and motto.

Dalhousie's Achievement is described as follows:

On a gold shield, a black eagle with wings and legs outstretched; beak and claws red.

Above the shield is an earl's coronet.

On top of the coronet is a blue unicorn's head, cut off at the neck, with its mane and horn gold.

Supporters - Two dragons.

Motto - Pray and work.

The achievement used by the University is different from the Earl's in three ways. First, through marriage one of the supporters on the Earl's achievement has been changed to a greyhound. Secondly, due to a misunderstanding of heraldic terms the supporters were mistakenly changed from the original griffins to dragons. The third change occurred in 1950 when the Board of Governors changed the colour of the shield from white (silver) to gold to reflect the University's colours of black and gold.

DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY MACE

The Dalhousie University Mace will be carried into the auditorium by the Bedel, Eric McKee, Vice-President, Student Services, who leads the academic procession. The Mace was first carried in academic procession in May 1950.

The Mace was designed by R.L. deC. H. Saunders, a Professor of Anatomy, and carved by A.H. MacMillan of Halifax. It is made of oak, enriched with silver and enamel, and measures 1.4 metres in length.

The lower end of the mace is adorned with silver fish in recognition of one of our most important natural resources. Above this is a circular scene of a sea nymph calling across the waves towards the setting sun in representation of the impulse that led navigators to our shores. The roots put down by early settlers and the tall trees that first met their gaze are reflected in a pattern extending the entire length of the shaft.

The head of the mace bears a maple leaf. Set above the leaf is a carved circle of mayflowers, which symbolizes both the province and the flowering of a new civilization in the province which led to the establishment of the University. Four robed medieval scholars facing the main compass points represent the university faculties of 1950: Arts and Science, Dentistry, Law and Medicine. Each figure bears a silver enamelled shield with either the arms of the University or the Province of Nova Scotia. Alternating with these figures are the rose, thistle, fleur-de-lys and shamrock, depicting the home countries of the first European immigrants to the province.

The top of the mace head bears a five-rayed Scottish earl's coronet in recognition of the University's founder, the ninth Earl of Dalhousie. This part of the mace incorporates oak that came from the Earl's estate and was presented to Dalhousie University. Gracing the cap of the coronet, set above all, is a silver Celtic cross surrounded by the University motto "Ora et Labora" (pray and work). This cross was chosen as befitting a non-denominational institution with Scottish heritage.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

Graduates of the University are entitled to wear gowns and hoods of black material. The distinctive part of the costume is the lining of the hood, which for the various degrees is as follows:
