Caro Roberto:

You have not heard from me in ages, and probably you are surprised to know that I am still alive!

I have had your news, and your mother's and Anna's, sporadically through my daughter Angelica, and so I assume all is well with you.

I have been enormously busy, trying to help cleaning up the oceans, in every sense of the word, and building this International Ocean Institute in Malta. The Institute is doing well and doing useful things: publications, conferences, and a training programme in marine resource conservation and management for people from Third-World countries. We raise all the scholarships for them -- from the Netherlands, Germany, Sweden, Canada, UNDP, EEC, Mexico, Venezuela, Nigeria, Algeria, etc. -- it is quite a job.

Now I would like to ask whether you could help, in a very specific way. It is not money I am asking for, but help "in kind."

The situation is this: We are producing a great deal of material for publication. What I do, to make this output more economical, is that I bought here in Halifax an Olivetti

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ET 221, and I produce photo-ready copy which we send to the printer. the Olivetti ET 221 really is a wonderful toy. It saves me enormous amounts of time and money.

Now we would like to acquire the same machine for the Institute in Malta itself. Do you think you could contribute it to our programme? It would be difficult for us to buy it at this point. If you could donate it to the programme, it would be absolutely great. Of course we would make it known, and we also would do a fair amount of promotion for you, in all developing countries, in return.

What I have my eyes on next, is an Olivetti copy machine. Eventually I want to buy one here, but, again, if and when you could donate one to our Institute in Malta, that would be absolutely splendid. We had a little ~~Na~~shua for our programme, and we wore it out completely. We need a new one in the Spring, and it would be a vitally important contribution to our programme, if you could donate one.

Of course I don't know whether all this is possible at all. I do know that you would do your best, and that our programme is very much in line with what Olivetti has always stood for and fought for. We feel we are making a concrete contribution to the building of a New International Economic Order which should be based on principles, starting with that of the Common Heritage of Mankind, which are close to the ideas of Comunità.

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
