Dear Mr. Raddall:

In reply to your recent inquiry, the following information has been obtained from our records.

Mrs. Sarah Croker, 203 Barrington Street, Halifax, N. S., drowned at Black Rock, Halifax, on June 3, 1936, and buried in Camp Hill Cemetery on June 8, 1936. Her age at time of death was 64 years. The location of her grave is known as Division 2, Section M, 82 feet North Road, West side, and contains a black headstone.

The caretaker of Camp Hill Cemetery is Henry Eisenhauer, who is most obliging and will be glad to assist you in any way.

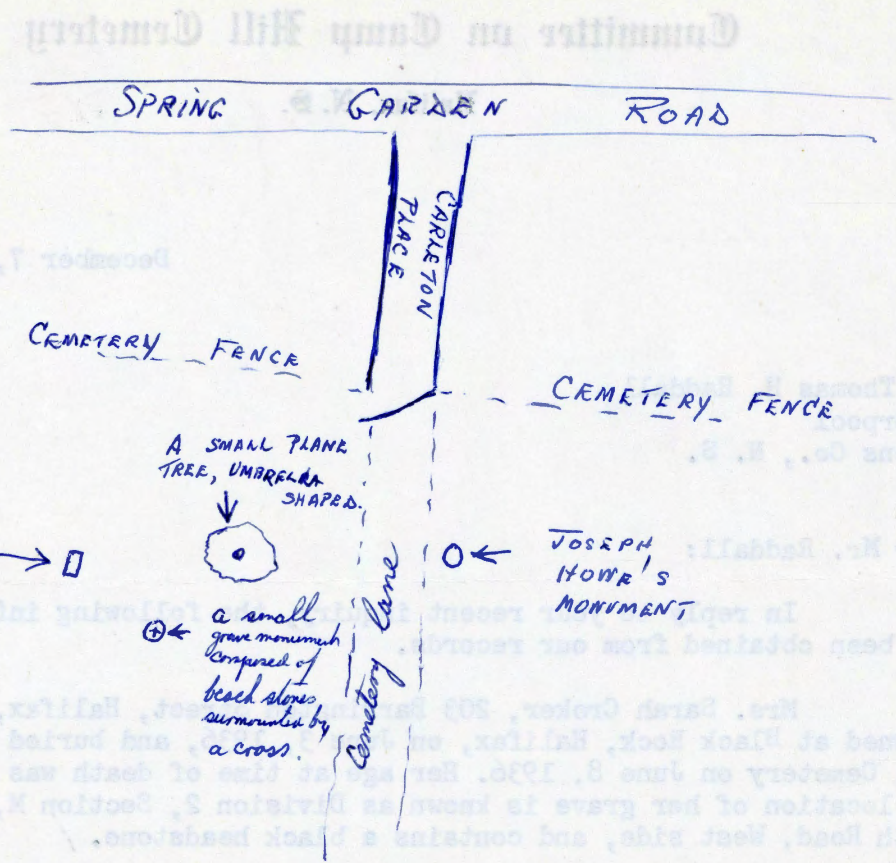

On Sep. 25 1967 I went to Camp Hill cemetery & consulted the chief caretaker in his little office. He turned up an old record book & found the entry for the burial of Sarah Croaker (sic) on June 8, 1936. This record gave her address as Brunswick Street, and said "Drowned at Black Rock June 3". He then took me to the grave, which is quite near the Carleton Place entry of the cemetery. A small black granite headstone, simply engraved "SARAH CROKER. DIED JUNE 3, 1936". A metal tab, attached to the foot of the stone, is engraved, "PERPETUAL CARE".
