Our physiotherapy faculty was again well represented in the intramural sports program for the year 1981 - 1982.

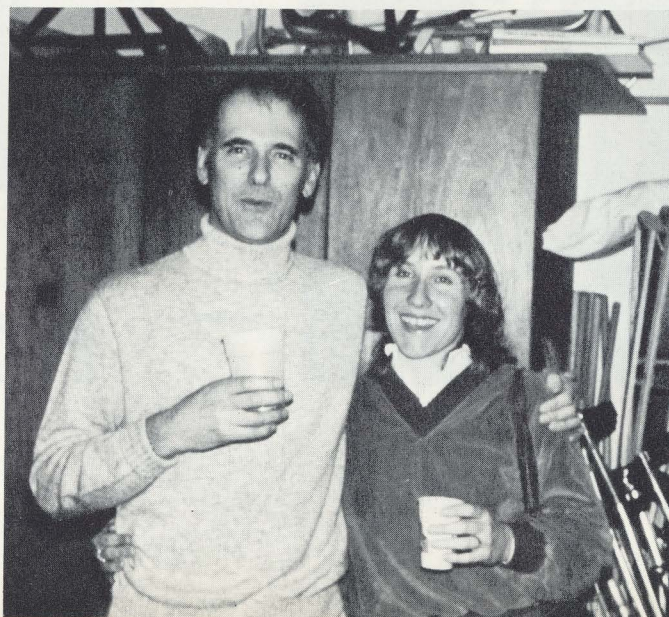
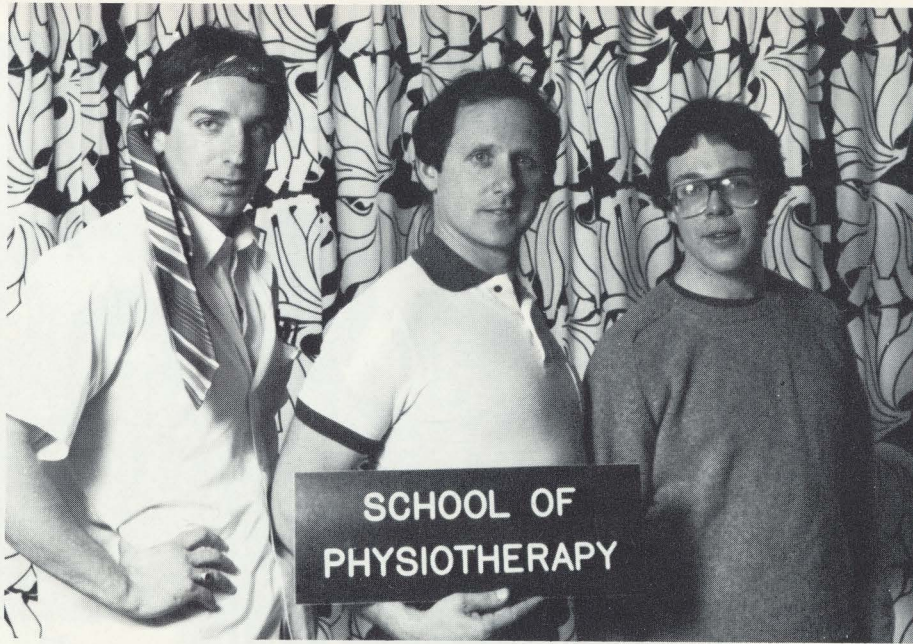
The year started by gaining a berth in the championship game of the Co-ed softball competition, which unfortunately was unsuccessful.

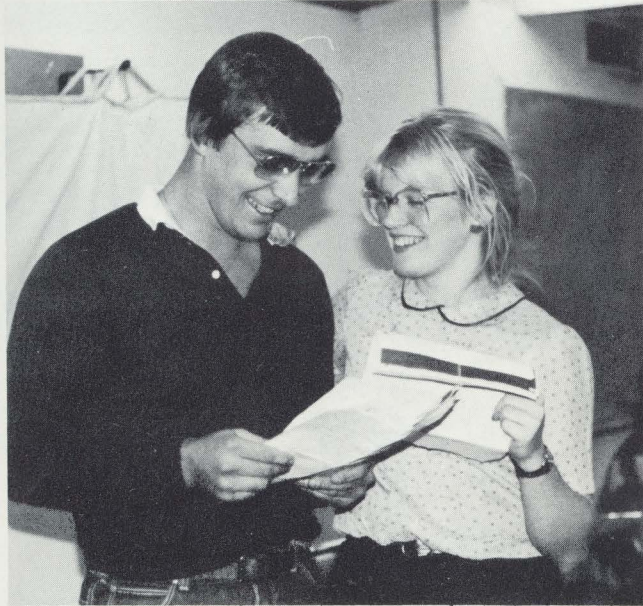
