It is a happy consequence of the decision of Convocation to award the degree of Doctor of Civil Law *(honoris causa)* to Professor Leonard Philip Edwards that, in honouring this distinguished member of the Faculty of the University of New Brunswick, it allows the two oldest academic institutions in English speaking Canada to associate themselves together in a pleasant act of mutual recognition and esteem.

Leonard Edward's career as a teacher has not by any means been confined to what used to be called the seclusion of academic institutions. Indeed he has taught at every level of the educational system: he was for many years a school teacher and worked in that field in many capacities. Later, in the post-war years, he joined the Mathematics Department of the University of New Brunswick and soon established an enviable reputation for himself as a most effective instructor; further his work in the planning and administration of mathematical studies brought him a position on the executive of the Mathematical Congress of Canada.

In addition to his scholarly career Leonard Edwards has displayed a continuous interest in all aspects of the life of the church. From his early days in Cape Breton to his long residence in Fredericton he has given unstintedly of his time and talents as a Lay Reader and as a member of diocesan and general synods.

For his contributions to mathematical studies and to the corporate life of the religious community we ask you, Mr. Chancellor, to confer on Leonard Edwards the degree of Doctor of Civil Law *(honoris causa)*.

The understanding that most Nova Scotians have of their province and its culture is due in no small part to the shaping of their historical imagination through the works of Thomas Raddall.

Mr. Raddall has lived in this province from early childhood; through almost fifty years he has observed and learned to appreciate its shifting and conflicting allegiances. In his many historical and imaginative works he has been unusually successful in capturing and expressing the peculiar character of the people of the province; of its fishermen and its loggers; its varied national traditions; he has even managed to articulate the sense of its intellectual culture and achievements. It is, therefore, with more than usual pleasure that we ask that this degree be conferred upon Thomas Head Raddall as a testimony of our esteem for him and our recognition of his services to the province and its people.

We are therefore pleased to have the opportunity today of asking you, Mr. Chancellor, to confer upon the Very Reverend Harry Rhodes Cooper the degree of Doctor of Divinity (*honoris causa*).

Mr. Cooper has already enjoyed a long and intimate association with King's College; he was educated here and at Dalhousie and since then has served the College in many capacities. Both as a governor and as president of the Alumni Association he has demonstrated an active and continuous concern for his university.

But it is also his work as a diocesan clergyman we wish to honour today. His ecclesiastical career has embraced almost every aspect of the work an industrious clergyman can be expected today to be called upon to perform. From work in industrial parishes, to the demands of extensive rural pastorates; from administrative work at the highest level of the national church to the challenges and concerns of the local synods. Harry Rhodes Cooper has moved with vigour and distinction. His merit has been recognized recently with the call to undertake the duties of Dean of the Diocese of Fredericton.

We ask you therefore, Mr. Chancellor to award to Harry Rhodes Cooper the degree of Doctor of Divinity (*honoris causa*) as a mark of our recognition of the value of his work for the well-being of the community.
