"This element of reasonable prevision of expectable harm soon came to be associated with a fictional Reasonable Man whose apprehensions of harm became the touchstone of the existence of duty in the same way as his conduct in the face of such apprehended harm became the standard of conformity to that duty."

This quotation occurs at page 140 but there are further quotations from the same judgment at pp. 144 and 166. You are no doubt familiar with this tribute from Mr. Fleming as I think at least one of the quotations occurs in his First Edition, but I thought you would be glad to know that your views on this subject are engaging the attention of members of this Court as well as that of the learned writer.
