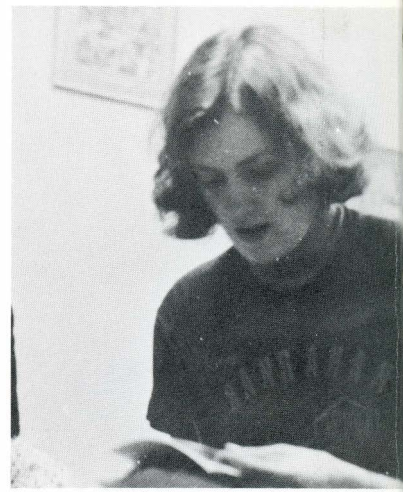

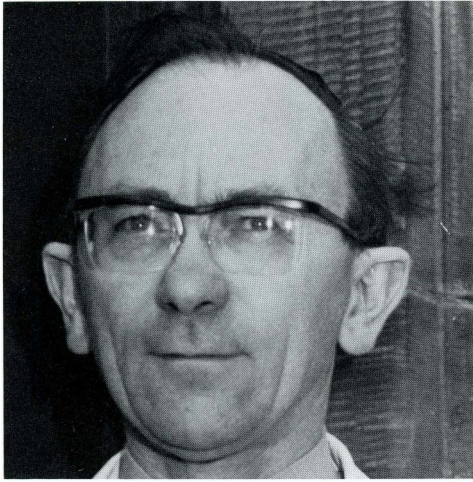

## **DR. R.S. TONKS DIRECTOR COLLEGE OF PHARMACY**

It is a pleasure and privilege for me to introduce the yearbook to you and to comment on some of the outstanding achievements of this past year and our hopes for the future.

Once again, the very high entrance standards we have come to expect of the first year students has been achieved this year with a high level of scholarship success to go with it. While many students continue to do outstandingly well in their second and third year for the unwary and unprepared the Christmas and occasionally the spring exams can result in outstandingly low grades in these years. Writing this message for Modo Optimum 1976 gives me both pleasure and a feeling of sadness.

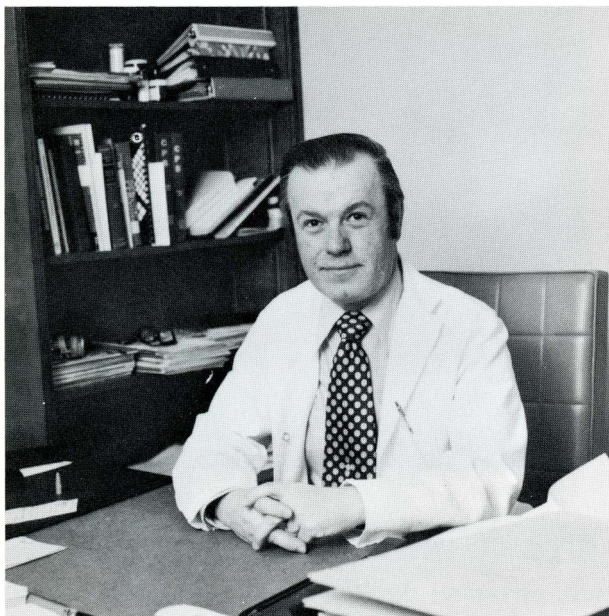
