### AT THE ART GALLERY...

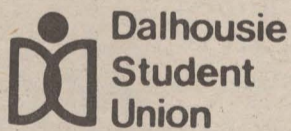

POSITION	RESPONSIBILITIES
1) Chairperson	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- making an agenda for meetings</li> <li>- chairing all council meetings</li> <li>- in the case of a tied vote the Chairperson has the deciding vote, otherwise this is a non-voting position</li> <li>- should be familiar with Roberts Rules of Order</li> <li>- honoraria of \$20 per meeting</li> </ul>
2) Recording Secretary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- taking minutes at all council meetings</li> <li>- distribution of minutes before next meeting</li> <li>- non-voting member</li> <li>- honoraria of \$20 per meeting</li> </ul>
3) Dispatch Editor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- editing and distribution of the Dispatch</li> <li>- gathering of articles and photographs, layout</li> <li>- honoraria \$30 per issue</li> </ul>
4) Elections Returning Officer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- the running of all referendums and all regular Dalhousie Student Union elections</li> <li>- has no vote in elections unless there is a tie in which case they have the deciding vote</li> <li>- honoraria of \$500</li> </ul>
5) Winter Carnival Chair	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- responsible for the planning and implementation of Winter Carnival activities</li> <li>- accountable for Winter Carnival budget expenditures</li> <li>- responsible for Society contact and participation; and advertising</li> </ul>
6) Orientation Chair	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- as with Winter Carnival, but responsible for Orentaton '87</li> <li>- also responsible for Shine-rama and Off-Campus Frosh Squad</li> </ul>
7) Member at Large	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- representaton of those students on campus who may have no other representation on council</li> <li>- voting member</li> </ul>

## Committees:

1) Constitution Committee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- committee includes a Chairperson, President, and one other councillor</li> <li>- responsible for going through the constitution and making revisions, additions, and amendments to the constitution (1 position)</li> </ul>
