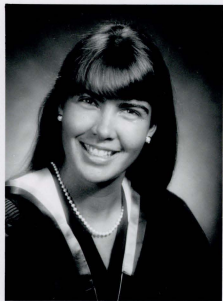
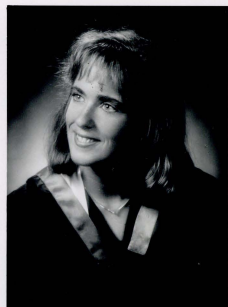


Jane Elizabeth Mitchell-Quigley, Halifax, N.S.

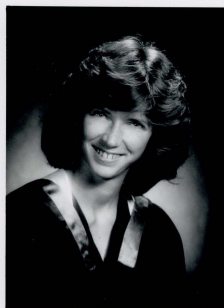

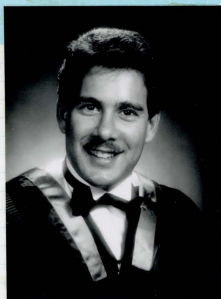

I wish to thank my fellow classmates for granting me the privilege of speaking on their behalf today. It is a great honor to stand here today and share with you some of our experiences and memories of the last three years and our expectations as to what our tomorrows hold in store for us.

It was a real challenge writing this speech. I racked my brains trying to arrive at a basic concept. I asked my classmates and friends for advice and finally I asked myself if I was in the audience, what would I really want to hear? So I decided to tell you a story- a story of how thirty-five unique individuals, most of whom had never met before, were brought together three years ago- unsuspecting of the many trials and tribulations to follow which would eventually draw them together and establish many close friendships and a camaraderie akin to that of a close-knit family.

It's orientation week. I remember that first day- not knowing a soul, everyone was very polite and proper wearing their "Hello My Name Is..." tags, looking around for their big sister or brother to cling to for moral support, and discussing that momentous occasion when we received that little white envelope from the registrar's office stating they had been accepted into the School of Physiotherapy- which in my opinion was the most difficult aspect of physio school. Once you got in, it was smooth sailing! It was this first activity-filled week which would set the stage for the foundation a bond of security such that we felt "Ok- we're in this together, let's stick together". We had no definite idea of what was ahead of us except a few horror stories which trickled down from the years previous. Such things as: writing thirteen exams in one week was not uncommon ("Oh but you'll get used to it" they would calmly state), or practical examinations- a true test of cardiovascular stability or memorizing every nook and cranny of the human body for anatomy. Undaunted, we gulped our fears and forged ahead. It was soon discovered in the days to follow, our unprecedented tolerance for the distinctive odour of gross anatomy labs which became ingrained into our pores and was basically part of our lives and skin for the next eight months because no amount of soap, perfume or industrial strength disinfectant would work to remove the smell. We really knew who our true friends were that year! We also realized during exam week, the lengths we would reach in order to avoid studying- like picking the lint off that favorite sweater or cleaning up the apartment- I can tell you, my apartment never looked so clean. The first term high peetered out around Christmas and we settled into second term with the mysteries of neuroanatomy becoming a fact of life every Monday morning. We were all patiently awaiting the day when "everything would click into place". I think some of us are still waiting. The days became weeks, weeks turned into months and before we knew it, second year was over, but not without its celebratory rewards. In such an intense program, student morale was an important aspect and was boosted many times throughout the year with social functions at the school, get togethers at classmates houses and of course, the Halifax bar industry didn't suffer that year.

Older, wiser and certainly more mellow, we returned as third year physios ready to tackle electrotherapy. This is the course where everyone managed to do something wrong in the practical exam- i.e. forgetting to plug in the machine (which we tried to cover up by saying we were testing the placebo effect), treating the knee joint instead of the hip joint, or you're already to set up a treatment only to discover someone stole your machine at the last minute. With our minds filled with physical principles on transformers, wattage and voltage, we developed a new respect for the world of electricity and its application to therapy.

The day drew closer when we would be thrown out into the hospitals to begin our summer clinical internship. This was the setting by which our academic knowledge and clinical skills learned from the previous two years was to be implemented. This practical component was an invaluable aspect of the program and we arrived in fourth year with numerous stories and tales from our summer placements.

Fourth year seemed to be one big meeting. There was always lunch hour meetings for one thing or another and we wondered how we ever got through the last two years without our daily planner. Life spelled disaster if you lost your daily planner! We also discovered the world of research- where nothing goes smoothly and our best friend was good ol' Mac the Computer. The computer room was always filled with physios madly typing -the two finger method- to get a paper in on time. Computer time became a valuable commodity during the latter part of the year. One budding entrepreneur in our class discovered a brilliant method by which he could have made alot of money was to overbook computer time and sell it to desperate students! And of course our favorite interest of fourth year was of a -shall we say-non-traditional aspect. Determining a non-traditional role for physiotherapy was a challenge and I'm sure the professors will agree that some of the topics came from the deep corners of our imagination.
