Dalhousie University, founded 1820, by the Earl of Dalhousie, had as original endowment funds collected as customs at the Port of Castine, Maine, in 1814, during its occupation by British forces.

It has faculties of Arts and Science, Law, Medicine, Dentistry, and cooperates with the Nova Scotia Technical College in Engineering.

The University buildings are to be seen on the old Carleton Street Campus - the second home of the institution, which was originally on the Parade Groung - and on the beautiful Studley Campus.

The University of King's College was affiliated with Dalhousie in 1925.

Dalhousie University, founded in 1820, has the Faculties of Arts and Science (with undergraduate courses leading to degrees and diplomas in: Arts, Science, Commerce, Music, Pharmacy, Fisheries, Engineering, Household Science and Education; and graduate courses leading the the Master's degree in Arts and in Science.), Law, Medicine and Dentistry. The University of King's College has been affiliated with it since 1925. The university buildings are to be seen on the Studley Campus and on the Carleton Street Campus. Total number of students registered at present is over one thousand.
