Dear Anton:

We have been out of touch for too long. And, then, when I was in Rotterdam for the RIO Board meeting, I heard that you had some trouble with your health. Of course you are working too hard, and you shouldn't. I am working too hard too, but women are tougher....

Please drop me a note and let me know how you are.

IOI matters are developing well. I have drafted a proposal for the Government of Malta to apply to the United Nations University to get the status of a UNU Campus for Ocean Studies. The proposal is well received at UNU, and this means, we may get a substantial financial support from UNU, probably not next year, but likely to start in 1983. We can expand, and do more things better.

At the same time, Prime Minister Trudeau is establishing here an International Centre for Ocean Development, which will absorb the Canadian part of our Training Programme. This, too will take a great burden off my shoulder.

I have just finished a major study for the World Bank on the potential of the new Law of the Sea for generating international Revenue, and shall send you a copy as soon as I have one.

I'll be in Germany from December 8-12, and shall try to give you a call.

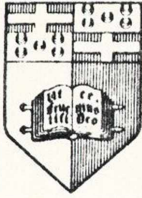

Dear Anton: The end of November came, and went. But you did not. I called the New York Mission upon my arrival here, and asked them to notify me of your arrival as soon as they knew about it, but I never heard from them again.

So now I must come to see you, in January. I will be in Zurich from December 22 until January 2; then I have to go to the Netherlands for a few days, but could come from there to Belgrade or Ljubljana. Again, I would prefer Belgrade, because then I also could see Perišić and Jovan and some other people. But perhaps I also could come both to Ljubljana and to Belgrade.

In the meantime I had the tragic news about the death of Vasa Nikolić. He was just about the best driver I ever knew. It is really scary. I feel very sad for his family, and will miss him when I come to Belgrade.

Under separate cover I am sending you a number of documents concerning our training programme, Pacem in Maribus X and some other odds and ends.

I am anxiously awaiting a report from Ambassador Wolf on the intersessional meeting in Geneva which he attended. It seems it was a rather small conference. I hope it was useful. I still feel very strongly that we must have a break-through on the joint-venture approach. Otherwise the common heritage will be taken over, lock, stock and barrel, by the multinationals, in particular, the oil companies and U.S. Steel. It is not an attractive prospect. Oddly enough, it is in this exotic sector of seabed mining that the conflict between the private and the public sector is coming to a head. We had better win in this confrontation, or otherwise there is not much hope for the New International Economic order.

I am appalled by the US-Iranian crisis which is taking us to the verge of total disaster.

Let me end on this cheerful note.

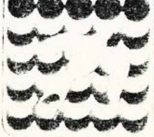

My dear Anton:

Please excuse me if I have not written to you before. Everything has been extremely hectic, but, in spite of the ugliness of the times in general, extremely promising. I have summed up all the recent positive developments in my letter to Brad Morse\* of which I am enclosing a copy.

This letter has to deal, primarily, with three items:

- (1) your visit to Dalhousie;
- (2) Our training programme in Ljubljana;
- (3) The workshop in Dubrovnik.

As to item (1), it appears that the Prep.Com. will wind up in Kingston on April 22. That is a Friday. I suggest that we go together to Halifax on the 23rd: on the 24th is my 65th birthday! -- and that, on Tuesday, April 26 we have the seminar that we have been discussing, at the Centre for Foreign Policy Studies.

On the 26th evening, we could proceed to Dubrovnik.

In Dubrovnik, we have the meeting of which you have been advised already from Malta: There will be a meeting of our Governing Bodies on April 28, with the purpose of discussing and adopting the 5-year plan of action and budget -- all of which, I hope, you have received, together with the minutes of the Mexico meeting. We hope that this Dubrovnik meeting will be very fully attended.

On April 29 and 30, we should be joined by the representatives of the U.N. agencies and institutions for (a) an evaluation of the Training Programme: (b) the establishment, if feasible, of a U.N. Advisory Council.

Keckes will be there: Mario Ruivo will be there; I don't know yet who will be the other representatives, but I do think the meeting should be brought to the attention of the civic authorities in Dubrovnik, and that perhaps, in

the limits of Austerity, a little reception might be arranged.

After that, you are a free man again!

Now, as to (2):

The programme begins on March 21, which means, participants will be arriving on the 20th and 19th.

I don't think there will be more than 12-15 participants.

They should be lodged together, preferably at the Center. We need, as soon as possible a budget for their living costs.

The participants would remain for five weeks, i.e., classes would be concluded Friday, April 23, and they would move to Aachen on the 24th. It is of course a pity, but unavoidable, that this coincides with Jamaica; but I am sure that your people, aided by Galindo Pohl, can hold the fort. I would try to be there for the opening (I would have to shift my class in Halifax, but that can be done).

Now as to the content of the programme --which will be followed by five weeks in Aachen and one week of field trip to Hannover and Hamburg, for the technical experience -- I would imagine a fairly simple organization:

Week 1: General introduction to the whole programme

Week 2: The Convention on the Law of the Sea and its impact on ocean mining (Parts XI and Annexes, Part V. in particular

Week 3: Common Heritage, ownership of resources, public enterprises in developing countries

Week 4: The economy of oil (offshore oil production: impact on local communities: coastal state responsibilities and liabilities: national legislation. *Workers' health and safety*

Week 5: Joint ventures; simulation exercise

Week 3 would be the special responsibility of the Center, but of course it would make inputs into the other weeks as well. And there might be one or two one-day excursions.

I am enclosing the outline for the German part of the programme, so you can see how it dovetails. There is one overlap, with regard to the EEZ, and I will bring this to the attention of the Aachen staff.

Now, I know I have been remiss in sending you these suggestions so late. Could you be so extremely kind as to help me to make up for lost time by sending me a long cable when you have examined this letter, giving your reactions to the over-all plan so that I can quickly implement it, and some figures so that we can make our budget.

As to the Class B course, at Dalhousie, Tommy Koh decided to take it this year. If I remember correctly, it is more convenient for you in any case to take it another year, when you don't have UNCTAD. So I am happy with this solution.

You might also just cable a phone number where I can reach you, and we can discuss everything over the phone. The best time for me to call you would be very early in the morning, Halifax time, i.e., between 11 am and 1 pm your time. But I also could call when it is evening in Yugoslavia. Please indicate the time at which I should call you in your cable.
