heavily all day Well this is my first Sunday
in this camp & should say in England
as we did not get in Port until last
Sunday Well I like ^{it} very well I think it is
a very pretty place & saw one part of
London as we came through on the
train & tell ^{you} what but it is some place
plenty of flowers over here and the prettiest
kind the air has a sweet perfume all
the time it does not seem very much
like old N & that is in regards to

looks of course there is plenty of difference
in other ways such as Cakes and like
that there is an old woman comes
around our Camp every morning selling
sweet cakes they are very good made
with molasses there is no white bread
at all even ^{the} few cakes we get are
made out of dark flour just looks
like Polard of course it has a very good
taste & just finished getting supper
and I am thinking about the good
tea that you will be having at
home wish that I could walk
in and have a bit by self that is

the way that the times say it give
 me a bit of your Blooming cake?
 Wish that you could hear them talk
 it makes me laugh some times
 Wish that I could see Florence B
 I bet that I would have her jumping
 in ten minutes if you see her some
 time please remember me to her and
 George dear well I suppose Yertude you
 are a free rigger by this time no
 school untill august I expect to see
 you in some affire when I come back
 do your best sister you will only
 find the benefit of a good Education
 when you get are amongst strangers
 I wish that I had known but it is
 to late now for me to think of such

a thing it is terrible lonesome here to
 day we are not allowed any mail
 we are here twenty eight days in
 case some disease should break out
 that is the way they do with all
 Canadian Troops get be sure and
 write often nice long letters as there is
 nothing like lots of news from home
 Charley is the same dear little Black
 fellow as ever (ha ha). I think that he
 is going to write to you later he says
 that he would rather be in 6 ft. than
 here well I guess there are lot others
 like him we get plenty physical training
 over two hours per day 8 hours.
 altogether some going I like the
 drill fine o say we had to have our
 train last night with the blippers all
 over our heads well we are a funny



looking much especially whenever
 all get on board with an hour off
 of course there is nobody to see us.
 We get up at five thirty every morning
 go to sleep ten or so and we have
 plenty sleep how is Miss Studley
 have you been talking to her lately
 I think that I shall write her one
 of those five days how is Lloyd
 and Miss Bennett getting along?
 believe that he will see me aw
 yet dont you think you keep your
 eye on him for both of us and I will

bring you a little Line when I
come back how is Maynard and
Mazoni all the little kiddies how
is Miss terrible dirty is he as bad as
ever I would like to see you all to
night but it is too late thinking about
now be a good girl get Amitt I
come back and then we will all be
happy and Moore be good to Mother
good night I am ever loving Brother
give my love to all xx Weldon
