We are currently finalizing the manuscript for GALAXY, a grade 7 anthology for the Canadian school market. The anthology will consist of approximately 89 selections of all genres -- poetry, short stories, plays, non-fiction articles, etc. It will be hardcover, approximately 496 pages, with a publication date of April, 1990.
