An "Old Graduate", who does not wish his

name to be mentioned, has presented Dalhousie University with a contemporary engraving of the Honourable Joseph Howe. This will be added to the very interesting collection of portraits in Dalhousie's possession. "Old Graduate" says:

"No Dalhousian should ever forget Dalhousie's debt to Howe. In the forties he had risked position and popularity in the campaign to have one college in Nova Scotia. He then introduced and carried through the House of Assembly the Act that brought Dalhousie into being and started her on her glorious career. Sir Charles (then Doctor) Tupper, Leader of the Opposition supported him, and I have hopes that some other graduate will now provide a portrait of Tupper. Both Howe and Tupper were members of the first Board of Governors of the University."
