Following is the wording used on the Illuminated Scroll presented by the Congregation to Dr. Murray, on Sunday, January 18, 1970:-

### AN APPRECIATION

The Session of J. Wesley Smith Memorial United Church has set aside this Sunday, January 18th, 1970, to be observed within our congregation as Dr. Florence J. Murray Sunday. It is our desire in this way to honor a courageous and dedicated lady for many years of effective and outstanding service to her Master and His Church.

In 1921, Florence Murray went to Korea, having been graduated from Dalhousie University in medicine. From that time on for 48 years she served God by serving humanity. Countless lives have been healed and influenced because of her medical ability and Christian wisdom.

Places and institutions such as Manchuria; Hamheung, Korea; Ewha Women's University, Severance Medical School and Hospital, Seoul, Korea; Mission Hospital in Wonju; Leprosy Mission in Taegu, Korea; have been scenes of her labour of love. Furthermore, she has inspired countless others at home to join in this concern for Christian mission.

A grateful Church hereby acknowledges its debt to her, expresses gratitude to Almighty God for this dedicated life, and prays His continuing blessing upon her in the years ahead.
