# A Tradition of Expanding Service

The cover picture on this issue of *The News*, showing a long line of freshmen waiting to register for classes at Dalhousie, symbolizes the problem facing most Canadian Universities today—the problem of rapidly expanding student populations.

Five years ago enrollment at Dalhousie was slightly in excess of 1600 students. This year approximately 2500 students have registered. While the rapid growth in enrollment has caused some crowding, the University has been able to accommodate all qualified students who have registered.

The present facilities and staff at Dalhousie are not nearly adequate to accommodate the numbers of students who will be seeking admittance during the next decade. It has been forecast that enrollment will reach 3500 by 1966 and 5000 by 1971-72.

The problems created by the expanding student population leaves the University two basic alternatives. The first would be to restrict enrollment to a level consistent with present facilities and to educate only those students who can be accommodated. But this course of action does not seem to be morally correct, especially in the Atlantic Provinces where Dalhousie offers the only courses in Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Dental Hygiene, and is one of two Universities offering degrees in Law.

The second alternative would be to expand the facilities, staff and finances at Dalhousie to sufficient size to make it possible to accommodate all students who, having the necessary qualifications, seek admittance to the University. This second alternative is one that is in keeping with Dalhousie's long tradition of expanding service to meet the growing needs of the constituency.

The need for new funds is inescapable. As an independent, endowed institution, responsible only to the people it serves Dalhousie University addresses its appeal for funds to all those who believe, as did Lord Dalhousie, that for the good of society a university must be given the power to expand, and enable to flourish.

Thus it is, that the Board of Governors has faced up squarely to the problem and has decided to launch a five-year \$16,100,000 expansion programme for Dalhousie. In order to ensure the continuance of the high standards established and maintained at the University, Dalhousie will seek funds for the programme under the following headings:

HIGH**

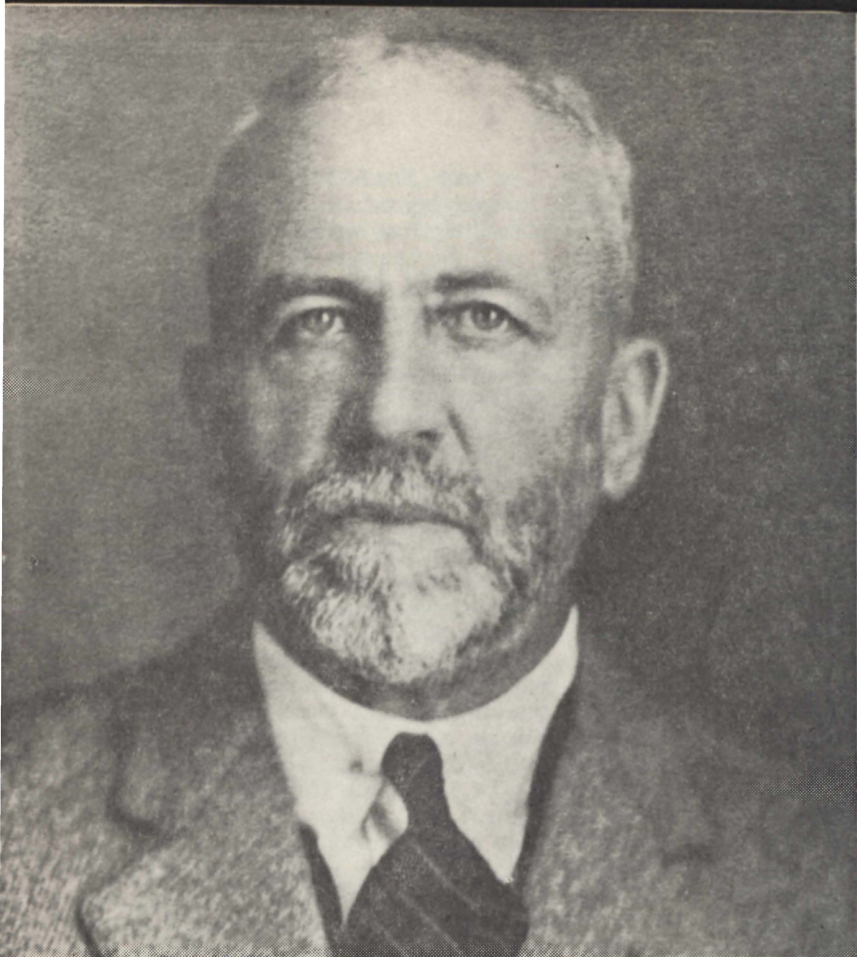
An increase in student enrollment of 253 over last year has sent registration figures soaring to 2512—the highest in Dalhousie's history.

This year 963 students registered at Dalhousie for the first time, and of this number, almost 500 have never been to university before.

## DR. ARCHIBALD MacMECHAN

—An article abridged from a lecture  
given to Homecoming Alumni in  
May 1962

Those of you who knew Dr. MacMechan will agree that there is no better topic that I could select, for a gathering such as this, than a reminder to them, and to your alumni, of the man who for more than forty years brought distinction to Dalhousie as a teacher, a scholar, and a writer, and as a devoted admirer and chronicler of the University, of the old city of Halifax, and of the ancient Province of Nova Scotia. To all of these he came as a stranger, and all of them he made his own. He came to Dalhousie in 1889, and taught continuously until he retired in 1931. He died in harness in July, 1933, while teaching Canadian literature on the Dalhousie Campus to the Nova Scotia Summer School. June 1962 will mark the exact centenary of his birth. It becomes characteristic, in retrospect, that he had hardly begun his teaching here before he began to collect material for a work on his predecessor, James de Mille, who taught English at Dalhousie from 1864 until his death in 1880. Planned as a book, MacMechan's careful notes finally saw print as a magazine article, in which it was recorded that after the lapse of a quarter of a century De Mille's old students wrote and spoke of him with deep affection and respect—an honour accorded to few, but one that was shared by Dr. MacMechan. With

many of his best students, he kept up a lifelong correspondence; and his memory is perpetuated in the city and the college by the Archibald MacMechan Chapter of the I.O.D.E.—founded by former students—and the graduate scholarship in English that its members have endowed. Dr. MacMechan confirmed for English studies the real beginning of Dalhousie following the benefactions of George Munro. His teaching combined the enthusiasm of DeMille with the scholarship of W. J. Alexander, who after less than a decade at Dalhousie brought distinction for many years to Toronto.

First, as a teacher, because it was first and foremost as a teacher that he thought of himself and that he would have wished to be remembered: Single-handed for thirty years he taught English in its three major divisions—language, literature and composition—and taught it well, to all students in Arts and Science at Dalhousie. Arts and Science has multiplied perhaps five times since then, the Department has grown by twice that, and the range of instruction is correspondingly greater; but the foundations were so truly laid, and the ground so well covered in essentials, that MacMechan's scholars were able to obtain high rank as students and move to high positions as teachers

in the greatest universities. Of the students to whom advanced scholarship in English—or perhaps in any field of study—was a secondary consideration, an unattainable goal, or perhaps a matter of indifference among the competing attractions of university life, none could sit under him without learning at least to respect great writing by the masters, and the virtue of practising good writing by all who use our language. One of his first and most distinguished pupils, Garnet Sedgwick, in a memorial tribute in *The Dalhousie Review*, attributes his influence to the impression of “a personality fused and harmonized into a work of art—just as . . . he made a fine art of life” . . . “His years were spent, consciously or unconsciously, in selecting his own proper materials and in passing things by that were not to the purpose.” Although our interests, tastes and methods differed greatly, some of Dr. MacMechan's principles had their effect on my own understanding of literature, and on my presentation of two of the authors who became my special concern at Dalhousie—Milton and Carlyle. And so I would like, in all humility, to add myself to the long list of those who were influenced by Dr. MacMechan's undergraduate teaching. As a setter and marker of “themes”—for which I may someday be forgiven—I would like to

pay a special tribute to his insistence on clear and precise composition. Both in and out of the special field of English, Dalhousie writing has been better than average, and much of the credit goes to the meticulous correction that was made over the characteristically neat but individual hieroglyph—A.M.—with which Garnet Sedgwick headed his tribute.

■ In writing, he demanded, as he practised, clean, spare and accurate expression—"never the big word for the little thing"—order, balance, consistency. As in other interests, he had his idiosyncracies. When I once suggested a semi-colon he damned the offending spot with a curt "I never use it", and that was that. And if my first and only letter before coming here had chanced to include the phrase "in connection with" I would not have been here today, or at all. His grading of examinations, with which I sometimes helped, was at times original, and in the complicated apportionment of marks he eschewed fractions as he did the semi-colon, and worked only in decimals. But whether by arithmetic or by intuition, justice was done, and usually tempered with mercy.

A teacher must be judged not only by the generality of his students, but also—and professionally this is the acid test—by the select few who proceed to advanced work in his subject. Here again, Dalhousie has a good record for which Dr. MacMechan set by himself a standard that has called for the best efforts of his successors. I have mentioned Garnet Sedgwick, who came to Dalhousie in 1898, took Honours in Greek and English, went to Harvard for his Ph.D. and influenced the teaching of English in British Columbia for over forty years. To Harvard also, MacMechan sent two students who remained as Professors—K. G. T. Webster, the Medievalist whose special collection is now one of the prized possessions of the Dalhousie Library—and John Tucker Murray, whose work on the Elizabethan Dramatic Companies is still the standard. Also in drama, Roy MacKenzie—better known for his pioneer work on Nova Scotia ballads—wrote a scholarly history of the English morality plays, and James W. Tupper—who recently endowed a postgraduate scholarship in English for Dalhousians going on to higher degrees elsewhere—became an authority on the Drama of the Restoration. Moving from these examples to my own time, we shared among others, Arthur Jewitt and Max MacOdrum, both of whom became University Presidents as well as recog-

nized scholars, Roy Wiles now Head of English at McMaster and author of the standard Canadian guide to research-writing in the Humanities, and the late Harold Wilson, who though he took only a pass B.A. found MacMechan's last year (as I recall) of English 2 the passport to a course that led to a high place in Canadian scholarship.

The respect with which his students were received showed that Dr. MacMechan had the third great mark of a teacher and scholar—the approbation of his colleagues, which stemmed not less from the work of his pupils than from his own published works of scholarship. Although his Doctoral Thesis at Johns Hopkins was written on the Relation of Hans Sachs to the Decameron, he was best known for his editions of Carlyle. In his last course of lectures at Harvard in 1928, Professor Bliss Perry said: "When I began to teach *Sartor Resartus* the only fully edited text was that of Dr. MacMechan. After forty years, it is still the best". I am still using that text myself, although it is out of print and if any former students can lend me their copies of MacMechan's *Sartor* for the first term, my students and I will be grateful.

Besides *Sartor Resartus*, he edited a companion edition of Carlyle's *Heroes and Hero Worship* and also a selection of the poems of Tennyson, which recalls his enthusiasm for one of Tennyson's illustrators, the artist E. J. Sullivan, who designed the bookplate that you may find in the volumes from his library that are now at the University. After he came to Dalhousie, however, MacMechan's private scholarship turned towards the history and especially the maritime history of Nova Scotia; for like many another landsman from the interior—he was born in Ontario and his first degree was from Toronto—he developed a passion for the sea. He compiled two volumes for the Nova Scotia Archives, and wrote the volume on "The Winning of Responsible Government" in "The Chronicles of Canada". The Nova Scotia Archives, and the modern fully equipped building, came to the campus too soon before his death. In it he had hoped to do much research in his retirement. It houses his collection of ship plans, moulds, models, and pictures; and his best stories, which combine accuracy with adventure, are those about the sea: of pirates and privateers, of courage and endurance, of the building of "The Great Ship", and of voyages to the south seas. He could hardly escape an interest, in which personal

enthusiasm and critical insight reached their climax, in the works of Herman Melville. When *Moby Dick* caused Melville to be "re-discovered" after almost fifty years of neglect, Dr. MacMechan was one of the first to proclaim his genius, following closely after Clarke Russell with "The Greatest Sea Story Ever Written" in the *University Quarterly*. Dr. V. L. O. Chittick, an Acadia graduate and author of the standard work on Haliburton, is still convinced that MacMechan was more than that; in a recent letter he wrote, "Here as elsewhere, Archie led the field". But MacMechan's love for the sea stemmed chiefly from Nova Scotia. In an essay on "The Vanity of Travel" he questioned the wisdom of leaving home and for most of his writing years, Nova Scotia—his "Ultima Thule"—gave him a happy home and a happy abundance of matter for the scholar and the man of letters. A series of books, and his continuous weekly column for the Montreal *Standard* gave him an unquestioned place as Dean of Canadian essayists in the first quarter or third of the century.

With so much knowledge and enthusiasm for Canada at Large, and especially for this small corner so replete with beauty, with history, and with character, Dr. MacMechan, whether in print or in person, was the perfect guide; and I owe much to him for my own transformation—if I may claim these distinctions—into a Nova Scotian, a Haligonian, and a Dalhousian. Our first expedition together was a perfect introduction: he took me on the official boat that followed the schooner "Bluenose" in her triumphant series of international races. The finish of the race was celebrated by a visit to 72 Victoria Road, and a magnificent chowder provided by Mrs. MacMechan—the first of many visits to a charming and hospitable home. In walks around the Park, the Arm, and the Bedford Basin he led me to appreciate the brilliance of sea and sky, but also pointed out the charm of mist and silvery gray. (He was an early friend and

admirer of Wallace McAskill, who excelled in soft tones and became known as the world's best marine photographer). Of autumn colours he preferred the duller glow of underbrush to the scarlet and gold and bronze that caught the eye of the less observant, and above all in the Canadian woods, he admired the translucent fleeting veil that precedes the sudden bursting into green leaf in the spring. Among later expeditions I recall one into the woods near Stewiacke to discuss esoteric questions of timber, grains, and the proper use of the adze with Joseph Howe Waddell, who had begun as a shipwright, whose particular craft was the trimming of masts and spars, and who had finally retired inland to specialize in the making of flag staffs. Most memorable of all was the journey, for which I was allowed to act as chauffeur, along the Noel Shore to Maitland, to get some personal details from descendants for the story of "The Great Ship". From this expedition I recall one of many incidents that remind me of the personality that helped to make, and even to transcend, the teacher, the man of letters, and the historian. Stopping for lunch, we drove to a barn beside a house whose occupants appeared to be away for the day. In a trice, the Doctor proved himself to be a real campaigner by putting up planks and trestles as tables and benches and setting out lunch with both skill and style (on the way home, he cooked lamb chops over an open fire, and I have never tasted better). While we were enjoying our meal and conversation as it might be at a University club or senior common room, the family from next door decided to investigate. Headed by father, a massive and imposing figure in overalls, and trailing from mother and the larger sons and daughters down to toddlers, they advanced in single file and inquiring if not in threatening mien towards the trespassers. The Doctor continued with his meal and his observations on the beauty of the estuary of the Avon, and paid no attention to the interlopers—for so they clearly were to him—until he could see the whites of their eyes. Then he fixed the head of the procession with the famous eyeglasses on their black silk ribbon and, making a neat and complete U-turn that would have done credit to a military band, the procession went into reverse and retired to its own premises. Luncheon continued without comment.

When we reached Maitland he gathered some first-hand details for his paper on "The Great Ship", which you

may find in *There Go the Ships*, or in the selection of *Tales of the Sea* made by Thomas Raddall, who though not a student at Dalhousie, has done most to continue the work of a man whom he is proud to honour and whose influence he is glad to acknowledge. Since Raddall thought some comments of mine in a memorial article worth quoting in his introduction, one of them may be repeated here: "He had no patience with vulgarity and could not feel at home with people of petty or mercenary interests. But he had a true culture that placed him on terms of equal easy friendship with men whose work was dignified by hard struggle with the elements on land or sea. To accompany him on his rambles was to see another side of a man to whom every honourable aspect of life was interesting". In print, however, he had the scholar's reticence, and his subject whether men or incidents told their own story. Inevitably, his gift for prose, his scholarship, his knowledge and love for the province combined in books about his beloved Nova Scotia.

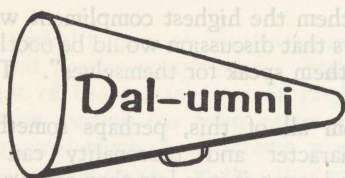
For Dalhousians there is interest in *The Porter of Bagdad*, his first book, and *The Life of a Little College*, which is not all about Dalhousie, although the first essay provides the title. Works of scholarship and major history have been mentioned. There is one, complete but never published, that deserves special mention: *The Halifax Disaster*, an account of the great explosion of 1917, with the invariable combination of accurate knowledge and lucid prose that set its seal on everything he did. His typescript, in perfect shape for the printer and with carbons and supporting documents, is in the Treasure Room of our Library. Why it was not published, I can not say: possibly because it had neither sensational journalism nor a parade of statistics or sociological jargon. He told his story, and told it well. I remember remarking, with some diffidence, having admired and enjoyed "There Go the Ships" and "Old Province Tales" and *The Book of Ultima Thule*, that I was especially impressed by the first book of his that I had read—*Sagas of the Sea*—possibly because it was my first by him and of Nova Scotia. He seemed pleased, and said that it represented most clearly what he had striven to do with the proud history of Nova Scotia's ships and sailors, finding the facts, and stating them in the clearest and plainest terms. Raddall, who knows the sea as historian, writer, and sailor, confirms this preference, and

pays them the highest compliment when he says that discussion would be bootless: "Let them speak for themselves". They do.

From all of this, perhaps something of character and personality can be inferred, even if it is less than adequately expressed. It is almost too personal an appraisal for me to attempt, though I soon discovered how true were the words of Malcolm Wallace of Toronto whom I met on my way to Canada: "You are fortunate to make your first acquaintance with university teaching as a colleague of Dr. MacMechan; he is a scholar and a gentleman". His personal standards—of dress, deportment, personal and family relations—like those of his writing and his scholarship—were of the highest: Fastidious but not fussy; strict but not severe; dignified without ostentation. More than most of our professors today, although many are closer than he to business and politics, he was a citizen of Halifax. Raddall speaks of "the erect and dignified figure with a grey torpedo beard, walking the streets of Halifax as if he had them to himself. As indeed he had". That is true of the historian, for whom the present did not exist as he saw "only the redcoats, the buskin-clad ranger and tarry seamen of the eighteenth (century)". But few if any of the Dalhousie faculty have done so much for friendship and understanding between the best of town and the best of gown by hospitality offered with equal charm and generosity to both citizens and students.

Although his culture and his interests were often thought to be especially English, they were rather of New than of Old England—going back to and beyond Emerson, and, attaching particularly to Harvard—and the tradition of Charles Eliot, Norton, Barrett Wendell, Bliss Perry, G. L. Kittredge. His papers have more references to Harvard and Harvard men than to his own universities of Toronto and Johns Hopkins, and with admiration that suggests conscious or unconscious modelling, he devotes one of his most revealing papers on scholarship to "Child of the Ballads". Characteristically, he takes the erudition for granted, and makes us privy to the table-talk. He introduces us to the scholar's humanism, to the breadth rather than to the depth of his interests. Of Child's talk, he found the fittest comparison in "The Vicar" of one of his own favourite poets—W. M. Praed, easy, polished, urbane, and a clear influence

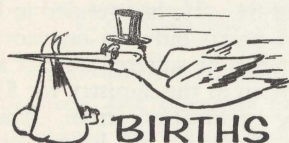

He taught for 47 years, 41 of these at the Halifax Academy, chiefly as principal. He was famous as a mathematician and wrote a textbook on the subject which was used in the schools for many years. He is survived by his son Dr. Silvanus A. Morton, B.A. '22, M.D., C.M. '26 of Milwaukee.

J. O. C. Campbell, Q.C. Sp. Law '23-'24, died of a heart attack, October 2, 1961. He was born in Charlottetown, where he conducted his law practice until the time of his death.

Robie St. Clair Dares, LL.B. '17, died April 27, 1962 in Halifax. A native of Dartmouth, he was educated there and

since graduation from the law school had practised in Halifax.

Rev. A. A. Zinck, B.A. '15 died at his home in Milwaukee November 12, 1961. He was born in East Chester, and except for a few years at Waterloo College, Ontario, had spent most of his life in Milwaukee.

Judge Lewis Herbert Martell, B.A. (K), M.A., B.C.L., Law '10-'11, died August 25 at the age of 77. on some of MacMechan's own verse. Without recollecting at the time that, as usual he was there before me, I applied the same verses to Dr. MacMechan himself in my own memorial tribute in 1934:

His talk was a stream which runs  
With rapid change from rocks to roses.  
It slipped from politics to puns,  
It passed from Mahomet to Moses;  
Beginning with the laws that keep  
The planets in their radiant courses,  
And ending with some precept deep  
For dressing eels and or shoeing horses.

Since I have been leaning heavily on others, I shall close with a direct tribute by a former student and scholar. Millett Salter of the class of 1916, and a distinguished teacher at the University of Alberta, was giving an address on Shakespeare's *King John* to the Humanities Association when it met at Dalhousie shortly after the second war. He introduced his claim for more recognition of this comparatively neglected play by describing a lecture, given by Dr. MacMechan to sophomores at Dalhousie about thirty-five years before, in which once again he was ahead of the pack. With the tribute to critical insight from scholar to scholar went a more personal tribute from pupil to teacher, for which he found fitting words in those by Hamlet of his father:

He was a man, take him for all in all.

I shall not look upon his like again.

Then Salter could go on with his lecture. Such was the influence of Archibald MacMechan upon students in this College, in this Province, and in this City by the sea, that he loved and loved to commemorate.

## MEDICAL OPEN HOUSE UNQUALIFIED SUCCESS

The Faculty of Medicine was host to the public on October 19th and 20th. The occasion was a highly successful "Meet Medicine" programme sponsored by the Medical School.

The purpose of the project was to acquaint the public with the activities of the Medical School in both teaching and research and to give the public an opportunity to visit the school and nearby affiliated hospitals.

On both days hundreds of people visited the Public Health Clinic, the Forrester and Medical Sciences buildings, as well as the Pathology Institute, the Children's, Grace Maternity and Victoria General hospitals. In each building the visitors were shown exhibits and demonstrations of equipment and facilities used by the various departments in the teaching of medicine.
