Please take note that the next meeting of the Planning Council will take place in Kingston, Jamaica, on October 28, from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.

Details about accommodations and other technical matters will be sent to you during the next two weeks. I propose the following agenda:

- II. Progress report on the I.O.I.
- III. Financial report for the year 1971-72.
- IV. Study projects, 1972-73.
- V. Pacem in Maribus IV.
- VI. Other matters.

A preparatory conference on the peaceful uses of the Caribbean and the Gulf of Mexico will be held in Jamaica on October 26, 27, and the morning of October 28. A draft is enclosed. The project is directed by Ambassador Egerton Richardson of Jamaica, and the conference takes place under the sponsorship of the Government of Jamaica.

The study will differ significantly from our preceding Mediterranean studies. Among the respects in which they differ would be:

1. the oceanographic and associated climatic features,
2. the island arcs,
3. the extent and significance of the coastal lagoons and the associated mangrove forests,
4. the lesser orientation of the peoples of the marginal lands to the ocean area,
5. the cultural significance of the fact that the pre-Columbian movements of peoples were by land and those afterwards were across the Gulf and Caribbean only because it stood across their route to Europe, and
6. the existing economic disparities and the nature of the cultural differences.

Members of the Planning Council will be joined by a number of experts from the Caribbean and Gulf countries for the conference.

You should plan to arrive in Jamaica on the evening of October 25. We look forward to seeing you there.
