Sarah Crocker was buried in Camp Hill Cemetery. One of the few persons still a live who were present at her interment was John F. haw, a Barrister in the Roy Building, Halifax. The Salvation Army paid the funeral expenses, but I do not know if they put up a tombstone. The fumeral took place on a day in May, 1936. I remember after the funeral, in company with Mr. Doyle, who was acting as Solicitor for the Salvation Army, Major Mundy and John Shaw, her strong box was opened I think in the Royal Bank's main office in Halifax. Major Mundy was very relieved to find that the old lady had quite a few stocks and bonds in the box, because at that time his worry was who was going to pay for the fumeral.
