JAZZ DANCING

Jazz dancing comes to the COHN on Friday, February 21 and Saturday, February 22 at 8:00 p.m. Les Ballets Jazz de Montreal will bring to the stage an evening of dance that explodes with energy.

Les Ballets Jazz de Montreal has been in existence for more than a decade. They've toured extensively from Venezuela to Senegal, from France to Sweden. They consistently draw capacity audiences and rave reviews.

Their repertoire includes works, many of them original creations, by such internationally known choreographers as Lousie Falco, Norbet Vesak, Brian Macdonald, and Judith Marcuse. Scores have been commissioned by Oscar Peterson, Trevor Payne, Paul Duplessis and Vincent Dionne, the result is dancing that entertains, wins the heart and exhilarates.

Interestingly, men especially, who might not find a natural attraction to classical ballet, easily become captured by the excitement of jazz dance. Audiences being introduced to the magic of dance through Les Ballets Jazz will often begin to discover the many other forms of dance expression available. Les Ballets Jazz consider themselves to be ambassadors for dance.

A review of a recent performance in Calgary summed up what can be said about Les Ballets Jazz. "Like the superlative music, the dancers' movements were pure jazz — cool, but capable of moving everyone from pathos to laughter and back again. They're bright, contemporary and very good."

The Tudor Singers of Montreal

The Tudor Singers of Montreal present an evening of eloquent choral music at the COHN on Monday, March 3 at 8:00 p.m.

Incorporated in 1966, the Tudor Singers have grown from a choral society to a top professional chamber ensemble. Under the guidance of founder-director, Wayne Riddle, the group has expanded on its initial repertoire, for which it was named, to an extremely varied repertoire from the most serious pieces to be most humourous and light pieces.

Wayne Riddle is termed "a choral trainer of genius" by music critics the world over. A native Quebecer, he instills in his singers a consistent sense of ensemble and musicality. His drive, personal discipline and sense of hugour are just a few of the attributes he brings with him as director of this prestigious choir. A graduate from McGuill University, he is recognized as one of Canada's distinguished musicians and is in constant demand to act as adjudicator for the Canada Council and others. He is choral master of the Montreal Symphony Orchestra and has been invited as guest conductor to numerous other

orchestras.

The twenty voices of the Tudor Singers are a solid, sensitive and well-balanced ensemble delivering a splendid blend of sound. Their oral and musical quality has taken them to the United Kingdom, France, Luxembourg and West Germany. They have made guest appearances with such groups as the Montreal Symphony Orchestra, the National Arts Centre Orchestra and the CBC Vancouver Chamber Orchestra.

Phyllis Diller is an irrepressible lady with an outrageous laugh. She's recognized as one of the leading female stand-up comics in the business. She's starred on television, in movies, and on the stage and she has headlined as a professional comic.

A late bloomer, Phyllis Diller didn't start her career until age 37. At the time she was a working housewife and mother of five. Urged by her husband she prepared a night club act and was booked into San Francisco's Purple Onion. Booked for two weeks, she stayed for 89!

Although films and television have been important to her success, Phyllis Diller has a special fondness for "live" performances. She's played every major supper club and concert hall across North America. Her approach to comedy is unique. She describes her comedy as "tragedy revisited", focusing on her sex life with her mythical husband, Fang, her mother-in-law, her next door neighbours, and the attempts of medical science to make her more attractive. There is no pariticular order to her zaniness but simply stated, she is always funny.

The real Phyllis Diller is quite different from her stage persona, though both share a rare good humor, and warmth and love of people. In private life she is a devoted mother, a fine cook, and well groomed — a far cry from the character she portrays so convincingly.

The Chieftains

On Tuesday, March 11 the COHN is pleased to welcome back world renowned Irish music makers, The Chieftains. They take the stage at 8:00 p.m. for a two hour performance of traditional celtic music.

The Chieftains presented their last performance at the COHN, to a capacity house, in 1984. They left behind an enthusiastic audience wanting more of the lively reels, jigs and ballads that express the vast musical heritage of Ireland.

The Irish sextet led by the multitalented Paddy Maloney includes Martin Fay, Sean Keane, Derek Bell, Kevin Conneff and Matt Molloy. The uniqueness of each member's musicianship has complemented, and contributed to, the superb talent of The Chieftains which has earned them the highest critical praise.

Together as a the group for more than 22 years, and with 13 albums to their credit, The Chieftains captured an audience that extends beyond its initial folk admirers to today's contemporary, pop, and rock listeners and artists alike.
