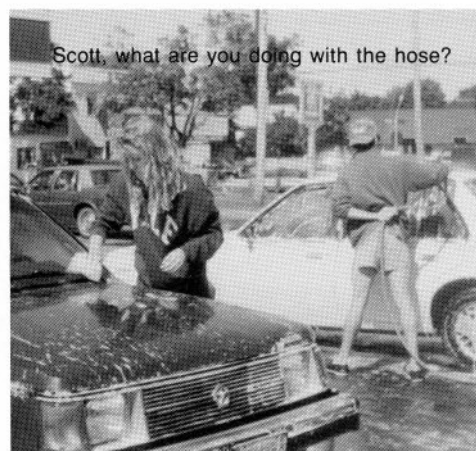
PHARMA-SEA

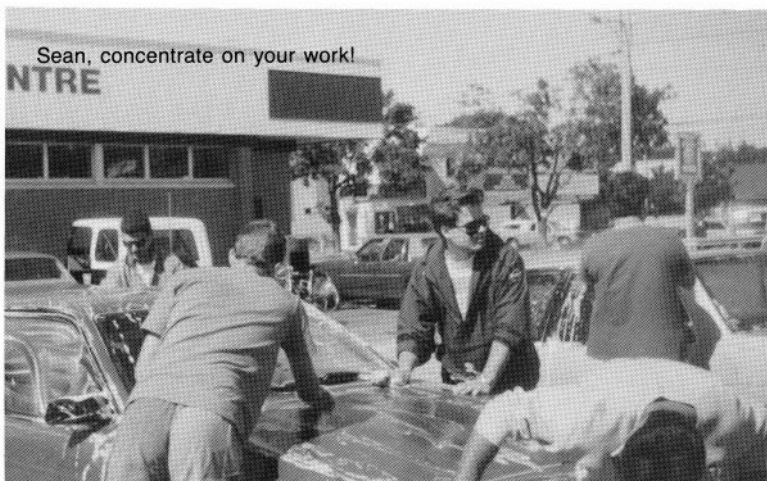

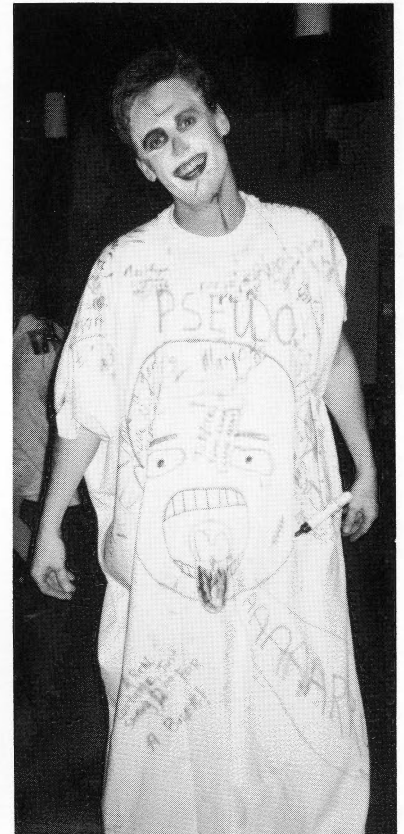
Sunshine, good location (Tim Horton's around the corner), hard workers, and plenty of cars made for a successful car wash. They really cleaned up!

First Year showed master thespian skills with their *Smurf* dramatization. Watch out next year for this dynamic group of actors.

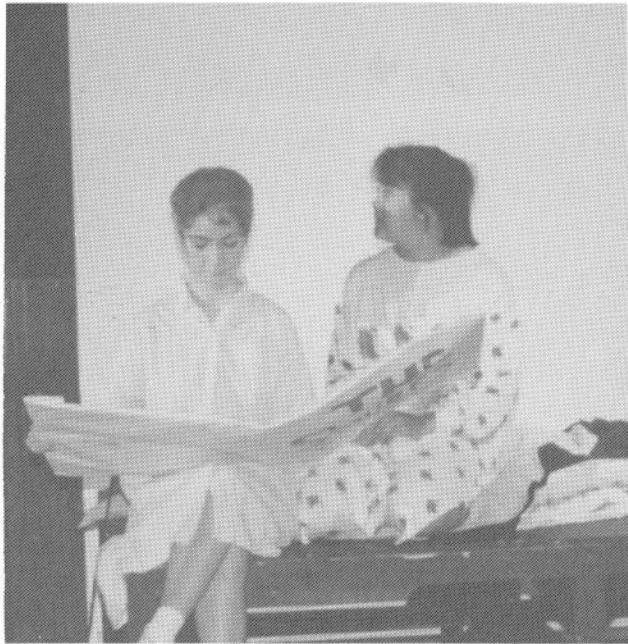
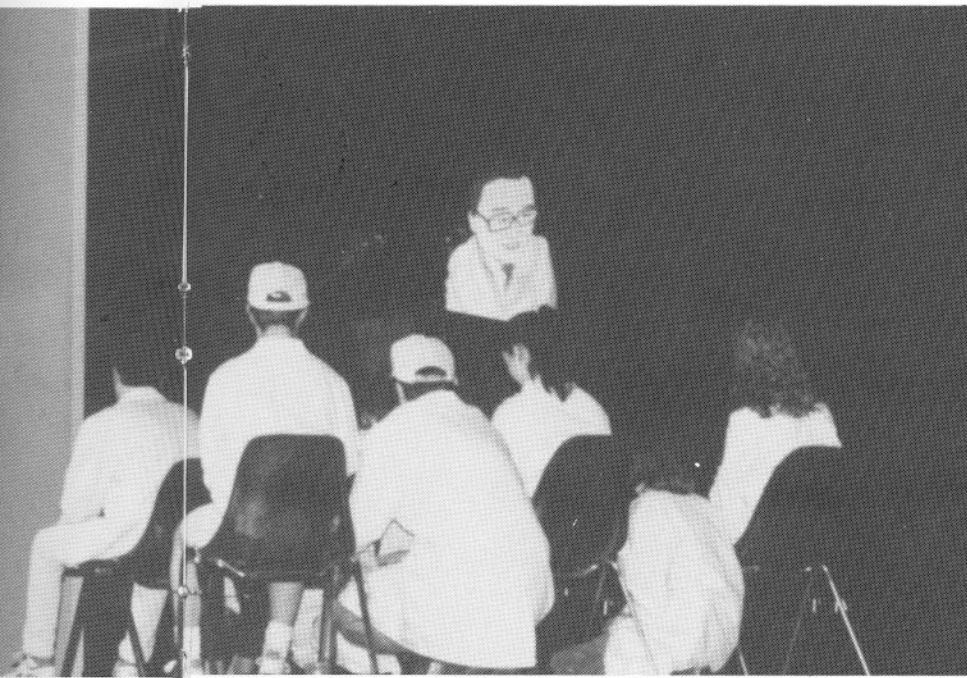
Second Year attempted a rendition of the *Muppet Show*. The theme was great but the acting.... Better luck next year people. Suggestion: acting lessons from 1st year.

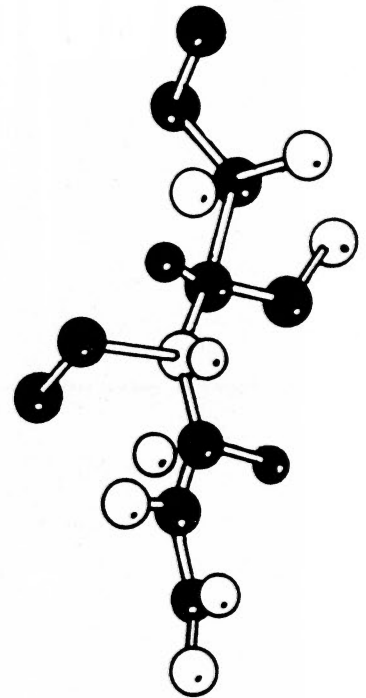
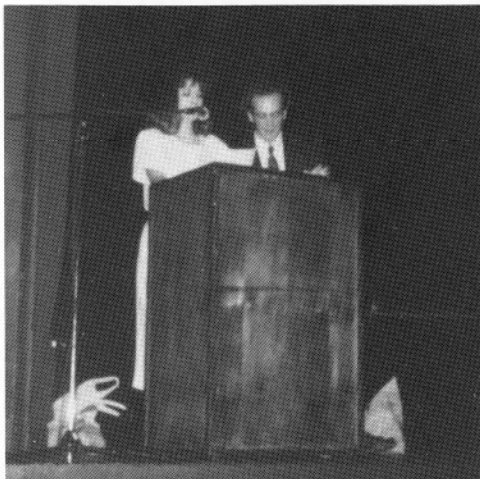

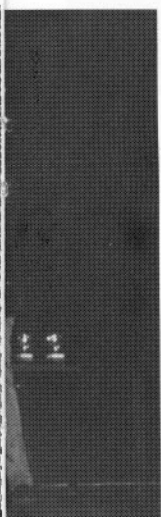
PHARMACY BANQUET

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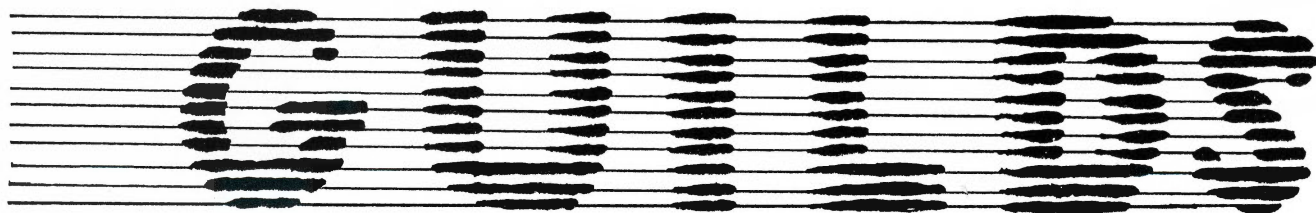
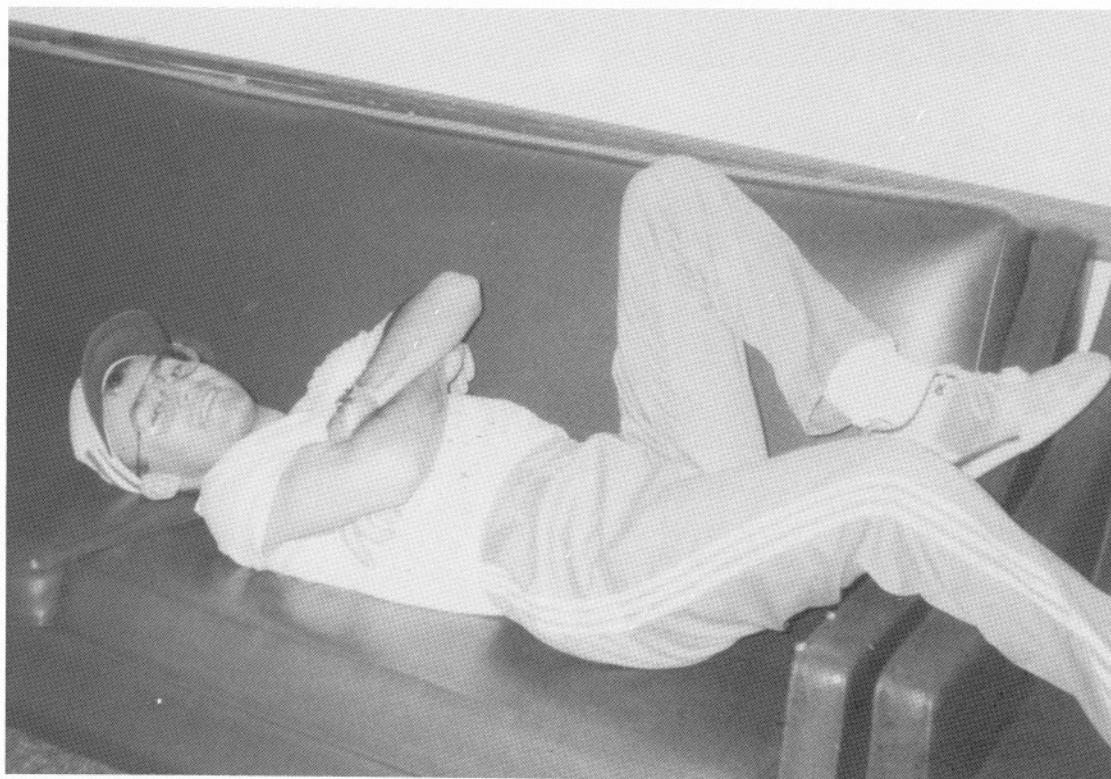
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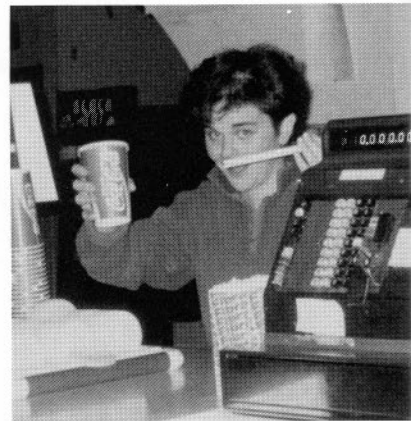


HIS SPOKEN WORD:

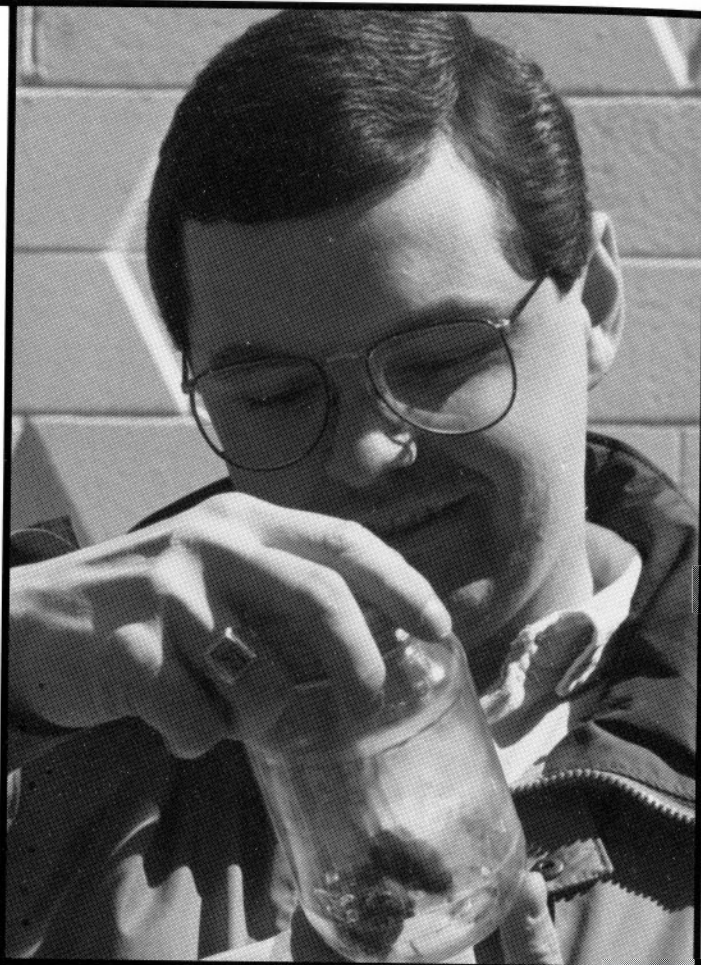
WHAT BEING SPORTS REP MEANS TO ME by Lora Dempsey

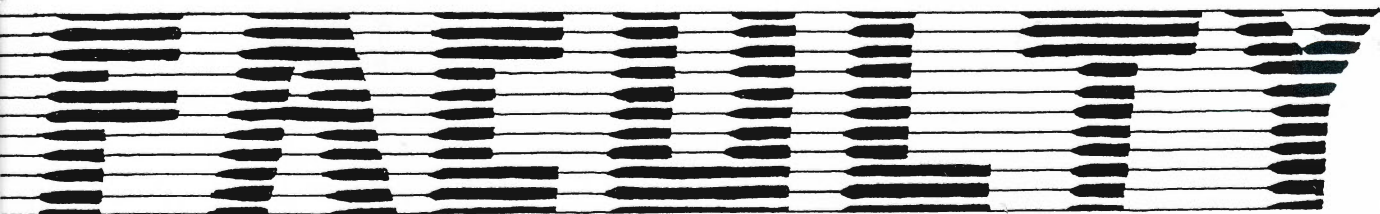
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OUR DIRECTOR

DR. F. CHANDLER

I thank you, the students of the College, for helping to make 1990-91 a full and rewarding year. Your activities and interactions with peers and faculty have helped foster team development within the College.

The team developed within the College must ultimately work together to implement progressive change in our profession which will facilitate health care promotion and facilitate the development of a cost-effective health care delivery system. If our profession is to progress in difficult times and offer a truly professional service to the general public, then the faculty, staff and students of the College and our practising colleagues will need to work as a cohesive team.

Health care is evolving and we can expect many changes in the system to impact upon us. Consequently, we will have to be flexible in our attitudes and behaviour and be progressive in our actions. Such a practice will be rewarding to you and beneficial to your patients and the rest of the health care team.

In last year's message, I expressed optimism about the future of the College. In spite of increasing financial restrictions, I continue to be optimistic. During this year the faculty completed a comprehensive self-study of the College. The report reviewed the existing resources (physical, human and financial), the accomplishments (both faculty and students) of the College, and made recommendations regarding the College's future. This report will serve as a major data base to assist us in our quest for the resources (faculty, staff, space and finances) that we believe we deserve. I don't expect our problems to be rectified quickly, but I do believe we will continue to develop and grow. With this growth, we will be better provided to serve you as practitioners and the community at large.

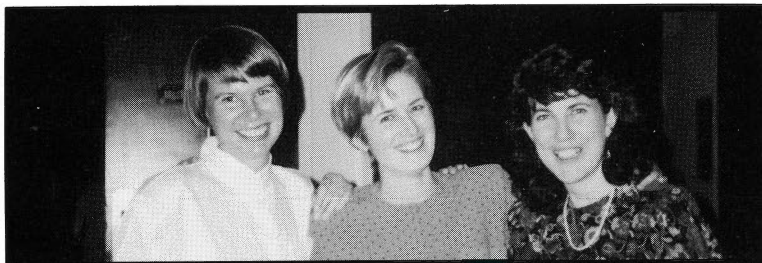

We wish you all the best as you leave these hallowed halls. Congratulations!!!

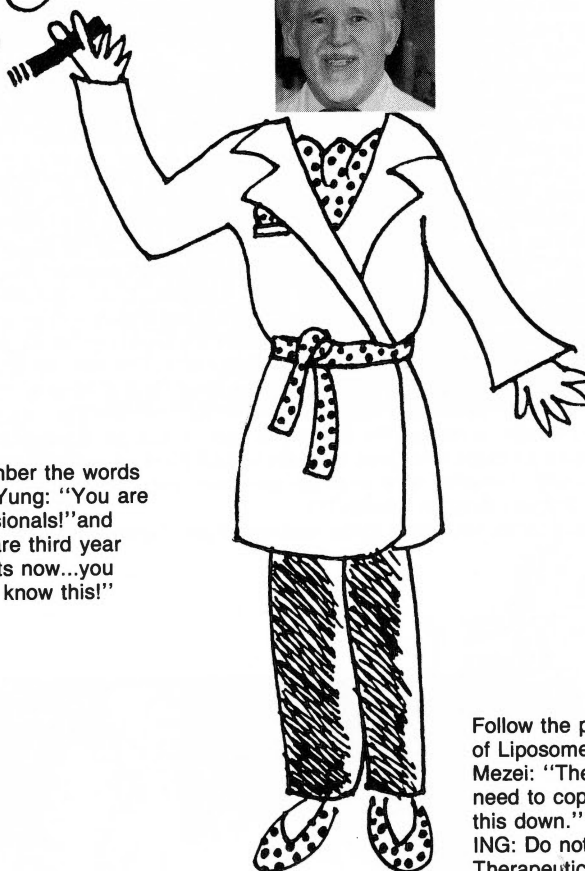
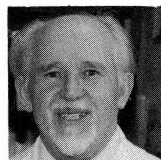

"Well the year surely kicked off to a great start with the tremendous success of the boat cruise, Sunday picnic and Orientation Week in general.

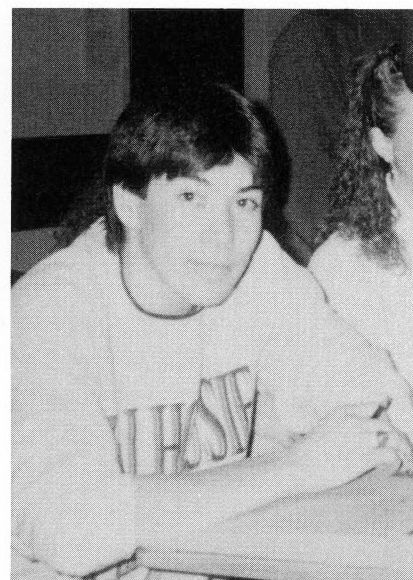
