Dear Gustavo,


I am writing you in English because I am giving a copy of this letter to Elisabeth Mann Borgese, the Chairman of the Planning Council of the International Ocean Institute, who will attend, probably in a capacity of consultant, the Law of the Sea Conference which will be held in Caracas from the end of June to the end of August. She plans to stay all that period in Caracas, and would like very much to find an apartment, or better a house, big enough for 4 or 5 people, because from time to time some other members of the IOI will be visiting her during the Conference. If place for meetings of 7-8 persons is available in the house, so much the better.

Elisabeth is the daughter of Thomas Mann, and she still has the name of her former husband, a splendid Italian professor of literature and anti-fascist, who went to America in the early thirties. She is totally devoted to some of the most important causes and has centered most of her activities since 4 or 5 years in the oceans. She is a Senior Fellow of the Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions of Santa Barbara, a member of The Club of Rome, and has been responsible for some of the best initiatives for the protection of nature and enhancement of humankind you may have heard of. Pacem in Maribus is her creature.

Is it possible for you to give her a hand in finding this house or apartment? Of course, the IOI is ready to pay a reasonable rent, but there might be some accommodation you may think of which is not so costly as everything in Caracas for the short period of the Conference.
