

The AUDIO BY ARTISTS FESTIVAL is an annual event now in it's sixth year. The festival was initiated as an opportunity to highlight non-traditional musical performances. Over the years the festival has evolved into a larger configuration incorporating performances, gallery shows, installations, video tapes, commissioned audio tapes, and radio programs. By including work of such a diverse nature, the festival provides the widest possible definition and presentation of artists' use of audio.

The festival is an opportunity for visual artists, performers, and composers to explore and demonstrate the creative use of sound. The goal is to provide a forum for different artistic disciplines to integrate their skills and sensibilities. The festival explores the important relationship between sound and visual media.

The AUDIO BY ARTISTS FESTIVAL 1985 is organized and administrated by David Craig, Andy Dowden, Paula Fairfield, Gordon Laurin, and Micah Lexier. The festival is sponsored by Centre For Art Tapes and Eye Level Gallery, two local artist-run, non-profit art centres. Funding for the festival

Audio Arts is a England based art magazine distributed on cassette tape. The series is edited by William Furlong who produces approximately four issues a year plus numerous supplement cassettes. The cassette magazine includes poetry, artist's statements, audio works, music, interviews, historical recordings, and documentation of audio events. The exhibition will contain the complete twelve year output of Audio Arts history including the most recent issue which contains a twenty minute segment on the Halifax art and audio community.
