

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The Man with the Plan: A Note From the Director

The cartoonist Walt Kelly said of America in the 1960s "We have met the enemy and he is us." Since the collapse of what Ronald Reagan dubbed "the evil empire" and with it the threat of invasion from outside, American popular art has focused more and more on this idea of the threat from within—terrorism, plague, ecological disaster. <u>Urinetown</u> plays this idea against an old-fashioned story of youthful, idealistic revolution and the result is a somber look at humanity's prospects set to a lot of happy tunes. It's been a pleasure to explore how the ironies and ambiguities play out in this funny and deceptively simple story, and it's also been a sobering experience to realize how potentially truthful the material is. At one point, Officer Lockstock asks, "Don't you think people want to be told their way of life is unsustainable?" The success of this show suggests they might, but only if you can leave the theatre humming the tunes ...

Sing of Today!

Revolution is a theme commonly explored by the popular media. Many of the top films ever produced feature large-scale revolution or rebellion. The heroes of both *Ghandi* and *Schindler's List* are examples of non-violent resistance, the tamest type of rebellion. More radical types include resistance to an occupying invader by freedom fighters (*The Matrix*, the original *Star Wars* trilogy), and mutiny (*Mutiny on the Bounty*). Urinetown (the musicall) tells a story of revolt: a localized rebellion that, while wanting some form of change, lacks foresight. While they might overpower the local forces they often fail to defeat the larger enemy. "It's the oldest story...."

What is Urinetown?

Urinetown (the musical) came about when Greg Kotis (a performer with the Neo Futurists in Chicago) realized that peeing in Paris was something he couldn't always afford. He was in the midst of an ill-planned European trip, armed with only 300 dollars and he quickly found himself broke and faced with a city filled with pay-per-use amenities. This is where the idea came to him of a town where a monopolizing corporation controlled all public toilets (and that you couldn't just go in the bushes either- there's laws against it). Upon returning to New York, Kotis approached his friend and collaborator Mark Hollmann and pitched his idea. Over the next three years the two would meet after church services (Hollmann played the organ) and write the show. Originally the two thought no one was going to come and see this musical (after all the title was awfull), except maybe their families and friends, but the show took on a life of its own and ended up in the New York Fringe Festival. After re-writes, re-casting and bringing in guys with big bucks, Urinetown transferred from off-Broadway to Broadway in August 2001 and people ran for freedom there for three years.

HAIL MATHUS



Thomas Malthus (1766-1834) was a political economist concerned about the decline of living conditions in

nineteenth century England. He blamed this decline on three elements: The overproduction of young; the inability of resources to keep up with the rising human population; and the irresponsibility of the lower classes. Malthus suggested the family size of the lower class ought to be regulated such that poor families do not produce more children than they can support. In his theory of Natural Selection, Darwin extended Malthus' logic. He realized that producing more offspring than can survive establishes a competitive environment among siblings, and that the variation among siblings would produce some individuals with a slightly greater chance of survival

ART DECO

The title "art deco" was derived from the 1925 Exposition Internationale des Arts Decoratifs Industriels et Modernes in Paris. The style, at its height between 1920-1939, is a "modernization" of many artistic styles and themes from the past. Modern elements included echoing machine and automobile patterns and shapes such as stylized gears and wheels, or natural elements such as sunbursts and flowers. The term can be applied to architecture as well as fine and applied arts such as furniture, sculpture, clothing, jewelry and graphic design. Techniques used by art deco artists include banding, use of terra cotta or stainless steel, nautical elements and circles.



Trample Out A Treason With Hobnail boots!

Hobnail Boots are Combat Boots that lace up the front and has a thick rubber outer sole. They have been used since antiquity as inexpensive, durable footwear often worn by military. Hobnails, short nails with a thick head, are usually installed in a regular pattern over the entire sole to increase their durability.



Don't Be the Bunny Caldwell B. Cladwell's Famous Recipe

Ha*sen*pfef*fer. A German delicacy of stew made from marinated rabbit. 1 Serving: 1 Rabbit Salt water 1 Onion 12 Cloves Flour Equal parts butter and lard Little cinnamon 1 Tablespoon of Vinegar More flour



Soak rabbits in salt water several hours: rinse with clear water. Put in Pot and cover with water, adding onion studded with cloves. When tender, remove from pot, roll in flour and fry in fats until brown. Just before it's done, add cinnamon and vinegar; cover and let smother a minute or two. Put rabbit on platter, make gravy with pan drippings and flour, then add cooking liquid from boiling the rabbit. Pour gravy over the rabbit and serve.
