I'm writing a letter that I feel I should have written years ago. It's something of a cross between a fan letter and a business letter. Many years ago I read most of your books. Between the ages of 13 and 16 *Pride's Fancy*, *His Majesty's Yankees*, and *The Nymph and the Lamp*, were my premier introductions to Canadian literature. My mother's family are all Nova Scotians and even though I was born in Ontario, this was a part of my heritage that I truly treasured. My grandfather, John Bigelow of Halifax, who I believe you were acquainted with some years ago, was the person who introduced me to your novels. At one point in school I came across *The Wedding Gift*, and I believe it to be the best short story I have ever had the pleasure of reading.


I recently read Roger Sudden and was enthralled by it. These days, as the manager of a successful bookstore in Guelph Ontario, I've had occasion to recommend books. Never have I had so many people come back to thank me for my recommendation as when I have pointed out your titles to them. This only serves to reinforce my feeling about your writing.
