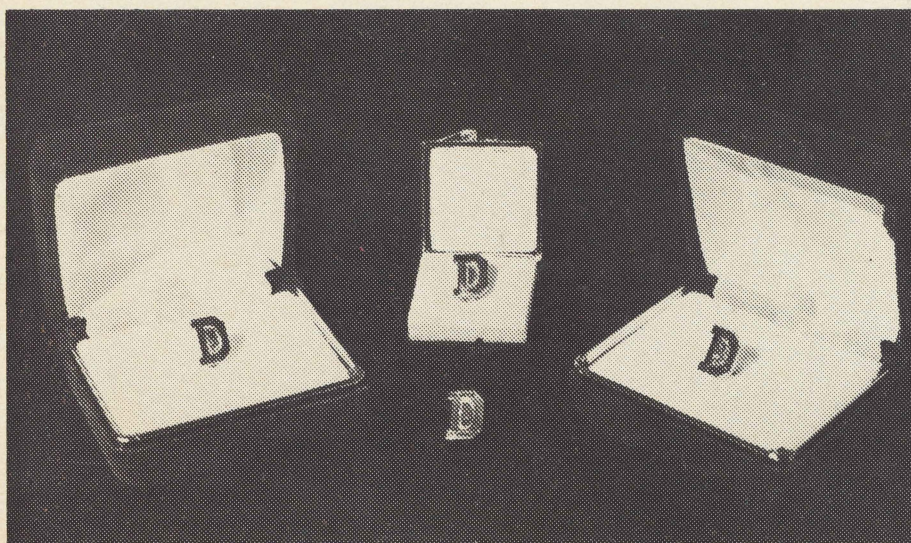

Women Tigers take CIAU Volleyball Championship

It was a moment to be savored, to be enjoyed at the time and to be tucked away in the back of the mind for recall in future days and months.

It was game five in a best-of-five match.

The Dal women's volleyball Tigers led the Calgary Dinnies 14-11, had service and waited for Calgary's return. The Tigers rejected Calgary's spike but the ball went out. The linesman signalled out - the referee countered with a net violation against Calgary and the point, game and match belonged to the Tigers.

The Dalhousie Tigers had just won the Canadian Interuniversity Athletic Union's volleyball championship.

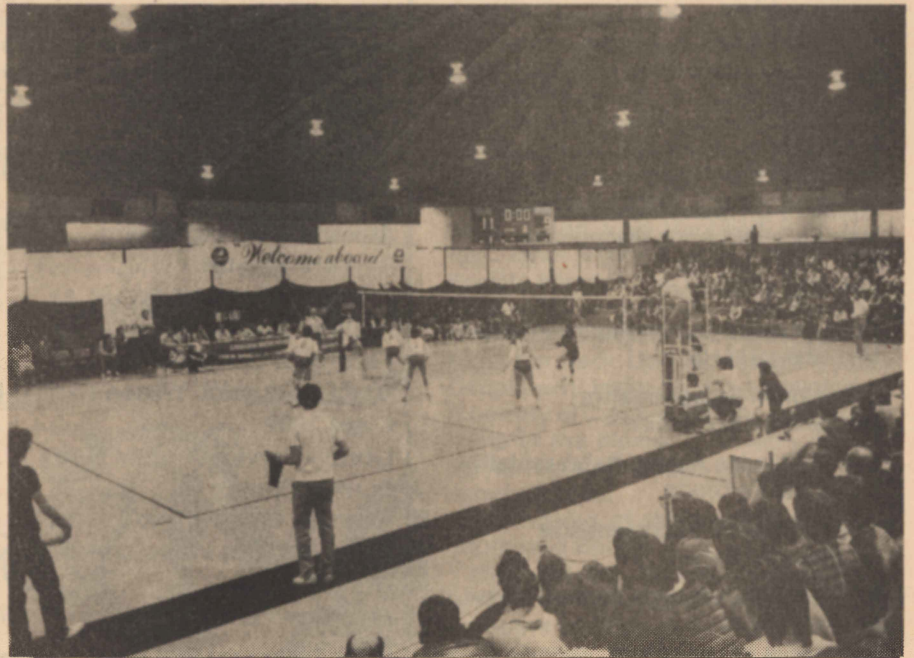
For statisticians, the score was 15-7, 16-14, 5-15, 9-15, 15-11.

For 1200 Tiger fans crushed into Dalplex, the score didn't matter - only the moment.

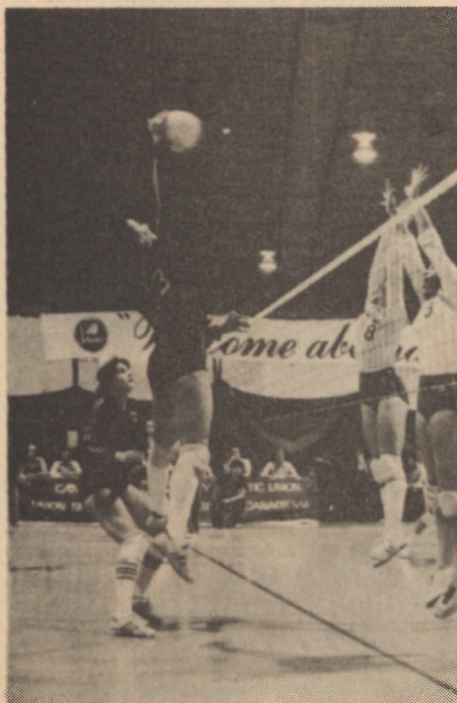
There were anxious times, though, before the victory was sealed. Dal took a 2-0 game lead early in round robin play, but as All-Canadian and All-tournament player Karen Fraser would say later, "A match is never over until the final point of the final game. A 2-0 game lead means nothing in volleyball."

Calgary tried to prove a 2-0 deficit is nothing. They rushed back to win the next two to throw fear into the hearts of the Tiger players and fans.

Dal opened the final game with a flurry, leading 7-1. Calgary wasn't dismayed and came back to 9-5 before the

Tigers dominated again and went up to 13-5. The Dinnies regrouped and scored six in a row to close to 13-11. Then another Tiger point leading to the final moment of ecstasy.

"Our veterans did the job for us," said a misty-eyed coach Lois MacGregor. "Karin Maessen, Karen Fraser, Veronika Schmidt. They were great."

Maessen, named outstanding player of the year in Canadian women's volleyball and named tourney most valuable player, was bubbling. The Tiger co-captain publicly thanked the fans for their support, saying "You were great. You gave us the support we needed." Privately, she said, "The team hasn't played this well all year. We wanted to speak for the CIAUs and we did. It was a real team effort."

Fraser was named to the All-Canadian team and to the tourney All-Star team.

The CIAU win was the first for Dal since 1976 when the field hockey Tigers won the national championship.

Men Finish Third

The men showed their best in the CIAUs in three years. In 1980 and 1981 they were winless, but they started this tourney with victories over Laval and York before dropping a tough 3-2 match

Calgary. In that one, Al Scott's men won the first two games, led 13-11 in game three before losing 15-13 and then 15-10, 15-11.

A win over Memorial followed making their final game in the round robin against Manitoba a "must win" to reach the final. They dropped a 3-1 decision, but had the satisfaction of losing only to the number one and two ranked teams in Canada.

Rod Walsh was first team All-Canadian, and Phil Perrin second team, with Perrin and Jamie Fraser being named to the all tournament team.

For the record, Calgary won the CIAU men's title, beating Manitoba 3-1. Mark Dolodziej, the outstanding player in the CIAU and first team All-Canadian, showed the fans why with a powerful performance, earning him tourney MVP honours.

Lesley Barnes, who chaired the organizing committee for the tourney, tired but happy at the end of the proceedings Saturday, was grateful to her committee. "We heard such great comments from our visitors all weekend. They had nothing but praise for the work of our people. I can't praise them enough either."



Med student's "special delivery" brings personal touch to ceremony

Nearly 1700 receive Dalhousie degrees at Spring convocations

When Dalhousie's President Dr. W. Andrew MacKay heard why medical graduate Patricia Kim Dauphinee was the only one in her class not in attendance at convocation, he decided something should be done. So later that day he and the Dean of Medicine, Dr. Donald Hatcher, and the assistant dean, student affairs, Dr. Byron Reid, made a special trip to the Grace Maternity Hospital to perform what must be one of the university's smallest and most personal convocation ceremonies in its history. As is

the case at most convocations, the family was present — Pat's husband Robert Bentley and her new son John Christopher, born only about an hour before his mother's graduation exercises were to begin, witnessed the event.

Patricia Kim Dauphinee was one of about 1700 students to graduate from Dalhousie this year, bringing the university's alumni total over the 51,000 mark, with some 35,000 of them holding Dalhousie degrees and diplomas.

Twelve honorary degrees were awarded to outstanding Canadian leaders in business, health, the arts and sciences and law.

Mrs. Mona Louise Campbell, president of Dover Industries Ltd., and Mr. Lloyd R. Shaw of L.E. Shaw Ltd. were honoured at the Administrative Studies convocation.

At the Faculty of Health Professions ceremony, special degrees were conferred upon pharmacist and former dean at the University of Calgary, Dr. Mervyn James Huston, and Mrs. Jean E. MacDonald, an alumna and friend of Dal-

when Dr. Claude Thomas Bissell, former president of the University of Toronto, philosopher Dr. Hugues Leblanc, and George William Frederick McCurdy, director of the Nova Scotia Human Rights Commission, received their Doctors of Laws, *honoris causa*.

At Medicine's ceremony, Pat Dauphinee missed seeing Dr. A. William Cochran, the first Dean of Medicine at the University of Calgary, Mrs. Nora Langton Balders, one of the founders of the Dalhousie Medical Research Foundation, and Mr. William M. Sobey, also a founder and former chairman of the Foundation, honoured for their dedication to medicine and medical education.

The Hon. Walter L. Gordon and A. William Cox, QC, were awarded honorary degrees at the Law convocation.

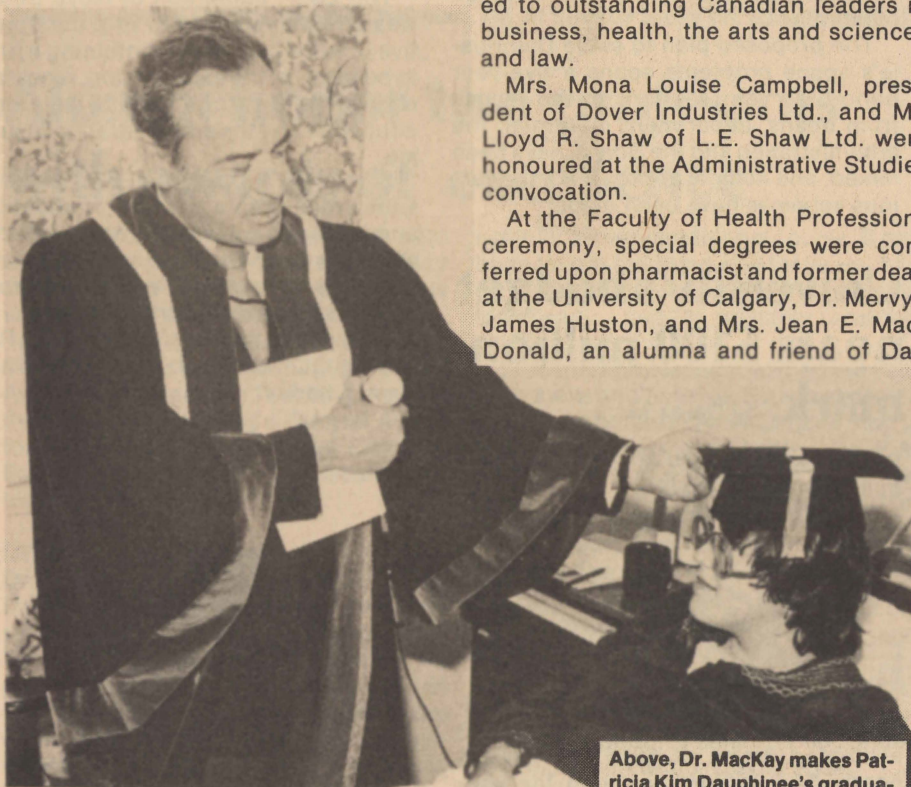
Also at Law convocation, Dean William Charles accepted the Alumni's Special Award for Teaching Excellence, given posthumously to Law professor Leslie Balogh, who died of cancer earlier in the academic year.

Another alumni award, the Alumni Award of Excellence in Teaching, was presented at the Arts and Science convocation to Dr. James Pincock of chemistry,

Dr. James Holland was honoured at the Medical convocation with the School's Professor of the Year award.

Many students were also honoured with awards for their outstanding academic achievements. Of particular note were the three straight-A scholars who took the university's top prizes — Karen Christine Knop, mathematics, the Governor General's Gold Medal winner; Charles Robert Brogan, commerce, University Silver Medallist; and Nigel David Higson, mathematics, who at 18 is the Avery Prize winner. As well, 18 University Medals and numerous other prizes were awarded to top-ranking graduates.

The Dalhousie Student Union also took the opportunity to note of the outstanding contributions of some of its own at convocation. Two Malcolm Honour Awards were presented — to Gord Owen, former president of DSU, and Shauna Sullivan, a former ombudsman. As well, Carolyn Zayid and Kevin Feindel received Gold Ds, Chuck Baker, Krista Connell and Randall Kelly were awarded Silver Ds, and Glenn Walton, editor of the student literary magazine, *Skylight*, received a special Literary Gold D.

Three more distinguished Canadians were added to the list of honorary alumni at the Arts and Science convocation

Space not at premium, say consultants, but reshuffling is needed

Dalhousie University does not lack for space, although it does need to re-examine the use and design of some of its buildings and move some departments to more suitable quarters. That's the upshot of a \$100,000 space study commissioned by the President's Office and carried out by Environmental Consulting Services Ltd. over the past academic year.

The study, which took place in two phases (the first examined the lower, or Carleton, campus while the second looked at the upper, Studley, area), revealed that Dalhousie has more space per student than other universities of similar academic composition — Queen's and the University of Western Ontario, for example — but that it was for the most part badly distributed and, in some cases, in poor repair. Classroom space was found to be more than adequate (in quantity if not in quality) for the university's present and future needs.

The report's recommendations, in brief, are as follows:

— On the lower, or Carleton, campus, the Forrest building, Dalhousie's original building on its present site, should be renovated to house Nursing, Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy. The building has been virtually empty for the past year.

This recommendation has already received tentative approval from the Board, and the university has received additional funding from the government to complete the project. The first phase, gutting the building so that the architects can work on design proposals, has already begun.

— On the upper, or Carleton, campus, a chronic case of lack of space was discovered in the Chemistry building, where laboratory accommodation is at a premium, and what does exist is in poor and unsafe condition. The consultants recommended the construction of a new building for the Chemistry department, as well as renovation of the Old Public Archives building, now almost completely empty, for additional lab facilities.

Other recommendations include a major reshuffling of library facilities and several departments and offices; the conversion of the Chemistry and Macdonald Library buildings into what the consultants term an Arts building (which would accommodate many of the departments now in houses); demolition of the Arts Annex and Hancock Hall (Education and Social Work, now housed in these

buildings, can be placed in the new Arts building); and sale or re-allocation of use of most of the university houses.

Cost estimates for completing the various construction and renovation projects proposed in the report approach the \$20 million mark. This does not include the expected capital gains from the sale of some properties, or the estimated savings in the operating budget which could result from such sales as well as from the demolition of certain buildings and renovations and improvements to other facilities, all of which the consultants place somewhere near \$5 million.

The proposed plan to settle Dalhousie's space problems spans a five-year period. As yet, reactions to the report, from deans, department chairmen, the administration and the Board, have been mixed, and no final approvals of the various schemes have been made.

University's budget nears \$100 million mark

Dalhousie University will soon be a \$100 million a year operation.

The Board of Governors, at its May meeting, approved in principle a preliminary operating budget with estimated expenditures of \$96,327,323.

The approval came with a proviso: that the administration's ultimate target be a balanced budget.

The preliminary budget shows revenues at about \$95,951,011, leaving an estimated deficit of \$376,312. This is nearly \$4.6 million less than the estimated deficit for 1981-82.

Robbie Shaw, vice-president (administration and finance), in asking the board for its approval, said there were some revenue uncertainties which could affect the final budget calculations, and these uncertainties might not be cleared up for some time.

The largest single revenue source for 1982-83 is the MPHEC-recommended operating grant; the Nova Scotia government increased this over the 1981-82 grant by nearly \$6 million to \$58,727,850. The major expense item is \$63,947,135, for academic teaching purposes.

N.S. Law Foundation establishes \$275,000 scholarship fund

Students attending the Law School in future will benefit from a capital fund of \$275,000 established by the Law Foundation of Nova Scotia, it was announced before Law convocation this spring.

Income from the capital fund, which may be added to from time to time, will provide scholarships, which will be primarily entrance scholarships.

In the event that there is a surplus in the scholarship fund, the trustees may designate payments for the benefit of the Law School, but only for the advancement and propagation of learning, legal education and research, and other purposes conducive to those purposes.

The Law Foundation of Nova Scotia was established in 1976 with the objective of setting up and maintaining a fund to be used for the examination, research, revision and reform of the law, legal education and the administration of justice.

Since 1976 Dalhousie has received substantial grants from the foundation, and for the past several years the foundation has provided the Law School with funds to give three annual entrance scholarships, each worth \$5,000.

Trustees of the new fund are K. LeRoy Taylor, QC, Ronald J. Downie, QC, and Dean Charles.

Law School gets fund director



The appointment of Peter J. Drage of Bedford as fund director for the Law School was announced recently by the President.

Mr. Drage will work in close co-operation with the university's Fund Office and the Law School Alumni Association, and will help to organize and conduct fund raising activities for the Law School.

Alumni honor two professors with awards of excellence

The Dalhousie Alumni Association paid tribute to the outstanding teaching ability of two of the university's faculty at its annual alumni dinner early in May.

Dr. James A. Pincock of the Chemistry Department was awarded the 1982 Alumni Award of Excellence in Teaching. As well, the association created a Special Award for Teaching Excellence for Leslie V. Balogh, a member of the Law faculty until his death in December, 1981.

Dr. James A. Pincock

Dr. Pincock has been a member of the Dalhousie Chemistry department's faculty since 1973. His teaching prowess has become so renowned of late that for the past five years students have camped in the halls outside the Registrar's Office the night before the beginning of early registration in order to secure a spot in his introductory organic chemistry course.

This year his students decided to pay further homage to his talents by nominating him for the excellence in teaching award. The following represents the kinds of comments that accompanied the nomination: "...one of the few professors I respect. He has a firm grip of his subject. His enthusiasm is highly contagious. He is always organized and available to students who may need his help. he deserves the award."

Pincock, the third recipient of the award (previous winners were Political Science professor Murray Beck in 1980 and Dr. Basil Cooke, Geology in 1981), said he was "very pleased" to be so honoured. When asked to explain his teaching methods, the young professor replied mod-

estly: "It's a very traditional course. It has been taught the same way for years. All I do is teach the material clearly and systematically... and I'm probably receptive to students."

Students and friends attending the Faculty of Arts and Science Convocation at 2 p.m., Friday, May 14 in Dalplex had a further opportunity to honour Dr. Pincock when the Alumni Association's President, Dr. Chester Stewart presented him with a framed scroll.

Leslie V. Balogh

Leslie Balogh was a member of the faculty of the Dalhousie Law School until December, 1981, when he died of cancer at age 36. The high volume of nominations he received for the Award of Excellence prompted the selection committee to honour him with a special prize.

Following are excerpts from the nomination letter on behalf of Les Balogh: "Professor Balogh was best known in the law school as a Taxation professor. After just one term, his Tax I course had a waiting list, making it necessary for many students to wait until third year if they wished to be taught by him. His knowledge and enthusiasm were consistently and successfully communicated to others."

"Professor Balogh constantly sought student participation...The standards he set for his students were not meager ones...He urged students to develop an ability to analyze and think about what the law meant, and why..."

"Professor Balogh was always available to meet with a student outside of

class hours, and outside of his posted office hours. He was truly a dedicated teacher." "His only concession to his illness was that he taught five classes per week, instead of the usual four to complete the course before any illness intervened. Professor Balogh was always prompt, and missed only one class during his final term."

"His reputation for superior teaching was a by-word amongst Dalhousie students."

Dr. Chester Stewart presented William Charles, Dean of the Faculty of Law with Professor Balogh's framed scroll at the Law Convocation on May 28.

Latter day writers of job descriptions with a keen eye for more pay, less work, security, fringe benefits and longer holidays, would shudder to list all the duties Miss Blauvelt has performed, generally without demur and always with dedication, since the day she joined the medical school four deans ago in 1948.

Dr. Grant's office was in the Public Health Clinic, now the Clinical Research Centre. Labs and lecture rooms were scattered about in several buildings ... Profile: Sara Somers and the Career Information Centre

If you want some information from Dalhousie on career planning, occupational information or job search strategies, then Sara Somers (picture above) is the person to see.

A dynamic lady, Sara is the new Resource Co-ordinator for the Career Information Centre, which is part of the Dalhousie Counselling and Psychological Services Centre. Situated on the 4th floor of the Student Union Building, the Centre offers counselling for a wide range of concerns.

Under the direction of Judy Hayashi, the staff consists of professionally trained psychologists and counsellors who offer individual counselling, as well as programs for personal and academic development. Over 3,000 Dalhousians annually use the services of the Centre.

It is Sara Somers' job to oversee and co-ordinate the expansion of the present Career Information Centre, which will receive a grant of \$100,000 over a 3 year period. The new Centre will offer information on career planning and self assessment, occupational information, job search strategies and labour market infor-

Today, the files fill rooms. The Medical student enrolment has almost doubled and almost all the medical graduates of Dalhousie for the past 34 years are known to Barbara Blauvelt by their first name.

"The students have kept me going. I enjoy them tremendously," she said, and recalled with pleasure that she is an honorary member of three graduating classes. In her 25th year in the dean's office, the Dalhousie medical students presented her with a silver tray. She treasures the tokens of esteem they have given her over the years, and she prominently displays on her office wall a certificate of life membership in Phi Rho Sigma, Alpha Eta Chapter. She was the first woman to be admitted to what was once an all male preserve.

In her new post, she will be Assistant to the Dean of Medicine for Alumni Affairs, 20 per cent of the time, and work 80 per cent of the time for the Medical Alumni Association, making contact with its members all over North America.

The job will entail travelling to new places to meet old alumni again, and she will be helping to raise money - this time for the Alumni Association which has a current interest in funding medical research. And when in town, she intends always to have her door open to students. The coffee pot will always be ready, she said.

mation. Guides to finding work abroad, visa travel information from embassies and directories on international study will also be available at the Centre. The Reference section of the Centre will include information on local services, community directories, as well as larger areas where students may find work. Availability of careers will be on computers as well as orientation information for Dalhousie students. Information regarding graduate tests, admissions procedures, graduate and professional school entrance requirements will also be available to students. Audiotaped interviews with people from different occupations will be provided as well as a study skills section on how to take notes, preparation for exams, etc. and services for mature students and minority groups.

Sara Somers' background has very adequately prepared her for her present job.

Since 1978 as Co-ordinator of Co-operative Education Work Experience Programs for 3rd year Liberal Arts students at the College of Cape Breton, Sara was responsible for contacting employers for vacancies for post-secondary students, locating job assignments and providing a career counselling service. Previous to that, Ms. Somers worked as an employment counsellor and program administrator for the Federal government's Man-

Another "first" for Dal law alumna

Madame Justice Constance Glube, LL.B., '55, a Dalhousie alumna, has been appointed head of the Nova Scotia Supreme Court trial division. She is the first woman ever appointed chief justice of a court under federal jurisdiction.

A 1955 Dalhousie law graduate, her appointment was announced less than a week after Madame Justice Bertha Wilson's (See page 10) elevation to the Supreme Court of Canada.

A native of Ottawa, Chief Justice Glube earned her undergraduate degree from McGill University. While in her final year of law at Dalhousie she was awarded Carswell Prize.

Following several years in private practice she became senior city solicitor for Halifax. In 1974 she was named city manager, a post she held until 1977, when she was appointed to the Nova Scotia Supreme Court.

Chief Justice Glube is currently director of the Canadian Institute for the Admin-

istration of Justice and co-chairman of the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews, Atlantic Region. She is married to Professor Richard Glube of Dalhousie's School of Business Administration. They have four children.

Dentistry celebrates opening of expansion and 75th

After 15 years of planning, including four years of construction, Dalhousie's Faculty of Dentistry officially opened its \$20 million expanded building — the newest and most modern in North America — last month.

During a special convocation to celebrate the event, two distinguished Dalhousie graduates, **Dr. Hazlett Saunders Crosby** of Halifax (DDS '23), a practising dentist for the past 59 years (recently retired), and **Dr. Donald Elmer Williams** of Moncton (DDS '55), current president of the Canadian Dental Association, were honoured. Representatives from the federal government as well as Maritime provincial governments were on hand to take part in the festivities.

A major conference on dental research and education, the annual meetings of the Association of Canadian Faculties of Dentistry (ACFD/AFCD) and the Canadian Association for Dental Research (CADR), and two continuing education courses were also scheduled around the celebrations, which coincided with festivities saluting 75 years of dental education at Dalhousie.

Dalhousie's Faculty of Dentistry is the oldest continuing university faculty of dentistry in Canada. Previously the Maritime College of Dentistry, it became a faculty within Dalhousie during the 1911-12 academic year.

Originally housed in the Forrest Building, teaching was initially carried out almost exclusively by local practitioners. A move to new quarters (the mid building) on Robie Street in 1958 coincided with plans to develop a more complete dental education program. Along with the goal to build a comprehensive teaching program was a concerted effort to attract faculty with expertise in special disciplines. A two-year dental hygiene program was introduced in 1961, and two graduate programs have since been initiated.

Dalhousie's Faculty of Dentistry has graduated more than 1300 professionals in its 75-year history, and in a little over a decade has attracted 6000 members of the dental profession in the Atlantic region to its continuing education courses.

The recent renovation of the mid building and the addition of an adjoining facility has now made it possible to accept more students into the programs, expand the patient care service, and provide adequate space for dental research.

According to Faculty of Dentistry officials, the expanded facilities offer the public and the dental profession "a wonderful opportunity to plan and implement the best possible dental health

care system for Canada, and for the Atlantic provinces in particular."

With features like 185 modern dental cubicles (with a future capacity for 270), special training laboratories, a large sophisticated research facility and 20 classrooms, the new complex is capable of expanding current enrollment in both the dental and dental hygiene classes from 25 to 64 students each year. It can also offer classroom and conference facilities to other health profession faculties and continuing education groups at Dalhousie.

Other special facilities in the building include a complete central sterilization service for the clinic, one of the first in North America for a dental school, and a five channel remote controlled television teaching system permitting up to five different classes to use different television programs simultaneously, with program control by the teaching faculty.

Enrolment in the first year dental class is expected to rise by 25 per cent this year to 40 students, and a further 20 per cent to 48 students in September, 1983 (in the past, an average of 150 applicants were turned away each year due to lack of space). This increase will contribute to meeting the demands of growing dental health care needs in the region. Programs in continuing education in Dentistry are also expected to continue to expand with the improved facilities; already figures are steadily growing. Over the past 10 years the number of registrants in continuing education

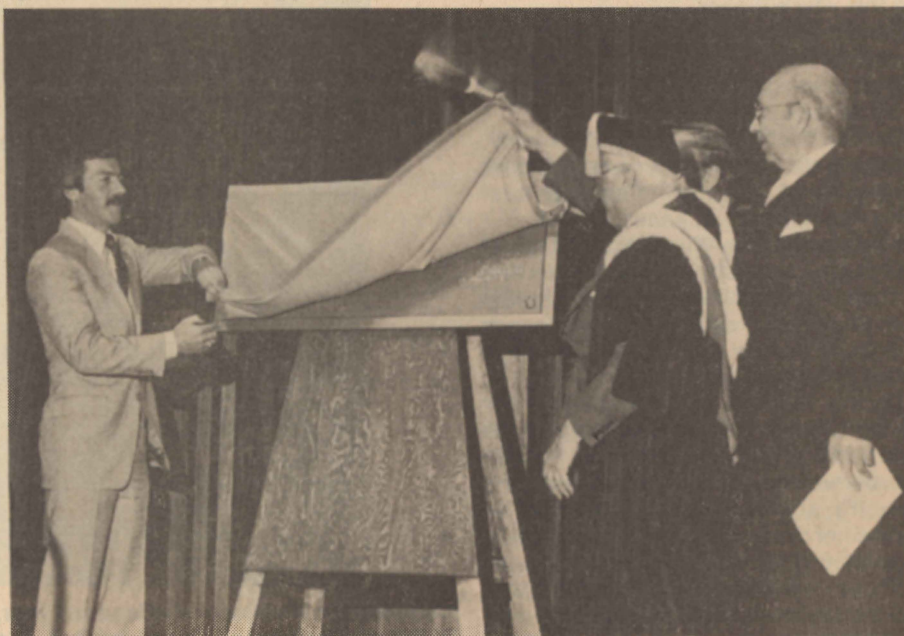
courses in Dentistry has jumped from 82 (out of 447 registered dentists in the region) to 735 (from 653 registered dentists!) and the number of courses offered has grown from four to 19 per year. The participation rate among practitioners in the Atlantic provinces is over 60 per cent, one of the best rates in Canada.

Expansion of the dental facility has also made an enhanced clinical curriculum possible. The layout of the clinic has allowed the creation of vertical student groups consisting of a fourth year student, a third year student and a second year dental hygiene student. These individuals have been assigned adjacent clinical operatories and work together in the management and treatment of their patients.

About 3000 patients are treated annually in the clinic, yet ample space is still available for graduate students and participation-type continuing education programs. Additionally, the improved facilities mean that practising dentists can upgrade their skills while the regular teaching program is ongoing.

Other services available include preventative treatment, comprehensive adult care, children's dentistry, emergency treatment, and speciality care.

The only way to really appreciate the new dental facilities, short of being a dentist, dental hygienist, or patient, is to see the building for yourself, say members of the Faculty of Dentistry. Madame Justice Bertha Wilson, the first woman appointed to the Supreme Court of Canada will be the Association's Honorary President for 1982-83.

Association Past President Dr. Donna Curry announced the appointment at the Annual Dinner on May 6.

Madame Justice Wilson, a 1957 LL.B. graduate of Dalhousie University, told Dr. Curry in a telephone conversation that she was pleased and honored that the Association would appoint her Honorary President. Previous commitments prevented the Madame Justice from attending this year's dinner.

Bertha Wilson's appointment to the Supreme Court was announced in early March, breaking the 107 year old tradition of an all male court.

Born in the highland port of Kirkcaldy, Scotland, she studied to become a teacher during World War II. She and her husband immigrated to Canada in 1949.

Madame Justice Wilson studied law at Dalhousie University joining the law firm of Osler, Hosken & Harcourt after graduation. She was an active corporate lawyer and wrote several articles as well as lecturing other lawyers.

During the late 60's she helped the United Church of Canada prepare its report to a royal commission on the status of women and later chaired the church's abortion committee. She resigned her position in 1975 when she was appointed to the Ontario Court of Appeal.

Those familiar with her legal background say she is ideally suited for a post on an appellate court whose legal decisions often have broad ramifications for all of society.

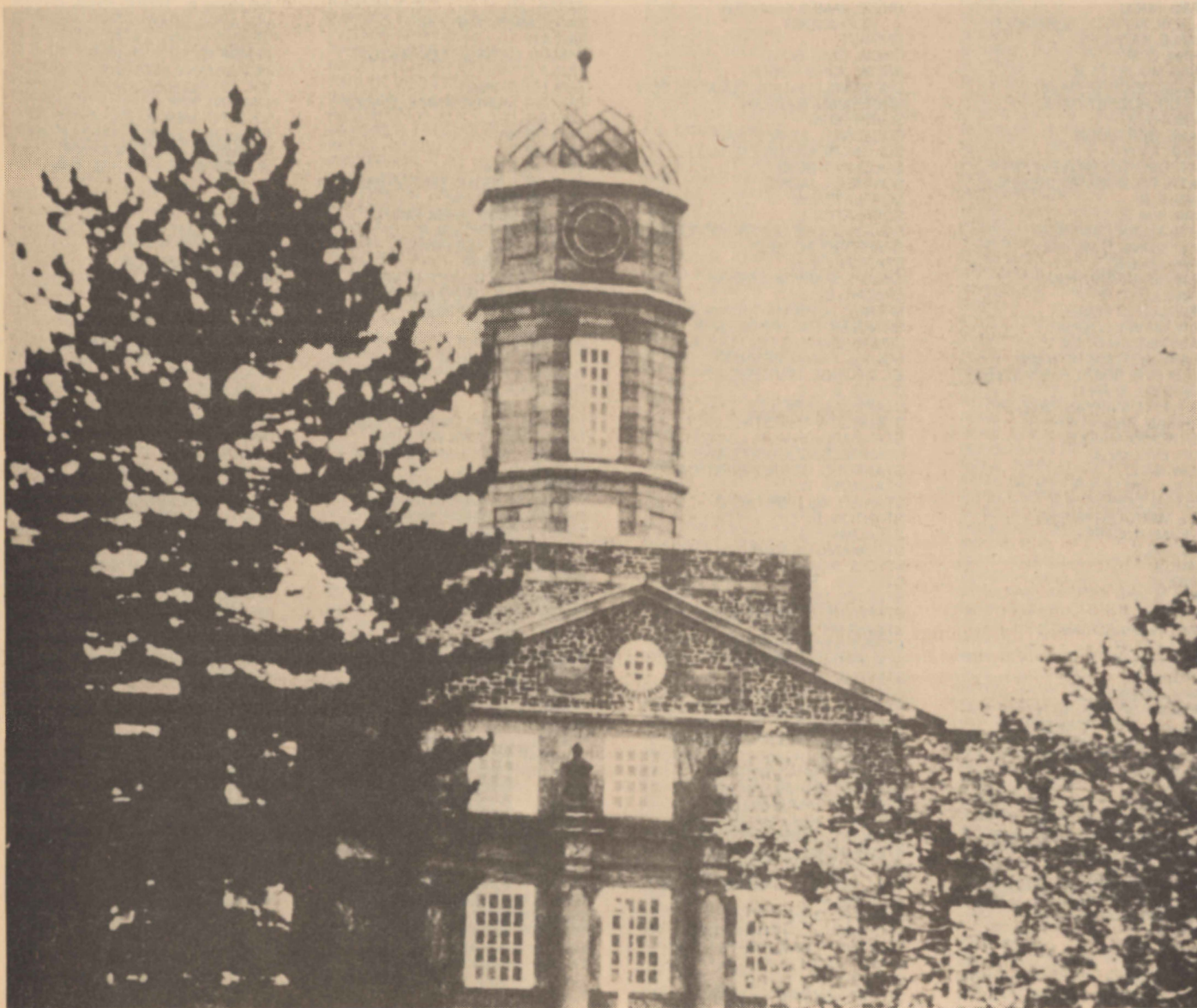

Hicks donates valuable Oscar Wilde collection

Dr. Henry Hicks, President Emeritus of Dalhousie University and a Canadian Senator, has donated his valuable Oscar Wilde book collection to Dalhousie's University Library.

All of Wilde's works are represented in the collection, which consists of over 300 titles, most of them first editions and many limited first editions. According to Collections Librarian Gayle Garlock, only five of Wilde's titles are not included in the Hicks collection. Of those missing, there are only two known copies of one of the titles, and only four of another.

Although the total value of the gift is not yet known, Dr. Garlock says that some of the books, especially the limited first editions, four of which are signed, are worth over \$1000 each. *The Picture of Dorian Gray*, for example, a signed limited first edition and one of only 250 copies printed, was recently listed in a rare book dealer's catalogue at \$1500.

The collection also includes a signed copy of *The Importance of Being Earnest*.

The gift contains not only the writings of Oscar Wilde, but also an extensive collection from the 1890s, including the drawings of Aubrey Beardsley and the works of Max Beerbohm, Lord Alfred Douglas, Frank Harris and Walter Pater, as well as the famous Avant-Garde quarterly *The Yellow Book*. Dr. Hicks had also maintained an excellent collection of modern criticism on Wilde.

Since he began collecting books on the author during his college days at Oxford University in 1937, Dr. Hicks has become an expert on Wilde. Much of the collection was built up through correspondence with rare book dealers in North America and England.

"The collection is rich for scholars who want to study the printed text through various editions," Dr. Garlock points out. In many cases, second and third editions, as well as later popular editions, are

included. The collection has, in addition, what Garlock calls "association value" — a personal association with the author — since some of the copies are signed.

There is also one manuscript piece, an autographed letter, in the collection.

Scholars of art history and history of the late 1800s will also be impressed with the cover and text illustrations by Aubrey Beardsley, Charles Ricketts, and Charles Shannon. "Book illustration was in its heyday in the 1890s," Dr. Garlock points out.

Items from the collection will be on display in the foyer and Special Collections area of the Killam Library until September. Later, the rare books will be kept in Special Collections, and the others will be available for students in the library stacks.

Dear Fellow Dalhousians:

This is the first issue of the **Alumni News** since my election as President, and I would like to thank the Alumni for the honor. Even more important, I want to ask for the help of every Dalhousie Alumnus (or Alumna), so that we may continue to improve our efforts during 1982-83.

The Association had a very successful year in 1981-82 under the dynamic leadership of Dr. Donna Curry. Branch meetings were held in eight Canadian centres and in London, Bermuda and New York. New programs were planned for the welcome and orientation of new students next fall. 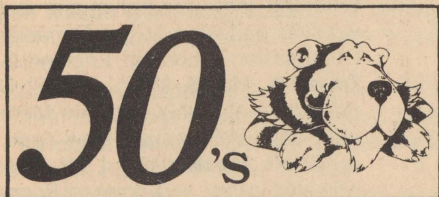

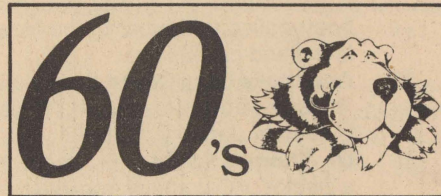
