My dear Elizabeth,

Your most recent letter reached me in Jamaica. You have the correct Washington address and telephone number. The problem is that I spent very little time in Washington this summer, what with my journeyings between Uganda, Kingston and Belize. My daughter goes out to work every day and so, most likely, there was no one in the apartment on the occasions when you called.

Unfortunately, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has mislaid some of the papers I sent them with the enquiry about the Seminar, and are now pointing out that my request to the Minister was not formal - it was a mere enquiry. The official responsible explains that the Ministry has not yet heard from Ambassador Rainford whether the ACP countries finally agreed to put up their share of the cost of the project. (They know that the Commissioners of the EEC have already expressed their support and agreed to an allocation.)



May I suggest therefore, that in order to give my enquiry a formal status, you write to me again, informing me of the project, outlining specifically the place of the Seminar in the project, and indicating the new dates you have in mind in 1980. You should then repeat the information that there is a budget for the Seminar in the project itself, and so no cost will fall on the Jamaican Government. You might usefully indicate the approximate number of participants expected and endeavour to identify any facilities, other than the financial, which would be required of the Jamaican Government.

I regret the necessity to put you to this further trouble, but I should like to be able to transmit your letter to the Minister and to ask that his formal reply be relayed through me, with a copy to Ambassador Rainford.

My dear Egerton:

I have tried to phone your Maryland number all summer, but never got an answer. Were you there at all? I noted that the envelope in which you returned the IOI card, was postmarked Washington. Did you by any chance send me a wrong number? The number in your letter is (301) 559-5166.

Things are moving well -- preparations for Pacem in Maribus X in Cyprus; Volumes II and III of the Ocean Yearbook; a research project on surveillance, in preparation for Cyprus; and the Training Programme. The first course is definitely scheduled for April 14-July 4.

We certainly will have a Planning Council meeting in April in Cyprus. If possible at all, I would like to call one in Lisbon, in connection with a preparatory meeting for Cyprus, and this would be on November 13. But I have to see about funds first!

The ACP project seems to be moving ahead as well, and we are working towards a Seminar -- a really important one, -- in Jamaica in June or thereabouts.

Please let me have your whereabouts.

King Gordon, who was in Jamaica for a few days last month, sent me a copy of the penultimate version of the memorandum describing the IOI Training Programme, and I had just asked him either to get me a final version (with details of the financial arrangements) or to let me have your present address.

Thank you very much for your letter of May 1st and for the copy of the folder on your proposed EEC-ACP marine space project.

My Foreign Minister is still in Manilla, but I have left a letter for him urging him to invite the co-ordinators of the Project to hold the final seminar in Jamaica. I have also written to Ambassador Rainford as you requested.

I have had to leave a letter for Mr. Patterson, because I leave tomorrow for London en route to Uganda, and expect to be

My dear Egerton:

It has been all too long that we have been out of touch. I trust you have received, periodically, information on activities and meetings of the IOI (the last major happening was Pacem in Maribus IX in Yaounde). More than that, I hope you are keeping well and active as ever.

Now we are embarking on a project where we would need your help and cooperation. It is a project on the potential contribution of marine space, marine resources and ocean management to development planning in ACP countries. After all, development plans have traditionally been conceived in terms of countries that consist to 90 percent of land and perhaps 10 percent of marine space. Now, in many cases, these countries find themselves consisting of 90 percent marine space and 10 percent land — and somehow, the traditional development plans won't fit as nicely. Omething ought to be done to adjust to the new reality.

The enclosed letter to Ambassador Rainford is self-explanatory. So is the project outline which I am also enclosing.

Now I would like to ask whether you could help us in either or both the following matters:

- 1. Could you get in touch with Ambassador Rainford and tell him that you think the project is useful -- if you think it is useful?
- 2. Do you think we might hold the final seminar (Spring 1980) in Jamaica? No costs would arise for your Government since there is a large budget for the seminar in the project itself. We would love to come back to Jamaica, and this might be a splendid occasion.

Incidentally, of course we would like to establish close cooperation with the University of the West Indies. I have also discussed the

matter with Lenox Ballah, and he is most willing to cooperate.

There are number of other things I should like to discuss with you -- e.g., our training project and Pacem in Maribus X (Cyprus). Could you tell me where you are going to be during these next few months? I am returning to Canada (Dalhousie University) next week; and then I'll have to be in New York for the resumed Eighth Session of the Law of the Sea Conference.

The Center in Santa Barbara is in sad shape. As a matter of fact, it is folding. That is why I am in Canada.

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

We have done a lot of work on the "expanded cooperative program." Last week I was back in Algeria and had a series of very fruitful discussions on the subject. We are now ready to send the proposal to all members of the coordinating bureau of the Non-Aligned Countries which, we hope, will adopt a resolution of general approval and a recommendation to member countries to cooperate.

Jamaica, I see, is a member of the coordinating Bureau. Could you be so very kind as to try to convince your Government to support our proposal? I know we have already some very substantial support among members -- and yours would be very, very helpful.

We shall have a meeting of the Planning Council in June in New York and Pacem in Maribus VIII in late October/early November.

I am enclosing some recent background information. The proposal, as you realize, is still in draft form, and I would be very grateful for reactions and suggestions.

My dear Egerton:

I hope you have recovered from Algiers. All in all I thought the conference was quite constructive, especially in First-Committee matters and with regard to the Mediterranean. I am enclosing a piece I did, using the material of my two statements in Algiers.

The main reason for my writing to you today however, is the following:

After Algiers, I went to Malta and then to Yugoslavia, and the result of various conversations and consultations is the enclosed first draft for an expanded cooperative program on the new international economic order and the law of the sea for our Institute.

The idea is to get it endorsed somehow by the Coordinating Committee of the Non-Aligned countries. Yugoslavia will support it, and I have sent it to Minister Yaker of Algeria, and, just now to Shirley Amerasinghe, asking for his opinion and advice.

Jamaica is not a member of the Coordinating Committee. But it would be terribly useful to have your support just the same. In particular I was thinking of the study on dependent islands in the Caribbean you were interested in. We might well undertake that, in this context.

Do you think your Government might be prepared to contribute anything between \$10,000 and \$25,000 to the program?

I would be very grateful, first of all, for your general comments on the draft and your suggestions for improving it and, second, for your assessment of the possibilities of getting a Jamaican contribution to it.

I'll be in Santa Barbara until December 12; then I am going back to Malta. So, if possible, it would be nice to hear from you before December 12.
