that here of course it could not be expected



I have seen a little bit of fighting  
 since I am in France. I am  
 so far I am looking for a letter from  
 you and your but as I did not  
 have any from you two since I can  
 come to France here it will be coming  
 soon I am sure. Yes tell Mother that  
 I sure would like to been with her to  
 the West End that evening I am sure  
 that I would have enjoyed it and  
 so they have it all about it I am  
 sure. He says I can see Mr Babster  
 jumping around now I used to like  
 to watch him well I suppose that you  
 are having it quite cool in old St  
 it is getting much cooler in France  
 now not very much it was nice and  
 warm yesterday and now today and  
 so far we are staying in an hard coal  
 around good. Wish that I could sit  
 by the old hall here to write my  
 letter. By the way how is that little  
 Jane of yours why don't you tell me  
 about her I loyd has she a good
