T. H. Raddall Gets Award

TORONTO (CP)-Thomas H. Raddall, 57-year-old Liverpool, N.S., author, has been awarded the Doubleday Canadian novel prize of \$10,000 for his new book, The Governor's Lady.

The book, Mr. Raddall's 15th, will be published in September by Doubleday Company Incorporated in New York and by Doubleday Canada Limited, Tor-

The prize, which is open to Canadian writers and non-Canadians dealing with Canadian subjects consists of \$2,500 cash and \$7,500 guaranteed earnings.

Judges were Ralph Allen, Toronto author and former editor of Maclean's magazine; Thomas B. Costain, New York author and editor; George E. Nelson, president of Doubleday Canada Limited; William Arthur Deacon, literary editor of the Globe and Mail, Toronto; and Timothy Seldes, senior editor of Double-day and Company.

Mr. Raddall has won three governor-general's awards, and the Lorne Pierce gold medal for literature from the Royal Society of Canada of which he is a

fellow.

Mr. Raddall's first book, The Pied Piper of Dipper Creek, was published in 1939.
