I am directed by the Registrar-General to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant, and your Cablegram of the 17th instant, and to confirm his reply Cablegram thereto:—

married Register Office Sheppey 18 July 1908  
Letter follows Registrar General".

A Certificate of the Marriage in question  
— is enclosed herewith.

With reference to any record of the Births in London of children of the above mentioned Marriage, I am to inform you that search has been made in the Indexes of Births registered in England and Wales in the years 1908 to 1912 inclusive in the surname of Croker, but without success. I am to state that in the absence of the Christian names of the children the search was necessarily restricted to Births registered in the Districts in London mentioned in your letter and to the Registration area in which the Marriage was solemnized.

The fees for the enclosed Certificate and for the unsuccessful search amounting to 7s/7d have been deducted from your remittance of £1, and the balance of 12s/5d is returned herewith.


