Dear Sister:

It was very kind of you to write, and I am happy indeed that you have found my book of some use in your work.

Please send me copies of the pamphlets you are writing. I shall read them with interest, and keep them in my files for future reference. When I wrote Halifax, Warden of the North, the city was confined by definition to the peninsula. I dealt with Nova Scotia history in a general way, to make the picture clear to readers abroad, but I confined my detail to the city side of the Dutch Village Road. Under the present annexation plan Rockingham becomes part of the city, and when the time comes (Deo volente) for me to bring my book up to date again, I shall include Mount Saint Vincent and your Congregation as an integral part of the city's story.
