Dear Tom.

I was very glad to get your letter today. I have been thinking of writing to you for some time but that is as far as I get.

You certainly made a good job of the story - it could not have been better. You had everything pictured just as it was. I particularly got a kick out of the dinghy trip - you really had the ice crystals twinkling. Thanks for your tribute at the end I didn't deserve it and particularly not any more than the other two chaps.

Congratulations on the Sovereign-General award. I enjoyed the book very much as have several other patients here to whom I lent it. I'll have my eye open for your new book.

Ron Snow has been back at work since the first of January. He has made several trips since. I expect him up tomt, he just got back from his last trip, a Lancaster to U.K.

Caffman came back to work the first of March - he is flying

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on test crew at Aloual. His feet are still a little tender but he is feeling fine, very glad to get back to work.

I'm still holding down the bed on fourth floor Ross. Feeling fine and still enjoying this lazy life. My feet have been O.K. since the middle of January but they have a plastic surgeon working on me now. He is moving flaps of skin and flesh from the calves of my legs down to cover the bones of my toes. When he is finished my walking will be perfectly normal. It is a lengthy process though - I expect I'll be here another two months, a couple of weeks leave and then back to work. I sure will be glad to get back into it again.
