

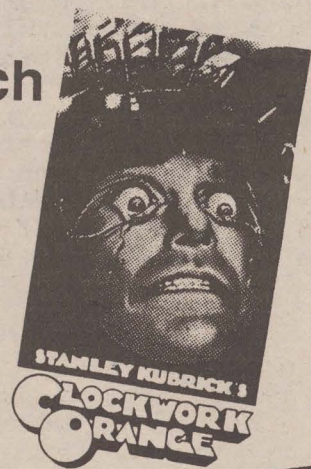

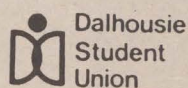
(b) MOTION

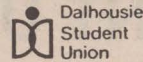
