Dear Ms Borgese,

I regret the delay in replying to your letters of 24 November and 1 December 1975 inviting me to participate in your seminar on the New International Economic Order and the Law of the Sea from 14 to 16 January 1976, but I thought it would be prudent to wait until I knew for certain what my movements would be during January.

On present form, I expect I shall be available to attend the seminar, but since I believe you extended the invitation under the impression that I would only need to travel to Santa Barbara from New York, I do not think it fair to put you to the expense of financing a journey all the way from (and back to) Geneva, where I shall be at the material time, following a 2 week visit to Ghana on duty. I also have in mind the consideration that as the Ad Hoc Committee on Restructuring was unable to get down to substantive work at its November 1975 session, my contribution to the seminar would, I fear, be of limited value.
